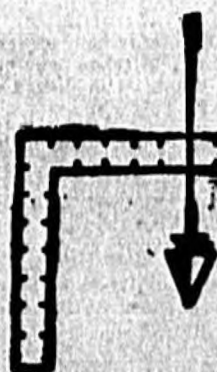

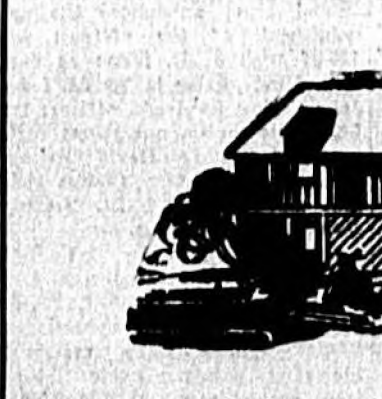

### Veterans Corner

Here are authoritative answers from the Veterans Administration to four questions of interest to former servicemen and their families:

Q. I recently exchanged my World War II GI permanent insurance policy for a reduced amount of paid-up insurance, on which I no longer will have to pay premiums. Will this paid-up insurance give me the same benefits as any other permanent GI policy?

A. Yes. Your paid-up insurance will have cash value, a loan provision, and will share in all GI dividends.

Q. I am eligible for Korean GI Bill training, but I am thinking of going back into active military service. Could I take a GI correspondence course, while I'm in uniform?

A. No. Under the law, veterans may not receive Korean GI training while on active duty—even though they meet all the law's other basic requirements.

Q. Will I be required to pay an extra fee if I want to pay off part of my GI home loan in advance? I know that in some mortgages, a penalty must be paid in making such payments.

A. Under the GI loan program, loans may be paid off or reduced without the payment of any fee, extra charge or penalty.

Q. May I receive VA outpatient care for treatment of a non-service-connected disability?

A. No. Under the law, outpatient care generally is limited to veterans who need it for service-connected conditions.
