Mica announces project to add lanes to I-4

ORLANDO - "Grab on to your steering wheel Central Florida," said U.S. Rep. John Mica, R-Winter Park, after a Monday unveiling of new widening plans to Interstate 4.

A sometimes tumultuous drive for Seminole residents down I-4 to Orlando will now involve more construction and possible delays.

The new plan to add a lane between

First phase will include 10-mile section from John Young Parkway to Maitland Boulevard

John Young Parkway and Maitland Boulevard is just one of three major projects occurring on Interstate 4 in the Seminole area. The replacement of the St. Johns River Bridge began in March 2001 and is slated to be completed by summer 2004 and construction of the "missing link" for the GreeneWay to I-4 is progress-

Mica and Florida Department of Transportation officials outlined the new project at a press conference near the interstate Monday. The project was labeled as an "interim fix" that will help alleviate traffic in the most congested stretch of the interstate.

"We have to look at this in an progres-sive manner," Mica said about the new plans that in no way solves Central Florida's transportation woes.

The 10-mile stretch of road work in each direction will primarily be contained to the existing median and right-of-ways, but drivers will still have 10 feet of shoulder on the inside lanes when the job is completed. The \$58 million project will be conducted at night with closed lanes

Sheriff issues advisory on biohazards

There are no indications Seminole County buildings, facilities or venues are a target of any type of terrorist attacks, but Sheriff Don. Eslinger is advising businesses and residents to take precautions.

"Given the latest events and the occurrence of Anthrax in the South Florida area, please continue to use vigilance in handling envelopes or packages of either unknown origin or which appear to have a foreign substance on them," Eslinger said in a written advisory. "We expect to continue to receive letters bearing biological and/or chemical threats. Although these letters have proven to be noaxes, it is suit neces that we take all precautions. Eslinger said the sheriff's office, as well as the Seminole County Health Department, the Department of Public Safety and other local, state and federal agencies, recommend that all suspicious envelopes, packages and their contents be handled with extraordinary care and caution.


Sanford man confirmed dead in NYC attacks

Cities ask county for bigger cut of gas tax

County receives 63.6 percent of gasoline funds, while 7 cities split the remaining share

SANFORD - The seven cities of Seminole County are asking for the county to recon-sider the distribution method of the 6-cent local option gas tax nearly a dozen years before the agreement expires.

Allowed by state statues, the board of county commissioners in 1983 implemented a scent gas tax and then approved an additional 2-cent increase Th 1985. A 30-year interlocal agreement between the counties and cities outlined the distribution of the gas

tax proceeds. The cities portion of gas tax revenues are based on a rolling five-year average of those yearly account of transportation expenditures. According to Cindy Hall, fiscal services manager for the county, the county receives approxi-mately \$6 million from the tax every year. City commissioners of the **Council of Local Governments** in Seminole County (CALNO) unanimously approved last week to ask the county to reexamine and possibly redistribute the local gas tax option revenues. 
Drug Sting





DOCTORS IN AN "INFORMATION PACKED" COMMUNITY DINNER

Dr. Joseph Boyle and Dr. Joseph Sicurella, of the First Health Chiropractic Clinics, were joined by prominent Daytona attorney Steve Vasilaros and shared an important message for automobile accident victims. During the dinner seminar, Dr. Joseph Sicurella stated, "The first three weeks after a whiplash injury should be called the 'vital period of treatment."

"During the three week period following an accident, proper care and treatment of a whiplash injury can often save the accident victim a lifetime of pain and discomfort."

"Remember," Dr. Sicurella stated, "a whiplash injury doesn't always produce symptoms until days, weeks, or months after an accident. Many accident victims are 'stunned' after an accident and don't feel pain and stiffness associated with whiplash. However, after a night's sleep, or even longer they usually experience a stiffness or soreness of their neck. This is a tip-off of a whiplash injury."

"Of course," Dr. Sicurella added, "many whiplash victims feel pain immediately."

The most common symptoms of a whiplash are stiffness and tenderness in the neck and headaches. There can also be visual disturbances and shoulder pain. "And, he noted, "in 50% of the cases, there is low back pain."

What is a whiplash and what is its cause?

Dr. Joseph Boyle answered this question as he stated, "A whiplash injury is caused by a sudden violent bending of the neck in one direction, and then in the

uation and determine if further measures are necessary, including decontamination and medical attention.

opposite direction. This sudden violent bending misaligns bones, tears muscles and ligaments and sprains joints."

The most common cause of a whiplash is an auto collision. However, a sudden jerk on one or both arms, a violent blow to the head, a reflex jerking of the head due to fright or sudden noise, or any kind of a fall that causes forceful movement of the head and neck can cause a whiplash injury.

"Incidentally," Dr. Boyle pointed out, "I recently read that a research councilof the U.S. Air Force demonstrated that the normal neck can withstand a forward snapping motion 50 times the force of gravity before a major injury occurs, but only a backward snapping of five times the force of gravity can be tolerated."

He also noted that the elasticity of the neck structures decreases with advancing age. Dr. Boyle stated, "The older the accident victim, the more likely he will be injured and disability occur.

"There are many complications of whiplash injuries. Strains, sprains, fractures, nerve injuries, muscle spasms, ruptured discs, nerve compression, brain and spinal cord injury and traumatic arthritis," Dr. Boyle added.

"If the accident victim has not received proper care and treatment following the injury," Dr. Boyle added, "all too frequently, an old whiplash injury comesback to haunt the person." "When I say there is a 'vital period' after a whiplash, I mean just that, It's the one and only golden opportunity to give proper care, treatment and correction."

When should you determine whether or not you have been injured in an automobile accident?

"At any time you experience a soreness or stiffness in your neck after an accident, you should consult a Doctor of Chiropractic. Chiropractic Physicians are specialists in spinal disorders and will advise you frankly and sincerely. Should you require medical care, they will refer you to an appropriate physician." Dr. Boyle said.

Are whiplash injuries real and how can you protect your rights.

"There are thousands of people killed in automobile related accidents each year, on the highways of this country, and at least ten times that number injured and/or severally injured." Mr. Vasilaros explained," and if a person finds themselves in this unfortunate and sometimes fatal scenario, the best way to protect their personal rights is knowing their state laws and understanding their insurance options.

Mr. Vasilaros added "that under Florida law if you have a \$2,000.00 personal injury protection deductible, the insurance company considers you "selfinsured" for any deductible, which means you cannot recover this from the party that injured you."

Mr. Vasilaros asked the audience "Did you know under Florida law drivers are not required to carry bodily injury coverage, and many drivers are driving with no insurance at all."

We see far too many people who are not able to seek compensation for injuries caused by another party because they do not have any insurance or the proper insurance." Mr. Vasilaros stated during his closing and offered the following suggestions when purchasing automobile insurance.

"Who are we serving?" asked Brender. "Can we cut into the county some more and then have an equitable way to divide it up among the cities?"

Lake Mary will receive 5.44 percent of the local option gas tax revenues for 2002; a .12 percent decrease from the year before.

"It's a reasonable thing to ask for, and it's prudent we do that," said Altamonte Springs Commissioner Steve Wolfram.

Altamonte Springs is sched-uled to receive 9.37 percent of the local option gas tax revenues for 2002; a .51 percent decrease from last year.

Longwood Commissioner Dan Anderson agreed "it's an odd way of distributing," but said he needed to be cautious that he's "not shooting his city in the foot."

Longwood will receive 2.84

percent of the tax proceeds in 2002; a .80 percent increase.

Other complaints about the local option gas tax, was it "boxed the cities in" by exclud-ing federal revenue sharing funds in the cities transportation expenditures.

"It was crafted pretty slick," said John Drago, Longwood city administrator. "When that [interlocal agreement] was done the county was probably the king of the roost and the cities weren't much and just signed into it."

Brender said the distribution formula should include population of the city. However, Anderson stated it was important that the distribution method not be cause competition between the cities. Both commissioners agreed addressing needs and especially regional needs like State Road 436 should be a goal of the distribution model.

According to Hall, the county

has pledged bonds toward the local gas tax option until October 2003. "We could not endanger an of our own debt service payments," she said.

This is not the first time the cities of Seminole have asked the county to change the distribution model of the gas tax, said Hall. In 1998, Hall prepared a series of charts outlining how the distribution system worked. According to those charts in 1998, if Seminole County was actually included in the five-year rolling average they would receive almost 75 percent of the proceeds.

The county has responsibility for a large number of roads," said Hall. "They really don't have any recourse. The Board of County Commissioners could amend it if only they wanted to."

This is not the first time a lottery prize has gone unclaimed. In fact, there have been 18 unclaimed jackpots totaling \$64.4 million since the Lottery began in 1968. The last time a ticket went unclaimed was the May 22, 1999, drawing, with an estimated jackpot of \$5.4 million. This could be the second time

a winning lottery ticket sold in Seminole County goes unclaimed. The first one was County goes sold in Senford and expired on Sept. 26, 1991. The estimated jackpot for that ticket was \$15.8 million.

The latest a Lotto ticket was claimed before the deadline was in October 1997. The winner cashed in his ticket just six days before the 180-day expiration date for an estimated \$8.2 million.

The Lottery has conducted three previous searches for miss-ing Mega Money winners; however, no winners came forward to claim their prize before the tickets expired.

By law, all unclaimed prize money must be returned to the

prize pool fund, which is used for future prize promotions or cash prizes for winners. The fund is now used to enhance the acratch-off prizes for winners.

Players who may have purchased lottery tickets at the Winn-Dixie are encouraged to check carefully the numbers on any old tickets they may still posses

The Lotto jackpot must be paid in 30 annual installments. The lump-sum cash option is only available if the ticket is claimed within 60 days after the winning drawing. If claimed, the winner will received approximately \$233,333 per year for the next 30 years.

The winning Lotto ticket must be presented at Lottery Headquarters in Tallahassee of one of 11 district offices before the 5 p.m. deadline on Oct. 18.


