New Housing For Poor Produced By Churches

NEW YORK (AP) — On a beam of light from American churches are producing new housing for the poor, the elderly and other needy people. And it can be done without costing members a dime.

Under the National Housing Act, the Federal Housing Administration will insure loans covering 100 per cent of costs of such locally sponsored non-profit housing, if, as Dr. Vanderbeck notes, it soundly carried out.

Dr. Vanderbeck, trained in business administration in college before entering the ministry, later spent three years working for a mortgage company to learn the ropes of housing finance, planning and management.

As to why churches should be in the business, he said that Jesus' mission involved "taking care of physical as well as spiritual needs, and backing up teaching with deeds."

"One of the greatest needs of people today is housing, and if the church is to meet their needs, it must begin with that prime need," he said. "Some of the deepest spiritual problems grow out of slum housing. Whether a person feels that life is worth living often depends on what he lives in."

He said the service agency took part not just in helping get housing built, but in its continuing operation, in providing family and job counseling and in arranging day-care centers and other social services.

"We care what happens to people," he said.

Let us consider the words from the lips of Jesus, as they are recorded for us by one of His Disciples, John, (8:24) "Verily, verily, I say unto you, He that heareth my word, and believeth on him that sent me, hath everlasting life, and shall not come into condemnation; but is passed from death unto life."

"Hearth my word..." What a wonderful privilege is this. We give thanks that we can hear the Word of God and enjoy the freedom that is ours in this great world by God. We are able to build our faith through the Word as the Apostle Paul has said in his Roman Letter, (10:17) "The faith cometh by hearing and hearing by the Word of God."

"Him that sent me..." "Him" just who do we mean? Our Father? Our God? Our Heavenly Father? Our Creator? Our Sustainer? Because of His love for the likes of you and me, He sent His only begotten Son into the world that we might be saved. "For God sent not His Son into the world to condemn the world; but that the world through Him might be saved." (John 3:17).

"Hath everlasting life..." This part of our verse of scripture speaks to us of the most wonderful truth that mortal man can ever expect to hear. It is so wonderful that we have difficulty in fathoming the true meaning and impact that it has or can have on our earthly as well as our spiritual lives. John gives additional emphasis to this when he says: "He that believeth on the Son hath everlasting life."

Here, dear readers, is another wonderful promise embodied in our verse of scripture. "shall not come into condemnation..." But now some may say: "How do we know that this promise will not be broken?" We may have had the misfortune, or a string of bad luck that man's word has not always been true, that earnest promises and vows have broken.

Listen again to the words of Paul; Romans 8:1 as he tells us that this promise cannot be broken. "There is therefore now no condemnation to them that are in Christ Jesus, who walk not after the flesh, but after the Spirit."

"But is passed from death unto life..." How utterly ridiculous you may say, "How can anyone that is dead live again?" Here we would be forced to ask several questions that in a sense really really be the answers which we seek. "Jesus has told us through His word, and we know that He is true, that He is God, that He is Lord and Savior, in that moment that this repentant sinner places his or her life in the hands of God through His Son; in that moment, this person passes from the state of spiritual death into eternal and on into everlasting life."

What a wonderful day this will be for those that come to accept Christ, when they hear Him say: "Well done thou good and faithful servant... enter thou into the joys of thy lord." (Matt. 20:21).

What we have accepted Him and serve Him, have experienced this joy. We find comfort in the frankness of God's word, written by Paul. He speaks to us that have reached out to our Lord, Lord Jesus, and we know that He is true, that He is God, that He is Lord and Savior, in that moment that this repentant sinner places his or her life in the hands of God through His Son; in that moment, this person passes from the state of spiritual death into eternal and on into everlasting life."

"Oh! The wonder of it all!" God help us to understand, to believe, in fact, to react in such a way that it will be to Thy Honor and Glory, Amen.

Askew: Our Schools Are Threatened

Shed 'Emotions Of The Hour' And Accept Temporary Busing

School doors swung open in 42 Florida counties today amid mounting protests over court-ordered busing that Gov. Reubin Askew said threatened the future of the state's 1.6 million student public school system.

"Artificial and inadequate instrument of change," but said it was necessary to "put an end to segregation in our society." Thousands of children in Florida will be bused this fall under federal court orders designed to halt segregation in schools.

An independent presidential candidate in 1968, Wallace challenged President Nixon to stop cross busing by executive order and warned "trifling with our children" will be the major issue in 1972.

'Looking At The Whole Picture' Air Firm 'Lukewarm' To Sanford

Reports are current today that a Miami-based air transport firm being mentioned as a second fixed base operator at Sanford Airport may not be interested in establishing operations here.

Modern Air Transport, Inc., was given the opportunity by the City Commission to present its proposals for operating a facility at the airport but thus far there has been no positive indication, according to city officials, that the firm wants to become the second such airport facility.

Page Airways, Inc. is the first and only FBO at Sanford Airport since property was deeded to the city by the federal government after it ceased being a Naval air station.

rier, has been leased to Glenn-Air, the air facility owned by Glenn Turner, KOSCOY Interplanetary founder, Orlando.

J. S. (Red) Cleveland, airport manager, said today Glenn-Air has leased the 4,000-square-foot building as an operational office for nine planes to be located here. In conjunction with the lease was a subletting portion of Page Airways hangar 4 by Glenn-Air, Cleveland added.

He said Modern Air representatives visited Sanford twice in earlier presentations to the City Commission, Modern Air ground service manager A. Fennell requested 8,000 square feet of terminal space and fueling facilities.

Lakefront High-Rise Is Planned

First move toward what is hoped will be a renovation of the entire Sanford downtown area started with the revelation from Howard Hodges, Greater Sanford Chamber of Commerce bankers committee chairman, that a preliminary floor plan for a seven-story, 135-unit apartment building has been submitted to a contractor for cost estimates.

Hodges said the proposed high-rise project would be financed by local persons provided reports on costs and projected revenue are "in line."

Actual site of the apartment is still to be determined. Two possible locations are the 14.5 acres now mentioned as a site to relocate the Sanford Zoo, at the intersection of French Avenue and Seminole Boulevard, and the other is along Hwy. 17-92 west toward I-4.

The apartment project would be included in the overall development plan for the city area bounded by French Avenue, Seminole Boulevard, First Street and Hood Avenue.

Interfaced in this city's "recycling" plan as outlined by Sanford architects Gutmann, Dragash and Matz are high-rises, town houses, museums, an amphitheater, shops and parking areas.

Because of the involvement in the rejuvenation plan, the bankers invited officials with Frizell and Vickery, architects and planners of Orlando, to show slides and explain how other cities, notably Tampa and Bradenton, had gone about accomplishing the work.

Richard Vickery and Richard Ostrander, Vickery officials, showed slides and explained work done at Tampa's River Park and Bradenton's complex to the Chamber group and members of Sanford Seminole Development Company.

Richard Matz, of the Sanford architectural firm, booked a July 23 session with the bankers that goals needed to accomplish the planned renovation of the city's downtown included developing a solid tax base, attractive town center to encourage people to come into the area, development of cultural activities and establishment of a fervor of civic pride.

Matz also emphasized that total control of the overall plan is needed to prevent the change-

Alcohol Studies Opened

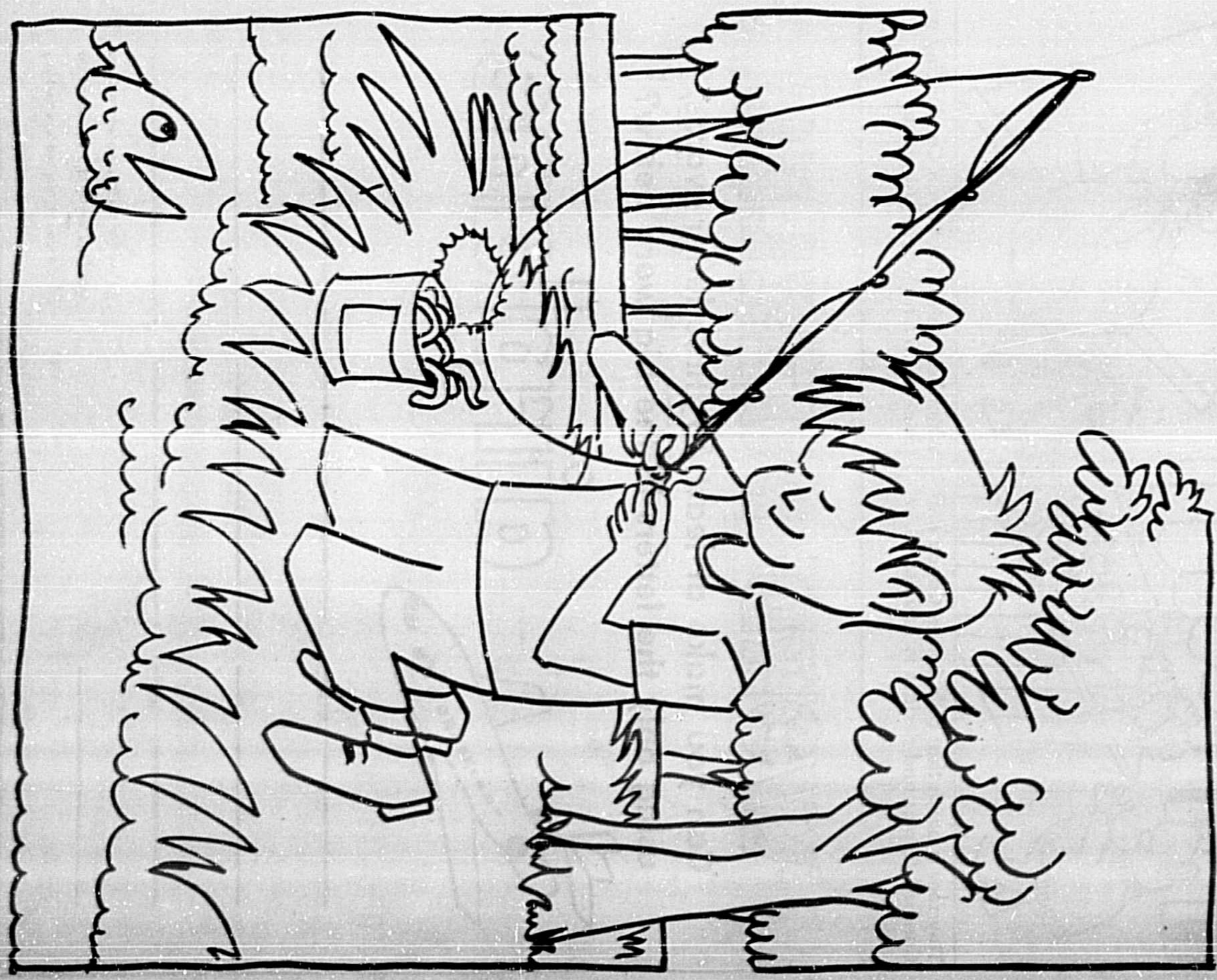
The 225 students attending the Florida School of Alcohol Studies were told this morning that "treatment alone will not eradicate the problem of addiction in our society." The session is at Florida Technological University.

Karl Balder, industrial consultant, Bureau of Alcohol Rehabilitation, said, "Prevention, although not effective at present, is our key to success."

Balder added that effective prevention will only occur when society develops a more responsible value system on the use of alcohol.

It was reported that the National Institute on Alcohol Abuse and Alcoholism in Washington will launch a mass media campaign in a few months urging more responsible drinking practices.

The federal campaign will include the slogan, "If you need a drink to be social, that's not social drinking." Balder said, "We need intelligent drinkers who drink intelligently."
