**None Is Permitted To
Quit Country Without
Special Permit;

BERLIN, Apr. 3.—(A.P.)—Without offering any explanation the government announced today that beginning at midnight no one will be allowed to leave German soil without special permission of the police stamped on his passport.

Tax Collections In March Reported

WASHINGTON, Apr. 3.—(A.P.)—Income taxes of \$2,380,000.00 were reported on Mar. 31. The last day for filing returns brought the total for the month to \$190,712,800.00 compared with \$195,410,800.00 a year ago. The amount, however, does not represent all returns filed because many were mailed and would not be counted until today, so officials believe the government still has a chance of exceeding the amount collected during last March.
