## Denies Request To Delay Census

WASHINGTON (UPI) - The Supreme Court today refused a request by an immigration reform group to delay the 1980 census — scheduled to begin April 1 - unless illegal aliens are excluded from the official count.

The justices turned down a motion for an injunction by the Federation for American Immigration Reform: the Committee for Representative Government, a Los Angeles-based group, and 26 members of Congress.

They argued that including illegal aliens would "dilute" the population base The citizen groups and the politicians asked the Supreme Court to put off the census pending a full review of their claim that illegal aliens should be excluded from the official tally used for reapportionment and the allotment of federal funds to states.

In December, they filed suit in federal court, charging the Constitution requires counting legal residents, not illegal aliens. They asked for a separate count of

A three-judge federal court panel turned them down, ruling they did not have legal standing to challenge the census and failed to show they would be harmed by inclusion of illegal aliens in

## **Doctors Decide Shah** Too Weak For Surgery

PANAMA CITY, Panama (UPI) - A team of physicians headed by American heart specialist Dr. Michael DeBakey says the ailing shah of Iran is too weak for spleen surgery, and the ousted monarch slipped out of Panama's most exclusive hospital and flew back to his island exile.

But a source close to the physicians who examined the shah said the deposed Iranian leader could return to Paitilla Hospital for the surgery in about three weeks if he regains his strength in the seclusion of his home in exile on Contadora Island.

Despite a hacking cough, Shah Mohammed Reza Pahlavi, 60, accompanied by his wife, Farah, and his bodyguards, Sunday ducked out of a back entrance to the hospital where he had undergone three days of tests for an enlarged spleen.

Spokesmen for the shah declined to say when he might undergo the surgery. But the source close to the Panamanian physicians said the surgery could be performed in three weeks.

"The operation is necessary, but there was no hurry to perform it," the source, who asked not to be identified said. The source also said the shah still had a cold that he caught about two weeks ago.

### **Bodies In Frozen Moat**

WARSAW, Poland (UPI) - Amid a tangle of cranes and tubing, rescuers pumped water from the frozen moat of an old Czarist fortress today in an effort to retrieve the bodies of about 43 of the 87 people killed in the crash of a Polish airliner.



## Remembering The Refugees

Six months ago, Americans could hardly open a newspaper or switch on a television news program without a vivid reminder of the dramatic exodus of boat-borne refugees from Vietnam. But that was before starvation overtook Cambodia. Iranian militants seized the U.S. Embassy in Tehran, and the Soviet Union invaded

So, at the moment, the boat people are out of sight if not out of mind. We shouldn't let it happen. Granted, the refugee flow from Vietnam is nothing like the floodtide levels reached last May and June. In those two months alone, more than 100,000 refugees escaped or were expelled from Vietnam. Already crowded refugee camps in and strangest — is the battle now going on Thailand, Malaysia, Indonesia, the Phillipines between two Republicans in a basically rural and Hong Kong overflowed with homeless district in central Illinois.

According to the Lundberg Letter, a weekly survey of the petroleum industry, drivers used 11 percent less gasoline over the last three months and deliveries to wholesalers and service stations this month will be 4.5 percent higher than in

The survey doubts that gasoline prices will fall but suggests the rate of price increase will slow

Most U.S. motorists can take credit for the reduced use of fuel. Whether through patriotism or resistance to higher prices, drivers are cutting down on mileage — making one trip perform several tasks and foregoing pleasure outings.






