

## Yanks Sign 4 Men; DiMaggio And Rolfe Still Holdout

ORLANDO, Mar. 10.—(AP)—The New York Yankees swept the four of their holdouts into the fold yesterday in one big swoop, leaving Joe DiMaggio and Red Rolfe still holding out till what may soon be the "bitter" end.

Within a few minutes after the world champions arrived here, yesterday, for an exhibition game with the Washington Senators, Manager Joe McCarthy emerged from a telephone conversation with President Edward G. Barrow, who is in New York, and announced that Red Ruffing, Bill Dickey, Joe Gordon and Charlie Keller all had agreed to terms.

The suddenness of this capitulation by the holdouts was interpreted by observers as meaning that the club had made concessions to the players.

The present Yankee line-up has looked so bad that it was even hinted here yesterday that George might take his position on second base without any ado today when the world champions face the Boston Red Sox at Sarasota.

## Jap Fleet Is Said To Be In Command Of Pacific Waters

TOKYO Reports U. S. Cruiser Is Sunk; Stafforff Cripps Will Go To India

(UPI Associated Press) Tokyo today claimed the U. S. Cruiser Marblehead was sunk in the Indian Ocean by the Japanese naval forces, but the report is unconfirmed elsewhere.

An authoritative London source asserted the main Japanese fleet is unimpaired by Pacific action thus far and holds general command of the seas in all directions.

The situation has changed where General Douglas MacArthur faces superior Japanese forces, apparently has been stabilized temporarily, with neither air nor ground activity in the past 24 hours, the War Department reported today.

An official British spokesman disclosed India today, in full demand states soon after the war, and announced that Sir Stafford Cripps, Churchill spokesman, soon would go to India for consultations.

Operations on the Burma front indicated that Britain was taking everything on the behalf of the anti-Burma army of Burma and, with China aid, made a positive resistance.

A communiqué from New Delhi last night announced that the RAF, despite the British retreat and reorganization to new bases, had struck a heavy blow at a Japanese airfield at Rangoon, the important port 90 miles west of Rangoon, which already had been evacuated of military forces and stripped of all of military value.

Scattered Allied "Scrap Iron Troops Continue Week" Is To Fight In Indies Start Monday

Van Mock Says 3,000 Australians Still Oppose Foe In Java

Drive Will Seek To Obtain Metal For Government Use

(UPI Associated Press) Lieut. Gov. Van Mock of the East Indies, reported from Australia today that about 3,000 Australian troops probably are still fighting in Java and similar action is taking place elsewhere in the Indies.

The metal collected by the Salvation Army will be sold to firms and the proceeds given to the government, Captain George Woods of the Salvation Army announced today.

Allied Dutch troops, facing hundreds of thousands of Japanese without air support, are fighting in eastern and central Java, although an armistice has been signed in the Bandung area to save the civilian population from "massacre," it was revealed yesterday.

The Dutch were able to keep the metal and local citizens dug old scrap metal from their homes and military headquarters southeast of Batavia, because continuous Japanese aerial bombings demoralized the defenders, refugees said from Java said.

They said that battalion after battalion of Dutch troops broke under the continual bombing and deserted during the continuous bombing and in despair over never seeing a friendly airplane in the sky.

The All Air Force, already severely reduced before the invasion, was "obliterated" during the first few days of fighting after the Japanese first landed on Feb. 15, it was said.

### Brazil Ships Won't Sail To United States

Decree Is Issued Whereby President Vargas Can Declare War At Any Time

(UPI Associated Press) President Getúlio Vargas of Brazil issued a decree today enabling him to declare a state of emergency and put the country at war any moment.

Meanwhile, a Brazil government shipping line said the government had ordered the suspension of all sailings to the United States and the recall of its ships in Japan, all Brazilian shipping lines contribute to the United States. This move followed the recent sinkings of four Brazilian vessels by Axis submarines off the east coast of the United States.

German U-boats, inc. many announced last night, sank two more ships, a Brazilian passenger liner, and an American tanker, off the shores of New York and New Jersey Sunday night and early Monday morning, killing about the possible loss of 21 lives.

The Brazilian liner, *Assyria*, was sunk 130 miles off Ambrose light at the entrance to New York harbor, the fourth ship flying the flag of Brazil to be destroyed by Axis raiders in 21 days. Twenty survivors were landed in New York. They reported 50 missing.

The American tanker, *Utopia*, was torpedoed and broken in two east of Harsens Island, which is about 60 miles south of New York, and only three and a half miles off the New Jersey coast.

With the tanker literally cut in two, U-boats submarine sailed between the broken halves to save themselves.
