

The 31-year-old Marine captain, who granted the interview on the condition his name not be used, flew one of the RH53-D helicopters involved in the rescue

Israel Breaks Up Protest

JERUSALEM (UPI) - Israeli troops fired into the air and launched teargas grenades to break up Palestinian demonstrations today in a crackdown on mounting civil unrest in the occupied West Bank.

Israel barred business strikes, banned meetings by West Bank, leaders and re-imposed censorship restrictions on Arab newspapers in line with tougher measures imposed on the unruly region since a terrorist ambush Friday killed six Jewish seminary students and wounded 16 other people.

Four of the dead, including two Americans and a Canadian were to be buried today.

ATLANTA (UPI) - A new influenza virus has surfaced in this country and several other parts of the world, prompting government scientists to change their recommendations for next winter's preventive

The new virus is being called A-Bangkok. Because it is antigenically different from other flu viruses that have been around for some time, it has the potential for infecting large segments of the population. A panel of the government's top health experts, the

Advisory Committee on Immunization Practices, mendations for a protective flu vaccine. The sessions will be held at the national Center for Disease Control. Scientists first spotted the A-Bangkok virus in the late stages of last winter's flu outbreaks. Most of the flu cases at that time were caused by another flu bug, B-Singapore. But there were scattered cases of the more severe influenza-A, some of which were found to be the A-Bangkok variety.



Mexico can afford to be optimistic about its mmense economic problems because it has 200 million barrels of oil reserves - far better than money in the bank. 

A Magical Interaction

Sid Caesar, Imogene Coca To Team Up Once Again

HOLLYWOOD (UPI) - Sid Caesar threw back his head and guffawed, letting his sandwich drop to his plate. His companion, Imogene Coca, had just broken him up with a joke. They were sitting in an office in the Sunset-Gower Studios the old Columbia lot — taking a break from rehearsals for television's May 13 "The Big Show."

It was as if the clock had been turned back 30 years to the heyday of "Your Show of Shows" when Caesar and Coca were the funniest comedy team in the infant television industry. They, along with Jackie Gleason, Milton Berle and Red Buttons gave viewers a golden age of live video comedy that has not been approached since.

And no wonder. Among the writers, directors and contributors to "Your Show of Shows" were Woody Allen, Mel Brooks, Carl Reiner, Neil Simon, Mike Stewart, Howard Morris and Larry Gelbart. But it was the brilliant antics of Caesar and Coca that kept

the show at the top of the ratings from 1949-54. They were the most successful malefemale comedy team the tube ever shows which failed to measure up to their combined comedy impact. They joined forces for a TV special in 1968 - which

won 10 Emmys — and again a few years later. Aside from those appearances and a Vegas stand a couple of years ago. Caesar and Coca have not worked together. Sid makes his home in Hollywood. Imogene lives in New York. They have little in common and rarely see one another socially. But, when Sid and Imogene get together on stage, there's a magical interaction which neither of them can satisfactorily explain. But they are clearly aware of the special interplay of personality and character. "It just works," Caesar said between munches on his sand-


