The recent outbreak of hostilities in many parts of the world together with natural disaster have resulted in an increase in the activities of the Red Cross. The following briefly outlines the structure of the world Red Cross organization and the Geneva Conventions. Purpose of the four Geneva conventions (sometimes referred to as the Red Cross conventions), to which virtually every government in the world is a party, is to protect the victims of war. These conventions do not govern, as do the Hague Conventions, the laws

and customs of warfare. The 1949 Geneva Conventions, which were ratified by the United States in 1955, contain provisions for (1) the protection of sick and wounded on land and sea. (2) regulations concerning the prisoners of war, and (3) rules for the protection of civilian persons The International Committee of the Red Cross is made up of not more than 25 Swiss citizens. Its headquarters are in

Geneva, Switzerland, where it maintains its secretariat and staff. Under the Geneva Conventions, the ICRC, as an international, neutral, and humanitarian organization, may be called on to ensure that the provisions of the Conventions are carried out. Traditionally, this includes inspection of prisoner of war camps, handling of mail, and relief for prisoners. The ICRC also negotiates between belligerents to rescue persons trapped in war areas, and frequently affords emergency relief for refugees. The League of Red Cross Societies is a federation of the national societies of 106 different countries. The League's headquarters and secretariat are in Geneva. Its primary

functions are to promote cooperation among its members, co-ordinate international humanitarian efforts to mitigate human suffering, and encourage voluntary service in promoting health and welfare programs. The League is controlled by a Board of Governors, each member representing a national society. In most Moslem countries, the national societies providing

Red Cross services are known as the Red Crescent. In Iran,

Clara Barton, was first chartered by the Congress of the 'United States in 1900 and charged with the responsibility of relieving suffering in times of disaster both in this country and abroad, and with providing services to the U.S. Armed Forces. ARC is supported by voluntary contributions and has more than 2 million volunteer workers. It is not an agency of the government. ARC is a member of the League of Red Cross Societies and contributes to the work of the League and the ICRC.





If they gave Mr. Knowles \$25,000 he would be worth it. Just as School Finance director Walter Teague is worth every bit If there were no Mr. Knowles in Sanford the city would be forced to hire an engineer for at least \$10,000 per year. So in other words, accord-

ing to last year's budget, Pete Knowles gets only \$5,400 as city manager. Knowing how many hours Mr. Knowles puts in, that's about \$1.50
