





#### Despite Slow Holiday

NEW YORK (AP) - Retail sales figures for December enough to offset slack buying activity at Christmas, according to the nation's largest retail chains.

In the face of 12 per cent inflation and recessioninspired layoffs in November and early December, buying lagged until retailers took the unusual step of offering pre-Christmas bargains to entice customers into

One Wall Street retailing analyst said, "It can hardly be other than a poor Christmas from a profit standpoint. If you have a bad November, you shouldn't really pay too much attention to the December figures."

#### **Douglas To Miss Court**

WASHINGTON (AP) - Supreme Court Justice William O. Douglas, recovering from a stroke that has impaired his ability to move, apparently will be unable to return to work when the court reconvenes Jan. 13. Dr. Thomas Connally, the 76-year-old justice's personal

physician, said Thursday that Douglas has suffered "a loss of some ability to move" on his left side. But Connally said in an interview that doctors treating Douglas are encouraged by his progress.

#### Force Still Possible

WASHINGTON (AP) - Secretary of State Henry A Kissinger declined to rule out the possibility that the United States would use military force against Mideast oil producers "to prevent strangulation of the industrialized world." But "I have said repeatedly that I did not think it would come to that point. I'm confident the problem will be solved without the use of force," Kissinger told reporters Thursday night. "I'm not saying there is no circumstance where we would not use force."

#### **Gold Auction Set**

WASHINGTON (AP) - The government plans to auction off about \$350 million worth of gold Monday, but bidders will have to pay a minimum of around \$70,000 for the precious metal. #### FBI Issues Warning

WASHINGTON (AP) - The FBI is raising fresh warnings about the possibility that nuclear weapons may fall into the hands of terrorists and about the continued activities of Communists in the United States. ## Askew Is Urged To Share Power

TALLAHASSEE, Fla. (AP) - Aide Henry Dean proposes that Gov. Reubin Askew share some of his power over Cabinet agendas in an effort to answer objections to proposed Cabinet-rule revisions. Cabinet aides scheduled a meeting today to consider

The rules issue arose Thursday, when several aides protested that the rules would give Askew too much power

by making him the only person who could defer items on Past rules, no longer in effect, allowed any Cabinet member to defer an agenda item for two weeks. This often

led to delays lasting several months. Ken Oertel, director of the Divsion of Administrative Hearings, said the proposed rule was in keeping with a provision in the Administrative Procedures Act (APA)

that went into effect Wednesday. Among other things, the APA gave sole deferral authority to the presiding officer of a board.

"I don't think that's fair," said Jack Shoemaker, aide to Agriculture Commissioner Doyle Conner. "If six Cabinet members decide they want to waive the rules, the governor can stop it and I don't think that's the way it

Dean, an Askew aide, proposed that the rule be revised to allow Cabinet members to have a say in extending "My suggestion for a compromise is that the governor

can only defer an item until the next Cabinet meeting unless the majority of the Cabinet agrees there is good ause for a deferral," he said. The Cabinet and all other state agencies are required by

the APA to adopt new rules. The act represents an attempt by the legislature to get greater public involvement in state agency rule-making procedures. Agenda deferrals have often been used by Cabinet of







### Ronald Reagan Steps Aside

This New Year's Day Ronald Reagan stepped down as Governor of California after eight years in that office, and - whatever people may think of him - they certainly can no longer say he's an unknown quantity

That was a frequently-heard objection when the soft-spoken former movie actor first tossed his hat into the ring back in 1966. A movie actor as governor? Ye Gods! What had we come to? Besides, Regan had sprung to national political prominence as a result of a single televised speech for (of all people) Barry Goldwater, back in 1964. And Regan's political views, though more smoothly articulated, plainly had a lot in common with Barry's. There was much solemn head shaking TOM TIEDE among intellectuals, and above all liberal in tellectuals, when Ronald Reagan embarked on a political career.

But it didn't worry the people of California a bit. In his 1966 bid for the governorship, Reagan trounced incumbent Democrat Pat Brown by a whacking million-vote margin. Four years later, despite the inevitable erosion of popularity attendant on public office, he was returned to Sacramento by a cool half million votes. Now, though only 63, he feels he has done about all one man can do for California. But what, exactly, has

It seems likely that welfare reform is the field with which Regan's career as governor will be most closely identified. The riots of the early and mid-1960s had badly frightened both the Johnson administration and California Governor Brown. Lyndon Johnson's famous "war on poverty," more accurately described long afterward by Richard Nixon as the practice of "throwing dollars" at rioters, was their answer. When Reagan took office, and until he was able to bring about major reforms in the system, the welfare case load in California was rising at the rate of 40,000 people every month. Since the Reagan reforms went into effect in March 1971, the number of Californians on welfare and general relief has declined by 264,630, despite the steadily increasing population of America's largest state. Without the reforms, according to estimates of the California Department of Finance, welfare costs would have been \$2

billion higher than they were. That is one reason Ronald Reagan has been able to come through with \$5.6 billion in direct tax relief for the people of his state. Over the eight years of his governorship, for example, he vetoed or unilaterally reduced legislated spending proposals for a total saving of more than \$1 billion. which, lacking the temperance often insisted on In 1970 he was able to effect a 10 per cent one-shot by wide public attention, wield absolute power rebate on personal income taxes. Despite these achievements - and in part because of them - Reagan has naturally come under severe and sustained attack from the liberal left. He is supposed to be indifferent to environmental problems - though he sponsored. supported and enacted the toughest water-pollution control law in the country, added 145,500 acres to the state park system, and almost single-handedly stopped a huge dam that would have flooded ar Indian reservation in Round Valley. 
