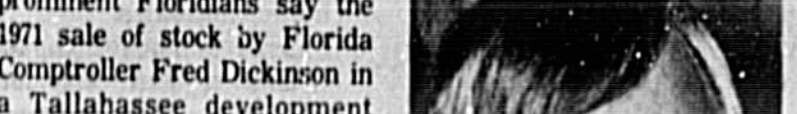

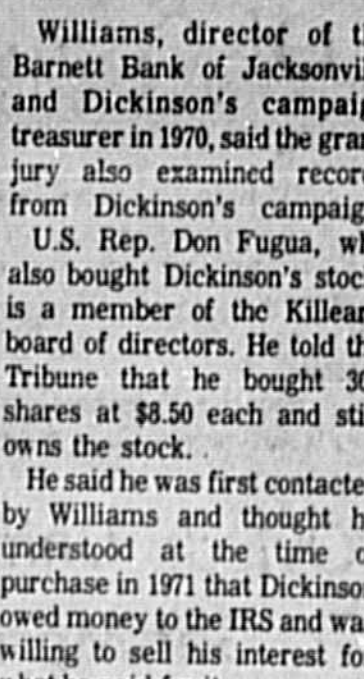

Houston Manager Preston Gomez says a little electronic gadgetry "snapped" Cesar Cedeno's batting slump. But Cedeno, who has hit .300 in the past week, says he needed a swift kick in the pants.

"I took shots of last night's game with a Sony and replayed them in slow motion," said Gomez, whose Astros rode a 10-run seventh inning to their first victory over the Philadelphia Phillies Tuesday night. "That was the first time that anyone has walked a man to pitch to me in the big leagues," said Cedeno.

# Living Israelis Will Always Remember The 'Golda Age'

 JERUSALEM (AP) — It may not go down in Israeli history as the golden era, but Golda Meir's five-year premiership already is being termed "Eldon Golda" — the Golda Age.

No living Israeli is likely to forget her.

Some called her "Grannie" — she is a grandmother, and others less charitably referred to her as "the old lady" — she is 76.

A politician likened her to a kindergarten teacher who treated her people as though they were brats. She once taught school in Milwaukee, Wis.

Admirers found an enticing parallel in the Bible — Deborah the Prophetess, who "arose, a mother in Israel," and led the Israelites to victory over the invaders of the Promised Land.

Mrs. Meir came to power in the heady wake of Israel's lightning defeat of the Arabs in 1967, but left in controversy over the costly and sobering war last October.

Writing of the public protest that led to her resignation, a columnist commented, "Golda Meir deserved better than to go down ignominiously to the shouting under her office windows."

One of her outstanding talents was to cut complex questions to total simplicity.

While international debates continued for years over trying

to start Israeli-Arab peace talks by procuring a Western or a United Nations guarantee to protect Israel's borders, Mrs. Meir responded by asking simply, "But why is that necessary if true peace exists?"

She wanted straightforward peace treaties or nothing and her rigidity may have delayed the peace prospects now in sight via the compromise methods of U.S. Secretary of State Henry A. Kissinger.

She was called out of retirement in March 1969, as a compromise premier to replace the late Levi Eshkol. She was ailing and nervous about leading the country, but she was too strong-minded to be a lame duck leader.

She began by choking off the arguments in Israel over how much to surrender in return for peace with the Arabs.

"The Arabs don't want peace," she would say. "So there is no point in the Jews arguing about it."

She refused to deal with Palestinians. To her, "there is no such thing as Palestine. I once had a Palestinian passport when Britain ruled this area. If there is a Palestine, where are its leaders? Why don't they step forward and negotiate with us?"

The answer was a bitter upsurge of guerrilla activity, culminating in the slaughter of Israeli athletes at the Munich Olympic games in 1972.

The strength of her personal convictions resulted in government policies that may last for years.

## Italy Is Still Uncertain About Government's Fall

ROME (AP) — A movie equipment manufacturer, until now optimistic that Italy would pull out of its economic slump, suddenly talked about firing some of his employees.

Scores of housewives, explaining "you never know what will happen," ran out to the supermarket and stocked up on crates of sugar, coffee and canned goods.

Premier Mariano Rumor's government had just resigned, in the midst of Italy's worst economic crisis in 30 years, and there appeared no swift solution.

But millions of other Italians turned completely away from the country's political and economic woes to talk about the opening of the World Cup soccer tournament in Frankfurt Thursday. Italy is a favorite.

"We cannot afford to spare any effort to save ourselves," said Gianni Agnelli, chairman of the Fiat Auto Co., Italy's largest private employer.

But it looked as if the political crisis—and consequently the economic crisis—would be a long one. Rumor's Christian Democrats, the largest party in the country, have dominated all governments since World War II. But they do not have a majority in Parliament.

The only feasible partnership for a majority is the center-left coalition of Christian Democrats and Socialists that has formed most Italian governments for the past decade. But this time their split over Rumor's proposals for tight credit and higher taxes to ease the economic crisis appeared to be papered over.

### Oilmen Facing 'Trial'

NAIROBI, Kenya (AP) — Ethiopian guerrillas holding four Americans and two Canadians are planning to put two of the Americans and one of the Canadians on trial, sources in Addis Ababa reported today. They said the three men to be tried, all oil prospectors for the Tenneco Oil Co. of Houston, Tex., will be charged with "exploiting the natural resources" of Eritrea, Ethiopia's northernmost province. The sources said they are Powers William Cayce, 38, of Plainview, Tex.; John W. Rogers of New York; a Texaco geologist on loan to Tenneco, and Cliff James, 27, of Walkerton, Ont. There was no word of what the guerrillas planned for the other three persons.

### Traveling Nurse Honored

SAN FRANCISCO (AP) — The American Nurses' Association convention today honors "Murphy," the traveling nurse in Kansas' Elk County, a 600-square-mile stretch of wheat and cattail land with 3,700 residents, there have been no doctors for 15 years. Just R.N. Ruth Murphy, or "Murphy." The 54-year-old nurse figures she has made about 4,500 house calls a year since she set up a series of free clinics in 1957 with a \$10,000 grant from the county.

### Youth Appeals Conviction

OPELIKA, Ala. (AP) — Michael Dickinson, the 18-year-old son of Rep. William L. Dickinson, R-Ala., has appealed a conviction of possession of barbiturates and was released on \$15,000 bond.

The young Dickinson, an Auburn University student, received a 18-year prison sentence from Circuit Judge L.J. Tyler, who released him Monday after he served notice of appeal.

Dickinson was arrested April 30 at his trailer home.

### Charities In Squeeze

NEW YORK (AP) — Rising costs and reluctant contributors have put charitable organizations in the middle of the inflation squeeze. It's tougher to raise money these days and the dollars don't go as far as they used to. Most of the charities contacted in an Associated Press spot check said they are meeting or topping their goals. But it isn't easy, spokesmen noted.

### Judge's Son Sentenced

JACKSONVILLE, Fla. (AP) — The adopted son of Appeals Judge James H. Walden of West Palm Beach was sentenced to 30 years in prison.

James Stephen Walden, 22, was sentenced Tuesday to 15 years on a charge of attempted robbery and 15 years for wounding the manager of a supermarket with a gun.

Circuit Judge Hudson Olliff directed that the terms run consecutively for Walden, whose father is a judge of the Florida 14th District Appeals Court.

Witnesses at young Walden's trial said he shot Kenneth W. Hillman, manager of a Winn-Dixie store, when the manager tried to convince Walden not to rob the supermarket.

Police said young Walden escaped early this year from the South Florida Mental Hospital, where he was sent for observation after a series of supermarket robberies in Miami.

The young man was ruled competent to face trial here.

### Brewery Strike Keeps Irish Home

DUBLIN (AP) — The Guinness brewery is on strike for the first time in its 215-year history, and an Irish bartender says, "The situation is nothing short of desperate."

It's the same story from Limerick to Londonderry, and the blight may spread to Liverpool, Glasgow, Boston and New York.

Not a drop of has been brewed since May 27 in the sprawling red brick brewery, which the 18th century patriot-poet Henry Grattan called "the actual nurse of the people."

Wexford bar owner Patrick Mulligan said he's been dry for draft stout for a week and he couldn't even offer draft beers from other breweries because Guinness' distributes the gas which forces the brew out of the keg and through the pumps.

The issues are complicated, partly because the 3,500 work force at the brewery is divided among more than 20 unions, many of which distribute the gas which forces the brew out of the keg and through the pumps.

Unrest had been evident for some months. Unskilled men in the Workers Union of Ireland won a pay rise. Then 1,500 skilled men in 15 unions threatened to strike unless their marriage over the unskilled were restored.

### Hospital Funds Ordered

TALLAHASSEE, Fla. (AP) — Florida is scheduled to receive \$6 million for hospital construction and subsidies under a federal court order, says state Atty. Gen. Robert Shevin.

Shevin said Tuesday that the order from the U.S. District Court in Washington resulted from a suit filed on behalf of all states.

He said the federal government has 30 days to appeal the order, which called for the \$6 million in health funds.

## Incas' Lost City Booming Again

CUZCO, Peru (AP) — The journey begins here, in the city that was once the heartbeat of an empire stretching from northern Ecuador to central Chile, a concept equalling that of Julius Caesar.

It ends on top of a mountain 75 miles northwest of this ancient Inca capital, in the long-deserted city of Machu Picchu in the Peruvian Andes.

Earth, sun and clouds — elements held sacred by the Inca — meet in the grassy citadel perched 6,500 feet above sea level.

Cuzco fell to the Spanish conquistadors, who marched inland from Lima in search of Inca gold in the 1500s. One by one, the fortresses, the temples, the cities of the Incas fell to the conquerors of the New World.

But not Machu Picchu. The Spanish never knew it existed. The Inca empire crumbled, and Machu Picchu was abandoned.

Time tugged a jungle-like carpet of undergrowth up the mountainside and hid the city. It remained hidden until 1911 when American archaeologist Hiram Bingham found Machu Picchu by chance and dubbed it "the Lost City of the Incas."

Today, the city stands serenely atop the mountain. There are no souvenir stands here, none of the "Cathy-loves-Randy" and "Rosa-y-Luis"

"The family originally was from Naples and pasta was the name of the game at home."

He was so overweight that he claimed he was a double tackle on the local football team.

"I understand and sympathize with teen-agers now, especially the girls who never have a date or get invited to the school prom because of their excessive weight."

Palumbo's own early interest in food took an unusual twist and led him to his current job as executive chef of Weight Watchers International, Inc. One might say he ate his way into the WWI kitchens. Even as a child, while others were out playing, he enjoyed the world of pots and pans.

"Both my parents worked," he explained, "and I would rush home after school to cook dinner for them."

"It is an occupational hazard to be Italian."

From high school, Palumbo went to the Culinary Institute of America in New Haven, Conn. He also took an associate degree in hotel and restaurant management from the University of Massachusetts.

His road to the chef's toque blanche included stints as a dishwasher and in a chicken market. All along his mother and grandmother encouraged him to cook.

Also along the way he would balloon the 285 pounds, lose 50 or 60 pounds, then regain them plus a few more.

Finally, after finding that clothes he liked didn't come in size 50 with 44 waist, he joined Weight Watchers. He liked it because "I could eat bread."

He lost 17 1/2 pounds the first week and eventually trimmed down to 165, which he now maintains, give or take two pounds, he said.

In his current position he travels 65,000 miles a year and creates at least 1,000 recipes to help others lose their excessive avardupois.

"I once thought that spending 12 to 15 hours creating a magnificent buffet table for a restaurant was the most gratifying thing I could ever do. Now when I speak to others who, like me, are hounded with a weight problem and have them tell me with such joy that I've helped them enjoy losing weight... well, that's the most gratifying thing I've ever done. I hope to do it for many years to come."

He especially is pleased with helping teen-agers. "I always was a specialist on the beach. Now I say, 'Thank God' their fat problems can be nipped in the bud."

Palumbo, at 30, is single and eats out a lot. Sometimes, he admitted, he enjoys plain steak and potatoes, and his mother and grandmother now prepare pasta for him in the diet manner.

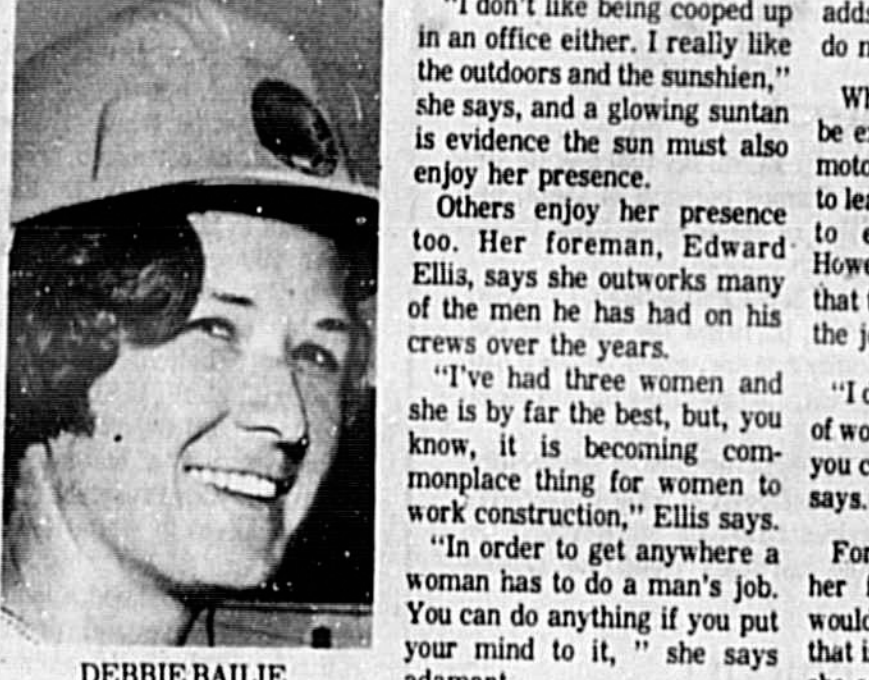
