'Steak Knife' Killer Slashes Mother, 3 Kids

WILTON MANORS, Fla. (AP) -The bodies of a 31-year-old mother and three of her children, their throats all slashed, were found in their neat threebedroom here, police said today. The dead were identified by police as Linda Smith, her daughter Karen, 7,

sons Christopher, 11, and Timothy, 9. The deaths were reported by 14-yearold William Smith, who found the mutilated bodies of his mother, sister and two brothers when he returned home shortly before midnight, in-

Police said four bloodied steak knives were found in the house in this small suburb on the northern edge of Fort Lauderdale.

Officers said Mrs. Smith, a divorcee whose ex-husband is in the Navy in California, was found in the living room near the body of one son.

Karen's body was in a bedroom and the fourth in another bedroom

Police Capt. Raymond Saxon said the deaths occurred between 6 and 8 p.m. Monday night. He said screams may have been muffled by the noise of passing cars. The home is located at the corner of a busy four-lane state road and a residential drive, he said. "Thousands of cars pass by at that

Saxon said William was deeply shocked and was placed in the care of juvenile authorities until relatives could be found to look after him.

"We've got men checking the whole neighborhood now for clues," said

Maria Seneca, a neighbor, said the Smith house was unusually quiet Monday night.

"I said to my husband 'It's a terrible thing that they shoot firecrackers off in the house,' shortly before 8 p.m.," she

She said the Smith children were usually very boisterous and active.





Shedden said that special equipment is now being installed in the Sanford central office to make it possible for both Touch-Tone and dial phones to operate through the same facilities. The Fuel Shortage

Motorists Face Changing Travel Modes

For American motorists, it is likely to be a long, hot, thirsty summer, one calculated to revamp their travel habits.

The impact of a gasoline drought which could lead to rationing already is being felt across the nation. Most autoists by now have run into time-rationing by service stations. It varies from early afternoon closings to padlocked weekends in many regions of the country. Hundreds of stations have closed down altogether.

Service station operators, independents and those with major oil company franchises, say they have been told the gas shortage may reach crisis proportions by midsummer.

The earlier claims of independents that the oil giants are trying to push them out of business by creating a false shortage are discounted by the rationing of gas to franchised dealers along with the independents.

Major companies have said all along they were forced to halt deliveries to many independents or cut back their allocations because the surplus gas of other years has ceased to

Experts point to three prime reasons for the shortage

1. Lack of refinery capacity to produce enough gas to meet rising demands of industry, government and private autos

Increased use of crude oil last winter to heat American homes and buildings during an unseasonably cold and wet spell in the Midwest, South and East. In other years about 30 per cent of the crude used for heating last winter had been channeled to refineries for processing into auto fuel. Tack onto these reasons the steadily

mounting demand of the public for more fuel to operate two or three cars per family and the new army of camper and recreational vehicles choking the nation's highways, many of them the year-round. The self-contained camper uses from 30 to 50 per cent more gas per mile than conventional passenger cars. A bleak side effect of the fuel shortage-still



Space Age Report

Skylab Spawns A New Language

Military-Aerospace Writer Copley News Service

For more than a decade Americans have been hearing and reading the strang language of the spaceman as he ventured forth on the Mercury and Gemini missions and

In the next eight months, if Murphy's Law does not prevail, we will be exposed to some new space jargon as three crews of Skylab astronauts swing around the earth 270

(Murphy's Law, incidentally, is a half-joking rule among the astronauts which states that "what can go wrong will go wrong." Indeed, the first Skylab crew, with its power-short, overheated cabin, can tell you about Murphy's Law.)

With the cooperation of the federal space agency, Philos-Ford Corp. has come out with a new glossary of space terms especially suited for Skylab project. Some of the words and acronyms are downright weird, others are way-out, a few are thigh-slappers. Try to remember these as you hear Skylab broadcasts or

read about the derring-do of a new breed of long-endurance In "Skylab Astronyms," for example, LA is not an abbreviation for Los Angeles, the nations' third largest city, but alphabetese for "left axilla"-the left armpit.

You may hear the astronauts talking to Mission Control at Houston about a "Brooklyn clothesline." They will be discussing a backup system of ropes and pulleys used to transport film to and from Skylab's huge telescope. When the astronauts refer to "BURPS" it won't mean the Skylab food is bad. It's an acronym for Backup Rate of

"Barber poles" are black-and-white striped gauges that

spin to show Skylab systems are working properly. During docking missions of the Skylab command ship with the orbital workshop you may hear an astronaut observe: "We are zips." That's flight crew slang for a control panel reading of all zeroes, indicating the command ship has

stopped and docked with the lab. OWS, incidentally, is not an expression of pain but a quicker way of saying "orbital workshop." It's possible you'll hear a Houston flight controller telling

an astronaut to "go to POO." Don't be alarmed. The controller merely is instructing the astronaut to return the onboard spacecraft computer to zero to begin a new computation, poo is the acronym for "program zero-zero."

A "Skybet" is Skylab's best estimate of orbital trajectoy and IRS has nothing to do with the Internal Revenue Service. It means "inertial reference system."

When the astronauts talk about the PTA, don't think of the schoolhouse meeting you must attend later in the week. Think of "pitch trim angle" or "pulse torque assembly." LSD is no hangup for astronauts, but they may use the term to mean "launch systems data." And POT is short for

potable or drinkable water While no gals will be riding aboard Skylab, astronauts may refer to "Sal" from time to time as they use the acronym for "scientific airlock."

If you hear Skylab Commander Charles (Pete) Conrad talking about "the last tango," he'll be referring to the last "t" in the word, for "tango" is the phonetic alphbet designation for the letter "t". Each letter has a phonetic designation to help astronauts and ground controllers understand each other.

And don't be distrubed at the mention of "whisky" aboard Skylab. It's the phonetic alphabet designation for the

A Republican figure with a penchant and a talent for human probing says this of President Nixon against the backdrop of Watergate: "He has used the presidency to justify his weak-

Obviously the statement can have meaning only if it is understood what this man-and a good many other Nixon watchers-consider to be Mr. Nixon's principal weaknesses. They can be summed up easily under the heading of "inability in human relations."

This now is ground pretty well covered in the many hard examinations made of the President's conduct either in or in quest of public office.

What the quoted Republican was getting at is this: Mr. Nixon long ago perceived his own limitations in dealing close-range with people. In his campaigns for office, and particularly for the White House, he sought to minimize any possible political and personal damage from these evident shortcomings by devices aimed at controlling the "campaign environment" in which he This meant carefully contrived public appearances,

minimum direct exposure to the press through conferences and interviews, avoidance of the traumatic (for him) business of confronting either ordinary voting folk or political leaders in unpredictable one-on-one situations. But a president, thrown almost inevitably into all kinds of problems he can't foresee, requires a rich variety of human contacts to fuel his imagination and reinforce whatever creative impulses he may bring to the job. This difficult leap Mr. Nixon has not made. In the

White House fortress which automatically fosters a certain isolation for all presidents, he has moved as he did in his campaign-to control his whole "environment. But in this case, that of course means managing the entirety of government, and its approach to problems which in this age are inescapably immense, in a manner which supports the President's great lack in the human

So he has contrived to run the presidency as the carefully closeted solitaire player, shuffling the key cards whose symbols spell major foreign and domestic problems. And, to reinforce his chosen devices of control, he has surrounded himself with aides who would keep him secure in his weaknesses-rather than try to help him compensate for them by wide-ranging, understanding contacts with the "human stuff" in politics, in this government, and in those abroad.

A president, as any man, deserves some sympathy as he pays the cost of his frailties. Speaking in his own special context of time and circumstance, President Wood row Wilson once said: "When they shoot at you, they can only take your natural life; when they sneer at you, they can wound your living heart .

Richard Nixon, in the grip of his frailties, has been sneered at long and often. His response has not always been limited to simple self-protection. Wounded in his "living heart," he has sometimes struck back in vengeful bitterness. The irony: That reply has made his heart



As for the broader threat to journalistic freedom, Sar noff cites the "unprecedented spectacle" of high federal officials attacking the national news media in general, the increasingly common device of subjecting investigative reporters to subpoenas and the threat of jail sentences and the use of official secrecy as a cloak for official mistakes and derelictions. "Whichever of these different means of suppression is

employed, the effect is to deprive the public of what it needs to know in a free society," he says. "What the government wants is a tamed press," alleges Sarnoff, and its efforts to make the news media docile and accommodating rely heavily on the technique of in-But he adds, "This technique works only against those who are willing to be timid."

In a statement put out with the latest financial report, the committee said its budget committee in April approved payment of "legal fees and costs in connection with matters which are not the subject of formal criminal charges in performance of functions by (employes) arising out of their legitimate duties.

Although the committee did not say so, the seven-man budget group is known to include among its members finance committee chairman Maurice Stans, former committee chairman John Mitchell and Jeb S. Magruder, former deputy

DEAR POLLY - Like Mrs. L. M. W. my throw rugs neld lint that would not shake out. I used my poodle's brush and it worked wonders. I would not be without one. There are several types of these brushes but the right one is more like a comb than a brush and the wire teeth are bent at an angle. This did the trick for me and with little effort.-MRS, D.O.A.

Polly's Problem

DEAR POLLY - The varnish on my kitchen cupboards has darkened through the years. I would like to remove it. I have heard that there is something that can be sprayed on and the old varnish will just wipe off. I would appreciate it if someone would tell me more about doing this. — MARY N.

DEAR POLLY - My Pet Peeve is with the flour manufacturers. I do wish they would see fit to put strings on flour sacks like those on sugar bags. Flour sacks are impossible to open neatly as the sack always tears because it is glued down at the top. The only way to get flour into a canister is to dip it out and that is messy, too. - MRS. E. L.

DEAR POLLY - To prevent those rust rings on medicine or kitchen cabinet shelves that are caused by metal aerosol cans or containers such as shaving lotion. furniture polish, cleaning fluid, etc., come in, put a stretch terry cloth coaster base on them just as you would on a drinking glass. They can be made easily for this purpose out of scraps of STRETCH terry cloth leftover from other sewing. Cut a piece about five inches wide and one inch less than the circumference of the container. Seam the five-inch sides together. Make a wife small hem top and bottom to insert pieces of elastic. Elastic put around the bottom should be very short so practically all of it is covered. Top elastic is cut one inch shorter than circumference of the hem. Such covers will last a long time and are worth the time used to make them and can be thrown in the washing machine when soiled. — SYLVIA

DEAR SYLVIA and girls - This is a good idea but I would eliminate having to make that bottom hem and then running elastic through it. 
