Month May Pass Before Alliance Becomes Binding

WASHINGTON, Apr. 7-(/P)--A Tountry-by-country survey showed today it may be at least a month before the new North Atlantic Treaty can become binding on the 12 nations which signed

Formal ratification may require substantially longer than this, some officials believe, barring a crisis with Soviet Russia which might spur the process.

The United States Senate has called for full hearings to precede debate. In Britain, House of Conmons rules require that all treaties must lie over for a minimum of 21 working days, excluding Sundays and holidays, before being debated.

At the other extreme, three of here on Monday could formally ratify it within a few days. The parliaments of Iceland, Denmark and Norway authorized their heads of government in advance to take this step. But by the terms of the treaty approval of this trio does! not affect the others.

However, the measure this year is supported by the Joint House Senate tax study committee, Budget Director Homer Graham and Comptroller C. M. Gay.

Only about one-fourth of Florida's total governmental expenditures now are authorized by the general appropriations act passed every two years. The rest are covered by continuing appropriations that, once passed, remain in effect until the Legislature repeals them. There are several hundred such
