## Jap Fleet Is Said To Be In Command Of Pacific Waters

### Tokyo Reports U. S. Cruiser Is Sunk; Stafford Cripps Will Go To India

(By Associated Press) Tokyo today claimed the U. S. Cruiser *Marblehead* was sunk in the Indian Ocean by the Japanese naval forces, but the report is unconfirmed elsewhere. An authoritative London source asserted the main Japanese fleet is unimpaired by Pacific action thus far and holds general command of the sea in all directions.

The situation in Sumatra, where General Douglas MacArthur faces superior Japanese forces, apparently has been stabilized temporarily, with neither air nor ground activity in the past 24 hours, the War Department reported today.

An official British spokesman today said that the *Marblehead* was sunk in the Indian Ocean by the Japanese naval forces, but the report is unconfirmed elsewhere. An authoritative London source asserted the main Japanese fleet is unimpaired by Pacific action thus far and holds general command of the sea in all directions.

### Battle Rages Now In New Guinea Isle; Bombers Hit Seven Nippon Warships

(By Associated Press) Australian bombers today struck smashing blows at Japanese warships and damaged at least seven, but unconfirmed reports said the enemy's great invasion-bent convoys continued moving toward their eventual jumping-off bases in New Guinea.

It is clear the battle for the approaches to Australia is now raging in full force. Japanese bombers again blasted at Port Moresby, New Guinea, and Australians reported smashing blows against the enemy's invasion convoys off New Guinea Island.

The Japanese government spokesman warned Australians in the East Indies against Japanese troop concentrations in New Guinea, but this was a transport effort, and the firing of a big flying boat was announced by the United States. An force of 100 bombers was ordered to attack the base with every effort.

## Fight In Bataan Lulls For Fourth Consecutive Day

### British Forces North Of Rangoon Brace For Expected Attacks By Japanese

WASHINGTON, Mar. 12. (AP)—The CAA civilian training program today was ordered increased to meet the demands of the war effort. The program is being expanded to include the training of 25,000 men in 48,000 man camps and facilities for the secondary flying corps, to include 30,000 students annually.

**The United States War Department in one of its briefest reports on the war said the lull in the fighting on the Philippines' Bataan peninsula continued. It was the fourth consecutive day the Department reported the absence of activity on the fighting front.**

## Three British Cruisers Are Hit By Axis

### Russians Announce 50,000 Nazis Are Killed And 277 Planes Destroyed

Rome reported today that three British cruisers were hit, one probably sunk, in an attack by Axis air and sea forces on large British naval forces in the Mediterranean.

The Russians announced that 49,700 Germans were killed and 277 enemy planes were destroyed in the Kalinin area northwest of Moscow from Feb. 8 to Mar. 8. Moscow dispatches reported the breaking of a strong German defense line beyond Kalinin which Hitler had ordered held at all costs.

Consisting of a system of heavily fortified villages near a "corridor" populated point, the line was said to have been called the "Braune Line" in some of the captured German orders. Tangled wire, walls of ice and strongly manned pillboxes were overrun in the advance northwest of Moscow, the dispatches said.

Kalinin itself is 95 miles northwest of Moscow. In the general sector beyond Kalinin the Germans were known to have established strong positions. They are reported to have been ordered by Hitler to hold at all costs.

In the fighting which was reported today the Russians brought down or destroyed on the ground 277 German planes, and captured 78 tanks and 172 guns.

Red army troops were reported to have captured a key junction in the Lake Ilmen area where Soviet fighter pilots have steadily destroyed 315 Nazi transport planes, tried to carry reinforcements to the trapped 10th German Army under General von Busch.

### Instructions On Use Of Sugar Rationing Books Are Revealed

Instructions apply to your first book and will apply to any later books unless otherwise directed by the Office of Price Administration. In order to obtain a later book, the first book must be turned in to the rationing office.

- From time to time the Office of Price Administration may issue orders rationing certain products. After the date indicated by such orders, these products can be purchased only through the use of war ration stamps.
- The orders of the Office of Price Administration will designate the stamps to be used for the purchase of a particular rationed product, the period during which each of these stamps may be used, and the amounts which may be bought with each stamp.
- Stamps become valid for use only when and as directed by the Office of Price Administration.
- Unless otherwise announced, the ration week is from Saturday midnight to the following Saturday midnight.
- War ration stamps may be used in any retail store in the United States.
- War ration stamps may be used only by or for the person named and described in the war ration book.
- Every person must see that his war ration book is kept in a safe place and properly used. Parents are responsible for the safekeeping and use of their children's war ration books.
- When you buy any rationed product, the proper stamp must be detached in the presence of the storekeeper or cashier or the person making delivery to you. If a stamp is torn out of the war ration book in any other way than above indicated, it is void.
