Aid For Voc School

Support will not be forthcoming from the state government for a proposed vocational training school for migrants at Sanford Airport, ac technical and adult education. In a telephone interview from Tallahassee, the assistant commissioner made it plain that the state will fight the establishment of a vocational school at the airport.

"We know how the people in Seminole County feel about this proposed school," Dr Proehl stated, "and we will withhold any support of it. Commissioner (Floyd) Christian is in accord with this feeling."

Dr. Prochl pointed out that \$4 million has been allocated for vocational schools for the underprivilege in the entire state "and we have no intention of funneling \$3 million or more of this fund into Central Florida at Sanford Airport but intend to spread it over the entire state."

The new vocational-technical school being constructed by the Seminole County Board of Education at the Seminole Junior College site will "more than suffice to take care of the needs for Seminole and adjoining counties," Dr. Proehl said. He added he could "see no reason" for the School Board to construct one vocational school and the state and federal governments establishing another vocational school "right next
