## Remap 'Ridiculous,' Candidates Aver

Four of Seminole County's potential candidates for the U.S. House of Representatives next year are "not too happy" with the congressional district changes ordered by a federal tribunal at Miami.

Sen. Kenneth Plante, Altamonte Springs Republican (by telephone from Tallahassee), stated: "It is ridiculous the way the court butchered Duval County and the city is in the fifth district."

Sen. Robert Petree, English E. Brevard County, however, has no idea where the 17 precincts in Duval are located and I plan to go to Jacksonville as soon as possible and find out about them. I understand there are about 20,000 people in the area.

"I am certainly pleased that Seminole County will stand in the fourth congressional district. Congressman A. S. Herling Jr., Leesburg Democrat, some weeks ago announced that he will not seek re-election in 1968.

Douglas Stronstrom, Sanford Democrat, said this morning: "The courts have taken away from our district Pasco and Osceola Counties and have added five precincts in North Brevard County and 17 precincts in South Duval County."

"Having represented Brevard County for six years before retiring from the State Senate in 1960, I would welcome the privilege of running again in Seminole County."

## Sanford Man 'Critical' In House Blaze

A 74-year-old Sanford man is reported in critical condition at Seminole Memorial Hospital today from severe burns over the upper part of his body received in a house fire Wednesday afternoon.

Henry McDonald, sole occupant of the small five-room rental dwelling at 705 E. Ninth Street owned by Selma Hester, was pulled from the flaming structure by Sheriff's Deputy Willie Brown, who was called to the scene by neighbors shouting at the fire.

The trapped man apparently was sleeping at start of the blaze and flames spread rapidly through the frame house which was "fully involved" by the time Sanford Fire Department was called. Chief C. M. Harrett said this morning: "Damage, which Harrett reports are extensive, were quickly confined to the one-shedding although firemen remained for some two hours in the closely congested area on an emergency standby basis."

## Cycle Thieves Smash Grocery; Steal \$424

A pair of motorcycle thieves smashed into the Little Giant grocery store on SR 496 near Altamonte Springs and stole \$424.68 from the safe early this morning, Sheriff J. L. Hobbs reported.

Hobbs said the pair used a smash through a side wall in the place.

The thieves were a large amount of money orders. It was the second time in less than three months that the store was broken into, Hobbs added.

The sheriff also reported the driving golf range next door was broken into and the coke machine jimmied.

At the same time deputies reported a man walked into the 14 Shell Oil Station on 436 held up the attendant, and stole about \$38 in cash early this morning.

It was the second robbery of the station in a week. Early Sunday a pair robbed the station of \$60.

## Why Altamonte Would Rather Switch

Charging the Commercial Bank at Winter Park "has treated us as though we are gullible," the Altamonte Springs Town Council voted unanimously last night to arrange interim financing for the water system improvements at the Florida State Bank and transfer all city bank accounts to the Sanford banking institution.

"I'm in favor of changing these accounts to Florida State as quickly as possible," Mayor W. Lawrence Swafford declared.

The Winter Park bank stands to lose nearly \$200,000 in city accounts and deposits by the action.

The Council and the mayor indicated their shock at proposal of the Winter Park bank to provide interim financing for water system improvements, at a recent meeting, with charges indicated totaling \$600 for bank attorney fees and other incidental expenses including telephone conferences. In addition the bank proposed interest rate on the short 120-day loan for \$250,000 at the prime rate of 5 1/2 per cent.

The loan is guaranteed by the federal government with monies to be used until water system improvements have progressed to a point where government funds will be advanced.

However, 79 per cent said they were against lowering the voting age to 18.

David Henson, Uniroyal representative for the southeastern states, talked with the Herald Wednesday and outlined plans for present construction and future expansion.

"We have been leasing land for agricultural chemicals research," Henson said. "We figured it to be Uniroyal's advantage to purchase their own land. Often the rented land would be recalled for some other purpose right in the middle of one of our experiments."

The Sanford facility will be an arm of the main research facility located in Bethany, Conn. The local farm will be mainly for synthesis and green house screening. Strictly agricultural, it will have two main functions — namely, initial field screening of potential pesticides and formulating studies of existing products.

## Peebles Says 'No Hitch' On Bonds

"No hitch" is foreseen by State Road Commissioner Willard Peebles in the issuance of \$1,478,000 in road bonds by Seminole County for the purchase of right-of-way for proposed state road building in this county.

Peebles said the usual procedure is for a county to check with the State Road Department in advance of a formal request to learn the "bonding capacity" of the county.

County Commission formally agreed Tuesday to request the State Road Department to process the bond issuance, to be repaid by the county from a portion of its secondary road moneys over a period of 25 years.

Peebles stated the bonds will be processed by the State Road Department, with the assistance of the Florida Development Commission.

The state has set up a five-year road building program for this county, with the proviso that the county furnish the necessary right-of-way.

No. 1 priority has been given by the SRD to the Goldenrod-Oviedo section of SR 426.

## Budget Cut: Top Fiscal Management

Good budget control and outstanding fiscal management were credited to Sanford County Commission Vice-Chairman John Fitzpatrick as the major cause for the one-half mill decrease in ad valorem taxes brought about by the Board Wednesday afternoon.

"This is a remarkable achievement," Fitzpatrick reported. "After six years during which the county had unprecedented growth with the population explosion, expanded the services of the road department and the health department, the County Commission managed with the new budget to reduce the millage by one-half mill that has been raised over the years."

Results of the sharp pencils of the County Commission after more than 50 hours of chipping sessions were readily noticeable today with some \$200,000 decrease in appropriations scheduled for the 1967-68 fiscal year over the current budget year.

Total appropriations tentatively approved by the Commission is \$2,703,057 which will set the county millage rate at 6.23 mills, a reduction of one-half mill over the 1966-67 budget year.

Appropriations during the past year totaled \$2,762,265. The County Commission is expected to call a special meeting of the Board next Thursday to set public hearing on the budget.

Fines and forfeiture fund required millage of 1.09 mill with cash balance to total of \$264,401. Appropriation is \$114,937; county contingency \$28,644; judge's contingency \$2,500; sheriff's contingency \$10,000 and cash reserve of \$49,000.

Road and bridge millage is set at 1.20 mill with appropriation of \$742,052; reserve contingency \$73,425 and cash reserve \$81,500.

Other rates of taxation set are Seminole Memorial Hospital, \$2 mill; \$10,000; Health Department, .19 mill; \$21,240; Port Authority .09 mill; \$21,241 and Capital Outlay, .50 mill; \$112,320.

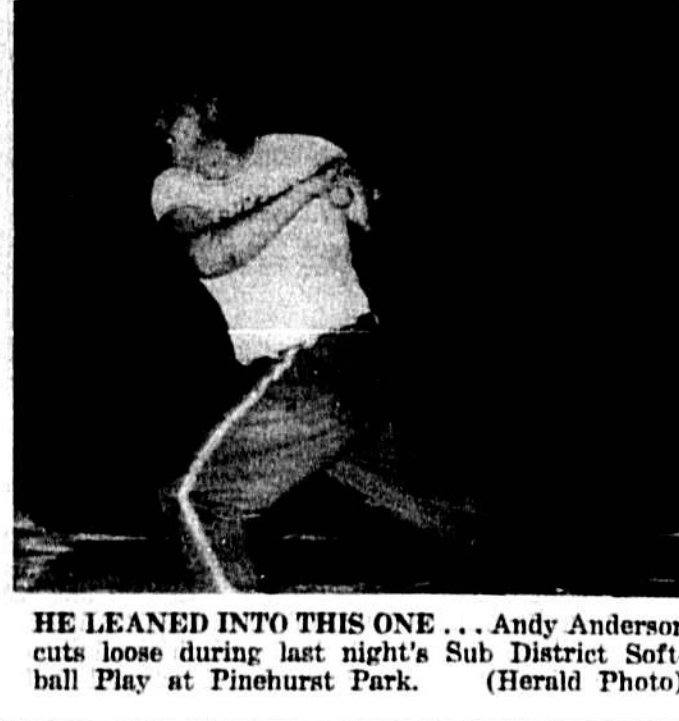

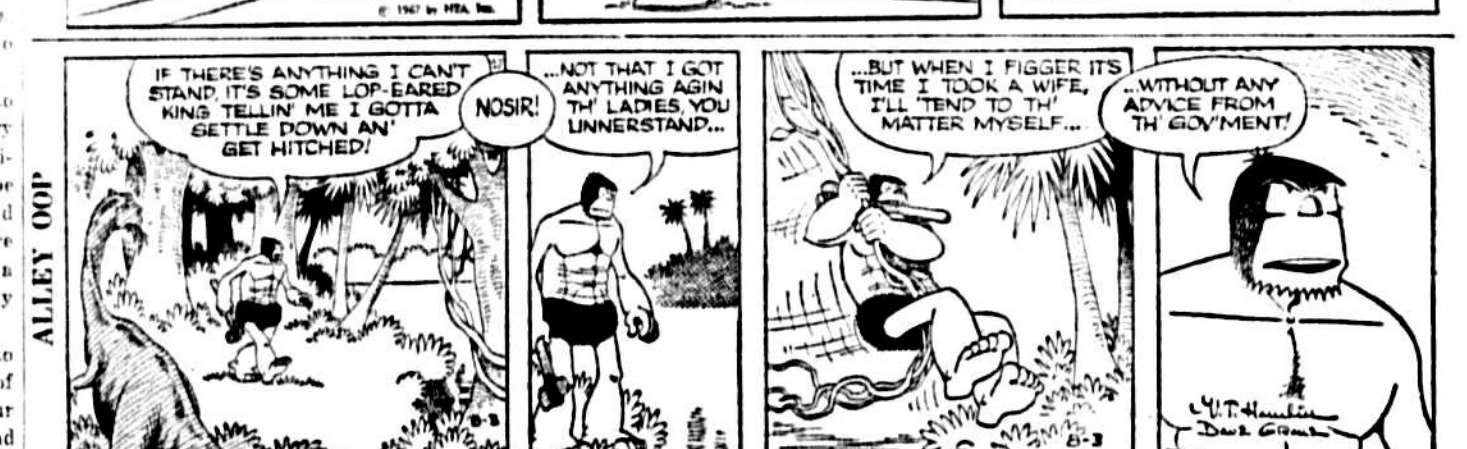
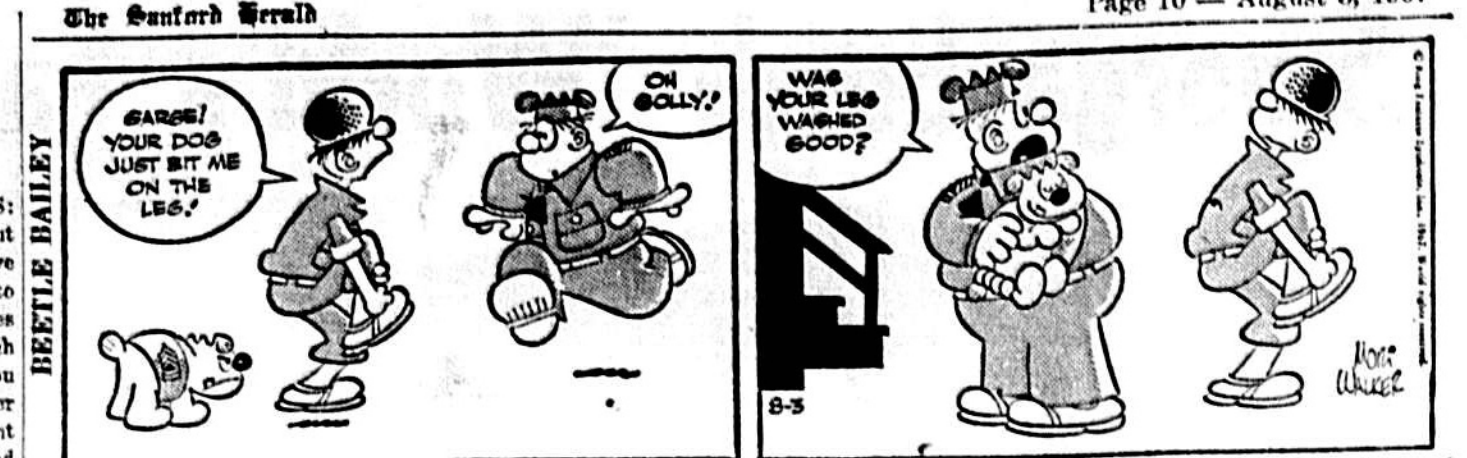
