AERONAUT HAS PLAN TO SPUR OCEAN FLYING

Porter Adams Of Washington Advises An Exhaustive Research To Determine Possibilities Of Long Flights

By these test flights, which would be carefully supervised from an engineering and safety standpoint and carried out only under the most satisfactory weather conditions, Adams believes it will be possible to determine approximately how many good flying days over the Atlantic can be expected in a year.

Outlining his plans for the International Aero Service, before today's meeting of the Association's board of directors, he explained that a fund of \$75,000 to \$100,000 would be needed for the test flights.

Those added to the board, all of them growers, were as follows: F. W. Davidson of Mount Dora, J. M. Conway of Apopka, F. A. Chamberlain, R. H. Ellis and Albert Casper of Orlando and Al Company of Sanford. Other members of the directorate are: F. W. Bender, president; Edward Higgins and R. W. Pedrano.

Each flight would be made with one or two passengers, it being one of the primary purposes of the tests to determine whether passengers can be carried safely and economically across the ocean.

Mr. Ellis gave first hand information on his experiences as a successful producer of Easter lilies on a large scale. The problems of the lily grower as they confront him from day to day were depicted by the speaker in a most entertaining manner.

President Bender, head of the association, described the gathering as one of the best and most instructive of his kind that he had ever attended. Every grower present was enthusiastic, he said, about the success of the meeting and each was optimistic about a successful season ahead.
