Have You Paid Your Doctor?
The Seminole County Physicians' Credit Bureau was organized for the Mutual Protection of Patient and Physician.
Only the accounts of those who failed to settle or arrange for a satisfactory liquidation will be placed with the Bureau for collection and until such time as they arranged with the Bureau for an extension of credit, they will be placed on a strictly cash basis. (PAY AS YOU GO)
Future Accounts Will Be Handled As Follows:
First—Statements will be mailed first of each month.
Those who are classed as able to pay, are expected to pay promptly.
Second—Those who are classed as not able to pay all their account promptly, may arrange to pay part monthly.
Third—Those whose income in our judgment, does not justify even a small payment monthly, will be extended credit, and receive further medical care, until in our judgment, he is able to pay.
Fourth—Those who neglect to settle promptly or arrange for monthly payment in a reasonable time, will have their accounts placed with the Bureau for adjustment, and until adjusted, will be classed as PAY AS YOU GO with each physician belonging to the Bureau.
