Middle school rezoning gets underway

SANFORD --Phase II of the Middle School Rezoning for Seminole County Public Schools will create a zone for the new Markham Woods Middle School, scheduled to open for the 2006-2007 school year. Students that may

be affected by the proposed rezoning are those presently zoned for Greenwood Lakes Middle School in Lake Mary, and Sanford and Millennium Middle schools in Sanford.

A core committee will conduct workshops at all three schools. The first will be Sept. 26 at 4:30 p.m. at Millennium Middle School, 21 Lakeview Ave., Sanford. SANFORD - A security guard involved in the fatal shooting of a teenager is at the center of a lawsuit filed by a Boynton Beach woman.

Patricia M. Hartwig filed an amended lawsuit in June claiming she was battered and falsely arrested in October 2000 by a Parisian department store security guard named Bryan Ansley of Sanford. Ansley is the same man involved in a fatal shooting in July at Country Lake Apartments in Sanford.

Hartwig has sued Parisian Inc., after an incident that took place at the Seminole Towne Center store on Oct. 21, 2000.



She alleges that Ansley identified himself as a Sanford police officer, and that he verbally assaulted her, and grabbed and handcuffed her in the parking lot outside the store.

Hartwig also said Ansley held her inside the store where he shoved her against a wall.

Ansley did not return two messages left on his Nextel answering service. Parisian filed a defense document

saying Hartwig conducted herself "negligently and carelessly" causing or at least contributing to her injuries.

The store said third parties not under its control caused the "damages" claimed by Hartwig. Parisian attorney Terry D. Dixon of DeLand said he did not want to comment on the case.

Ansley is now the co-owner of Community Enforcement, a Lake Mary-based security business hired by Country Lake Apartments to guard the premises.

In the early morning hours of July 16, Ansley and employee William Swofford, shot into a car full of young men, killing Travares McGill, 16.

According to the lawsuit brought by Hartwig, she had driven to Seminole Towne Center to meet her daughter, Amy. Hartwig, who describes herself in the lawsuit as a white, female Christian, brought a young black Gospel singer with her because she was transporting him from a rehearsal.

The young man went into Parisians, but Hartwig decided to wait in the parking lot because of problems with an ovarian cyst. While waiting, she said she saw the young man running fast

Brothers busted for burglaries

Several construction companies are playing the waiting game after three arrests in Lake County led to a home filled with stolen property from construction home sites.

At least 10 different home sites in Sanford may have been the victims of brothers Ricky Shelhorse and Shawn Shelhorse, and their brother-in-law Jamey Hamilton, all of Volusia County.

The three were arrested Sunday night, after an off duty Lake County Deputy Sherilf observed one of the males drop off the other two at a residence under construction in the Mt. Plymouth community.

The three men were in a stolen van, from Volusia County, that was pulling a trailer. In the van there was a brand new stove and in

LONGWOOD - Longwood police arrested a former resident Sept. 21 for possessing child pornography discovered by his estranged wife on CDs. Tasha Wilcox found 29 com-

pact discs at their Longwood home while going through the belongings of her husband who had moved to Vero Beach. She inserted two CDs into a computer and saw pornographic pictures that appeared to contain juveniles. She then decided to contact law enforcement.



SEMINOLE SUMMARY A GLANCE AROUND OUR COUNTY

John G. Roberts Jr., the president's nominee for chief justice of the U.S. Supreme Court, has been praised for his intellect and in-depth knowledge of the high court's history. But I'm betting he wouldn't recognize the name S.D. McGill. Most folks wouldn't, even here in McGill's hometown of Sanford. McGill might not be a household name, but his accomplishments in the courtroom helped create an important legal precedent that Americans will easily recognize - the Miranda rights.

Simuel Decatur McGill was born in Quincy, Fla. He moved to Central Florida with his brother Nathan when his mother remarried the Rev. A.E. Irvin, a Methodist minister and shoemaker who lived on the northwest corner of 8th Street and Hickory



Avenue in the Georgetown community. That house still stands, as does the workshop Irvin built to accommodate his craft.

McGill went to college at Edward Waters College in Jacksonville, graduating in 1902. He earned his law degree from Boston University in 1907 and returned to lacksonville to start his

practice. In addition to offering his services to the black community, McGill worked closely with the National Association for the Advancement of Colored People (NAACP) to advocate civil rights. McGill's legal talents helped abolish execution by hanging in the state of Florida during the mid-1920s.

But it was an incident in Pompano Beach that led McGill's biggest accomplishment. An elderly white man, Robert Darcy, was robbed and murdered on Saturday, May 13, 1933. In response to community outrage, the sheriff arrested as many as 40 black men. For a week the men were questioned and cross-examined by deputies. None of the men were allowed to speak to attorneys or family members, and deputies eventually narrowed their focus on four men. After an all-night vigil during which nearly a dozen officers besieged each man individually with "persistent and repeated questioning," the four confessed to the murder.

McGill was contacted to represent the "Four Pompano Boys." Not surprisingly, the four were convicted and sentenced to death, based solely on their correct confessions. For nine years McGill shepherded the case through the appeals process. Some legal his-lorians credit Thurgood Marshall, the first

black man to serve on the U.S. Supreme Court, with winning the freedom of the Four Pompano Boys. But it was actually McGill who argued the case before the Supreme Court in 1940 (Chambers v. State of Florida 309 U.S. 227). Marshall, working as part of the NAACP Defense Fund, assisted McGill with the case.

Justice Hugo Black, a former member of the Alabama Ku Klux Klan, wrote the majority opinion that reversed the case and led to the four men being freed in 1942. "Due process of law, preserved for all by our Constitution, commands that no such practice as that disclosed by this record shall send any accused to his death," Black wrote. "No higher duty, no more solemn responsibility, rests upon this Court, than that of translating into living law and maintaining this constitutional shield deliberately planned and inscribed for the benefit of every human being subject to our Constitution - of whatever race, creed or persuasion." Beyond the obvious impact of clearing the names of four innocent men who were sentenced to death, McGill's victory had long term effects. The Chambers precedent, when combined with other cases (most notably Escobedo v. Illinois 378 U.S. 478) led to the Supreme Court in 1966 establishing what we now know as the Miranda rights (Miranda v. Arizona 384 U.S. 386). "Since Chambers v. Florida, this Court has recognized that coercion can be mental as well as physical, and that the blood of the accused is not the only hallmark of an unconstitutional inquisition." Chief Justice Earl Warren wrote in the Miranda verdict. McGill's name will most likely never become as prominent as Roberts', who is expected to be confirmed next week as the 17th chief justice of the Supreme Court. However, it's McGill's legacy of securing protection for those unjustly accused that Roberts must strive to uphold during his tenure on the nation's highest court.





the trailer there were two refrigerators and a new microwave oven.

Lake County Sheriff's Office spokesperson Christie Mysinger said they believe that the items found in the van and trailer were stolen from other houses under construction in the Sorrento Springs subdivision at CR 437 and SR 44, where at least three burglaries were discovered by investigators.

After a preliminary investigation earlier this week, deputies found that two of the men had a home in Deltona. The Volusia County Sheriff's Office obtained a search warrant on 1166 Manitoba Street and discovered the house was packed with stolen property, Brandon Haught, spokesperson for the Volusia County Sheriff's Office said.

The Sheriff's Office found brand new appliances and building materials such as tools, bathtubs, cement mixers, new doors and windows, and sinks. They said there was stolen property packed into almost every room in the house.

All this week investigators were going through the burglary reports from construc-

Luciano reported that in addition to an ivory faucei worth \$300, a \$2,000 G.E. double stack oven; a \$1,000 cook top; a \$1,000 granite counter

and a \$200 G.E. water heater were all stolen. Luciano is also still waiting

for a phone call to find out if any of the recovered property

"They [the burglars] came in: they took what they took; and hacksawed the sinks right off the wall and left the water running," Luciano said.

According to Luciano, theft is common at construction sites, but not to this extent. But, he's not getting worked up over it, he said.

'That's what insurance is for," Luciano commented.

Luciano had another home site in Sanford that had a \$2,000 gas fireplace stolen from another construction site in the beginning Aug. 8, 2005. Haught said that they have been able to match some of the stolen property to its rightful owner. He said that the first victim who came by said he just recovered \$10,000 worth

of property. Right now, Sheriff's offices are going through their burglary reports from the past several months and contacting the victims to see if they can identify any of the stolen property.





Are you **REALLY** healthy?

Let me preface this by emphasizing that I am not a doctor, and am in no way connected with the medical profession, (other than making visit after visit). But this is about being sick - and not knowing it.

Someone recently asked a Herald staff member why so many of the persons listed in



the obituaries are in their 50s. As the person who writes these obits, I know that this is the case. In this past mid-week edition of the Herald, three of the 12 names listed were in their 50s. Two were under 50, and two were exactly 60. That's more than half who were 60 or younger.

I have an opinion on this, and possibly folks will agree. When we have youngsters, we take them to the doctor often, even if there are no signs

of medical problems. We just want to be certain they are healthy. Once they are older, unless they get sick or have an injury, we don't seem to bother anymore.

When we, ourselves, reach into the 40's and older, we have a tendency to feel we are invincible. We feel healthy, so why go to a doctor for a checkup? Or, in some cases, we avoid the doctors, because we don't want to know if there is some medical problem that may cause difficulties in the years ahead. The problem with this is that many folks may have some problem which could be


thwarted if found early enough. If we were to find out that there is a problem, which might be averted, no one wants to end up taking four, six, ten, even more pills each day. This is a bother, and in many cases, extremely costly.

Some, in an effort to be as healthy as possible, take to jogging, walking, blke riding, some form of exercising, possibly going to a gym, watching what we eat or drink, stop smoking, use sunscreen at the beach, and other activities which will lead you to believe you are as healthy as can be. These are all good. But still, even persons who work as hard as possible to be healthy are capable of contracting some disease. After all, many of our diseases are carried over from generation to gener-ation, and there is little we can do about that. One problem which is difficult to handle is the lack of medical insurance. If those who have some

form of insurance were to find out what it costs to visit a doctor (something they would have to pay themselves without insurance), we would probably get sick from just knowing that.

"I'm in good shape physically, why go to a doctor? They'll just find some problem and we'll end up on medication for the rest of our lives." Could that be what you have told yourself?

To add a personal comment, my sister, in advanced age, refused to visit a doctor until she had serious medical problems. They found she had problem, which, if known earlier, might have been solved. Yet, she waited and waited - too long - and finally, when she went to the doctor, it was too late. I lost her this past January. Don't sit around and act healthy - have a medical checkup and find out if you really are healthy. It doesn't matter if you are in your 30s, 40s, 50s or older - there is no specific age during which you become unhealthy. If you simply don't what to know that you have a problem, think of your family and friends, and do it for them. After all, they care about your health too.

O: How is our Constitution holding up at age 218?

A: It really is holding up remarkably well when you stop and think about what in the past five or six years we've been through as a country: the impeachment trial of a president; a contested presidential election; an attack on U.S. soil on 9/11; a war in foreign territory; the death of our chief justice; the flood and destruction of a major U.S. city, which we would never have imagined. And despite all that, we're all still standing and working together and resolving legal issues that flow from all of these things through the three branches of our government.

Constitution that don't apply to many of us unless we are the president or a United States senator like him. Having a written constitution, of course, was a revolutionary idea at the time. Great Britain's constitution was unwritten. France's was really just a statement of general purpose. Having this Constitution and adding the Bill of Rights to spell out the rights and liberties we all have was rather a dramatic thing itself. When you look at those rights, they talk about equality and equal protection and due process under the law, and really it's all of the best virtues that we consider exist in a just society, and that's what we hope to be.

Q: Do you think Supreme **Court nominee John Roberts** is likely to change the court in any substantial way?

A: Well, we have to see who gets appointed along with him. That's a bigger question. But I think he has the ability to have a great influence on the Supreme Court.

He's a remarkably talented, gifted individual, and he

It applies to everyone, and everyone gets to use it in the same way, whether you are poor or are the best lawyer in the state. You have to remember that this Constitution really is designed for everyone. In the abstract, it is easy to try to take it away from some copie, but when you apply it to real cases that touch your life, all of a sudden you can see the great importance of why we have it.

Another thing - the Constitution is not something that is meant to be left to a thumbs-up or thumbsdown vote of a group of Americans at one time. In



toward her chased by Ansley who held what looked like a

gun. The young man, Prevo Larry Clark, jumped in the car. Hartwig said Ansley yelled racially discriminating curse words, so she drove a short distance away. Near the Olive Garden restaurant, Clark exited the car saying the man chasing him was a police officer.

"I felt it was my duty to drive back to the store and talk to the police about what had happened since I only knew this young man through his playing for churches," Hartwig wrote in a signed statement for the lawsuit.

When she returned to the parking lot, Ansley identified himself as a Sanford police officer, Hartwig said. She asked if he was related to former Sanford police officer Mark Ansley. She had known the elder Ansley who had helped train her dog. Bryan Ansley replied that he was Mark Ansley's son, Hartwig said.

She told Ansley she needed to use the bathroom because of bleeding caused by the cyst, but when she exited the car, Ansley grabbed, twisted and handcuffed her wrists, according to Hartwig's account.

Hartwig asked why she had been handcuffed and said Ansley yelled expletives at her and told her to, "Start walking!" She claims he walked her through Parisians in front of customers and locked her in a room. An assistant manager told Hartwig she could not help her

because Ansley was in charge. Hartwig was left alone with Ansley, according to her narrative.

She said she begged Ansley to let her at least go to the bathroom as he repeatedly entered and exited the locked room. She claims Ansley shoved her against the wall and said: "Until that n---- comes back I won't let you talk to anybody."

Hartwig said she passed out and hit her head. When she came to she yelled to a Parisian

employee to call 911. She reports that a Sanford police officer named James Norman, who no longer works for the department, argued with Ansley that he should let her go immediately.

"He also asked Bryan Ansley was there any Parisian property taken out of the store and Bryan said no," Hartwig recounted. She was finally released, but she saw Clark, the young black man, in the next room.

She said Clark was distraught and tried to strangle himself.

"The police then took Prevo, as far as we knew, to Baker Act him," Hartwig said in her account. "Until this day I still have nightmares and panic attacks when I get in confined places with people I don't know."

She also said she wants counseling for herself and her family. Her daughter, Amy, also wrote an account of what she witnessed.

A security officer told Amy and her brother, Michael, at about 6:30 p.m., that their mother had been part of a theft. She said the officer told her at one point to leave the premises or he would lock her in the room with her mom.

"Then Prevo shows up saying that mom had nothing to do with it, it was just him, and that she had no idea, ..." Amy said. She added her mom was not released until about 9:15 p.m.

One of Hartwig's attorneys, Larry Hanks of Fern Park, said the law requires Parislan to immediately call authorities in this case. He said Sanford police did not receive a call until 8:04 p.m. and dispatched an officer at 8:41

Hanks said Clark never took any items out of the store. He said Ansley caught up to him

between the double doors, but only managed to rip off Clark's shirt.

As far as Hanks knows, Ansley was a security guard employed by Parisian. Hanks said the store used its own security personnel instead of the mall's

"We know that at the time, he was their employee," Hanks said Thursday. He also said Ansley was the same person involved in the July 16 shooting at Country Lake Apartments.

During that incident, Ansley and Swofford approached a car driven by McGill, who did not own the car and did not have a driver's license.

The car had at least three other passengers. Police reports said McGill saw the guards and then backed into a passenger who had just exited the car breaking his leg. Ansley and Swolford told

police that McGill drove toward them and they opened fire. Two 9 mm bullets his McGill, one pierced his heart, killing him.

For McGill's relatives and the Seminole County Branch of the NAACP, Ansley and Swofford's stories about the July 16 shooting do not make sense.

McGill's mother and the NAACP have called for a threejudge panel to look into the matter. They also want the guards arrested.

The Sanford Police Department and the Florida Department of Law Enforcement have yet to turn an investigation report over to State Attorney Norm Wolfinger. Police Chief Brian Tooley and a representative from Wolfinger's office answered questions about the shooting at a town hall meeting in Sanford Sept. 13.



The Way We Were:

Temple existed under Hyman

Last week I told you about one of the two acquisitions that First Baptist Church had received recently that has helped fill the gaps of its history. This was the souvenir program from the opening of the Baptist Temple on Nov. 14, 1914.

I should have explained then about "The Baptist Temple". The church was incorporat-ed as First Baptist Church in 1917, but under the pastorate of the Rev. George Hyman, the church building was called the Baptist Temple, Rev. Hyman envisioned the building being used as a sort of cultural arts center, with outstanding speakers, musical programs,

etc. being presented there for the community. An Indication of how the membership felt about his grandiose ideas was shown then, two months after, Hyman resigned in 1922. The congregation voted to drop the Baptist Temple name, and everything now would be First Baptist Church. The church would also have no further connection with the Temple club.

The other item recently

received is a copy of several pages of the Dec. 24, 1920 edition of the Sanford Herald that tells of the first service in the new auditorium on Dec. 26. This was found by Karen Jacobs, museum director of the Museum of Seminole County History, and

Remember that this auditorium had been built onto the Sunday School section that had been completed in 1914. And remember also that the building was still called the Baptist Temple.

The Church had a copy of the front page of this edition of the Herald and I had used the information found there extensively in my book, especially the reminisces of Mrs. E.E. Cox, charter member, I also used information found there on the organ baptistery, builders, etc. The program from the first service held in the new auditorium on Dec. 26, 1920 was on that front page and I placed it in the book.

The other pages recently found, gave us further information on the church and I will give you some items you might find interest-

September 30 marks high and low points of Ruth's career

This coming Friday and Saturday, Sept. 30th and Oct. lst, were interesting days in the life of George Herman "Babe" Ruth. We'll look at these events now, and next week.

It was Sept. 30, 1927 when the Babe, with the New York Yankees, hit his 60th home run of the season off Tom Zachary of the Washington Senators. Ruth's record for the most homers in a single season stood for 34 years until Roger Maris hit 61 in 1961. Maris held the record for 37 years, until Mark McGwire hit 62 home runs

in a single season in 1998. Exactly seven years later, Sept. 30th, 1934, the Babe played his last game with the Yankees but apparently not yet realizing it would be

his swan song. Following that game, apparently several days apparently several days later, he was watching the fifth game of the World Series between St. Louis and Detroit, when he learned that he was NOT to be named Yankees' manager. Angry, Ruth told Joe

Williams, sports editor of the Scripps-Howard newspapers, that after 15 seasons, if ihey didn't think he deserved the manager's position, he would no longer play for the Yankees. And he didn'tt

Ruth, also known as the "Bambino" and the "Sultan of Swat", died of cancer on Aug. 16, 1948 in New York City at the age of 53. He had hit 714 home runs in 22 years in the major leagues, and played in 10 World Serles

His body lay in state at the main entrance of Yankee Stadium, where people waited in hours to march past the coffin.

If you ask folks who remember the Babe, or who saw several movies made of his life, they will probably tell of the time when he is said to have pointed to the center field bleachers prior to a two and two pitch, then hit a homer winning a game against the Chicago Cubs. Did he actually point, or was it a story made up by the press? Next week, I'll give you the details as I have been able to find out on this matter.



ORLANDO - Playing in its Conference USA contest, UCP makes its 2005 home debut this evening (Saturday), hosting Marshall at the Citrus Bowl. Kickoff is set for 6 p.m.

ABOUT MARSHALL

Marshall opened the season with a 36-24 victory over William & Mary, but then fell at home to Kansas State on Sept. 19, 21-19. The team had a bye last weekend.


The Thundering Herd have a new head coach on the sideline as Mark Snyder, who served as a graduate assistant at UCF from 1989-90, takes over for Bob Pruett. Snyder comes to Marshall from Ohio State, were he worked for four years.

Despite the change on the sidelines for Marshall, UCF head coach George O'Leary does not expect many changes from the Thundering Herd

"He (Snyder) changed the defense some. That was his background at Ohio State," said O'Leary. "They are doing a little bit different coverage concepts. Offensively, they kept the same coordi-nator there, so they are very similar to what they were last year."

Offensively, Marshail is led by sophomore running back Ahmad Bradshaw, perhaps the team's most versatile player. Bradshaw, who is a Doak Walker Award candidate, averages 65 rushing yards and 53 receiving yards per game and also leads the team with four touchdowns. Marshall has used two quarterbacks in both of their games so far this year, and both have played extremely well. So far, Jimmy Skinner and Bernie Morris have combined to complete 61.5 percent of their passes for 575 yards and three touchdowns. Both are expected to see time under center this week.

The team remains without top receiver Emanuel Spann, who is still recovering from offseason knee surgery. Spann is expected to return to action within the coming weeks. Hiram Moore and Wilbur Hargrove have filled in nicely at the receiver position, with each averaging over 70 receiving yards per game.

On the defensive side of the football, strong safety Curtis Keyes leads the team with 27 total tackles on the year. Defensive end Shavar Greer paces the team in sacks with 2.5 through two games. As a unit, Marshall is giving up over 180 yards on the ground per game, but only 165 yards through the air. In the loss to Kansas State, the Marshall defense surrendered 21 points in a 12 minute span, but shut out the Wildcats for the remaining 41 minutes of the ballgame.

ABOUT UCF UCF is coming off of a 31-14 loss to host USF last week. The Golden Knights have claimed

four of their last five home openers. On offense, quarterback Steven Moffett has utilized the services of wideouts Mike Walker and Lake Howell graduate Brandon Marshall. Walker has hauled in 14 catches for 175 yards and one score while Marshall also has 14 recep tions for 141 yards and one touchdown. On the season, Moffett has completed 46-of-79 attempts for 466 yards and two scores. Against the Bulls, Moffett led UCF on the ground with 50 yards. A pair of linebackers - Ronnell Sandy and James Cook - led the Golden Kidghts with 14 total tackles. Defensive back Travonti Johnson

totaled six stops against USF. Cornerback Joe Burnett, a true freshman, shined against the Bulls. Defensively, he had four total tackles, including two for loss. Burnett also returned tow punts for 77 yards, highlighted by a 60-yard return that set up UCF's first touchdown.
