



### Nixon Hit By Tax Penalty BALTIMORE, Md. (AP) - President Nixon was

assessed a 5 per cent negligence penalty by the Internal Revenue Service in connection with \$467,000 he owes in back income taxes and interest, a newspaper said today. The Baltimore Sun, quoting sources familiar with the case, said the IRS included the 5 per cent penalty on April 3 when it assessed Nixon \$432,787 in back taxes, plus in-

The Sun said the dollar amount of the alleged negligence penalty could not be determined. Nixon has said he would pay the taxes, but the White House has refused to say whether a negligence penalty was involved. The IRS refused comment on the newspaper report, saying it was agency policy not to go beyond what a taxpayer reveals about his own case.

### **OEO Programs Kept**

WASHINGTON (AP) - The House has voted to keep the Office of Economic Opportunity's remaining major programs alive, sidestepping President Nixon's attempts to do away with the antipoverty agency. By a vote of 331 to 53, the House disbanded OEO but created a new administration within the Department of Health, Education and Welfare to run its community action programs at a cost of \$380 million.

### Seal It With A Kiss

JERUSALEM (AP) - Seal it with a kiss, they say. And that's what Secretary of State Henry Kissinger did Wednesday, bussing a stunned Golda Meir after the announcement of a Syrian-Israeli troop disengagement. "I didn't know you kissed women," the 76-year-old Israeli premier responded, referring to photographs of Kissinger embracing Arab leaders.

"This is to a very great extent your day," Mrs. Meir told the secretary of state. "It has been a pleasure and a joy to

### **Epidemics Still Possible**

ATLANTA, Ga. (AP) - Despite effective vaccines, epidemics of childhood diseases still could erupt nationwide partly because of the complacency of parents in having their children immunized, a health official warns. "The hohum attitude of parents that immunization can be put off until a child enrolls in school is part of the reason for the problem," Dr. John J. Witte, chief of the immunization branch of the Center for Disease Control, said. A recent massive immunization program by the center has shown some results, Witte said. Polio vaccinations, for example, are up at least 20 per cent over a comparable period in 1973.







Depression, Ms. Dinkelman said in an interview, is one of he major problems affecting women and women alone are particularly susceptible. She defines depression as a "frozen emotional response. Physically, these people often look bland, and complain of physical ills, such as headaches and backaches."

Ms. Dinkelman believes depression for women is considered by many as a traditionally honored symptom. "I think women are trained to be compliant and bear emotional burdens. The depressed say they have wonderful parents to whom they are a burden. They feel obliged to make mother happy. They have unreal expectations and can't verbalize hostility when it's appropriate." Other responses to trauma attributed to females, ac-

cording to Ms. Dindelman, are frigidity and hysteria. She claims frigidity, dating from Freud, has been misunderstood by social scientists and the media. Freud, she said, did not take

his own advice and learn about people through his own experiences. "Instead, he went off on fantasy trips on frigidity and

with orgasms. A way to get rich quick is to write a book on how here can be more orgasms." Regarding hysterical

emotions, Ms. Dinkelman attributes them to a need for communication. She believes women become hysterical because they are not listened to. or taken seriously. "Therapists dismiss women's

roblems. They give medication and a quick trip to sideration is given," she said. Ms. Dinlelman continued. "When encountering someone who does not speak English, we speak louder. The same is true with hysteria. It starts with the need to communicate. The other person pays no attention.

### Vietnamese Foes Clashina

SAIGON, South Vietnam (AP) - North Vietnamese forces rolled over another South Vietnamese base in the western Central Highlands today, extending their control over a narrow strip along the Cambodian border, the Saigon command reported. North Vietnamese infantrymen, covered by hundreds of artillery shells, assaulted the Tieu A Ta base camp at about dawn, and radio contact was lost with the 133-man garrison 11/2 hours later, the command said. The fate of the defenders was not known. The base is located about 15 miles from the Cambodian border, 175 miles northeast of Saigon.

### Saigon Envoy Hits Aid Cut

WASHINGTON (AP) - South Vietnamese Ambassador Tran Kim Phuong says a deep cut in military aid by Congress would encourage North Vietnam and possibly tempt Hanoi into wider military adventures.

Reacting to a recent House cutback of \$474 million in military aid to South Vietnam, the envoy said the Saigon government is in a difficult position, mainly because North Vietnam is pressing a policy of violence while the one-for-one replacement allowed under the Paris agreement for expended ammunition and equipment is not being maintained for South Vietnamese forces, he

Phuong said recent North Vietnamese attacks show that Hanoi has started what he called a generalized strategic offensive.

### **Bahamian Minister Booed**

NASSAU, Bahamas (AP) - Prime Minister Lynden O. Pindling was booed by some 500 demonstrators Wednesday, the first time he's met public hostility of grassroots black constituents in seven years of office.

Newsmen said Pindling seemed startled when he encountered the jeers of the crowd as he left Parliament. The demonstrators gathered in the public square to protest what they called government inactivity in the face of rising unemployment and skyrocketing inflation. Edmund Moxey, a member of Parliament who once served as Pindling's parliamentary secretary, was cheered and lifted to the shoulders of the demonstrators when he left the building

The demonstration originally was called some days ago to protest a government decision to bring in foreign entertainers for the summer tourist season festivities instead of hiring local groups sponsored by Nassau's Jumbey Village cultural center.

SEOUL, South Korea (AP) - Searchers have recovered the bodies of 18 coal miners trapped Tuesday when the walls of a pit caved in at Kohan, 110 miles east of Seoul,





Edmund G. "Pat" Brown was governor of California for eight

years, 1959-67. He was 53 when

Edmund G. "Jerry" Brown Jr., 36, wants to succeed Ronald Reagan, the actor-turned-Republican star who unseated his father. Reagan is stepping

down after two terms. Young Brown is campaigning hard to win the Democratic gubernatorial nomination in the June 4 primary. He is first in the polls but faces 17 other Democrats, including such heavyweights as San Francisco Mayor Joseph Alioto and state Assembly Speaker Bob Moretti. The winner meets the Republican primary victor.

Throughout the campaign there have been the inevitable accusations that Brown is riding on his father's coattails, that he is too young, too inexperienced for the governor's chair. He bristles at the allegations, pointing out he has won the trust of the people in his two tries for office - becoming a Los Angeles community college trustee in 1969 and California secretary of state in 1970. And he did both without much help from his father.

Pat Brown has a small role in the gubernatorial campaign. He's offered advice - "Sometimes he takes my advice and sometimes he doesn't." The campaign chest includes a \$21,-000 contribution from an oil company the elder Brown controls. Other money has come from old family friends.

hearing decision be reviewed by the Office of Appeals Council and if that does not result in a favorable decision, your next step would be to file suit in federal court.

Disability decisions involve a number of factors in addition to itself. Age, work experience and educational background are also considered. If you need help in appealing the hearing decision, contact your Social Security office.

Q Since I have retired, I have taken up photography as a obby. Since I am experienced, have set up a fully equipped studio in my home. Eventually, as I hope to make my hobby into a paying business, can I claim my expenses as tax deductible?

A. Since the goal of your current activities is to eventually make a profit, it appears that your expenses, including depreciation on your equipment may qualify as tax deductible. Check with the Internal Revenue Service to be sure.
