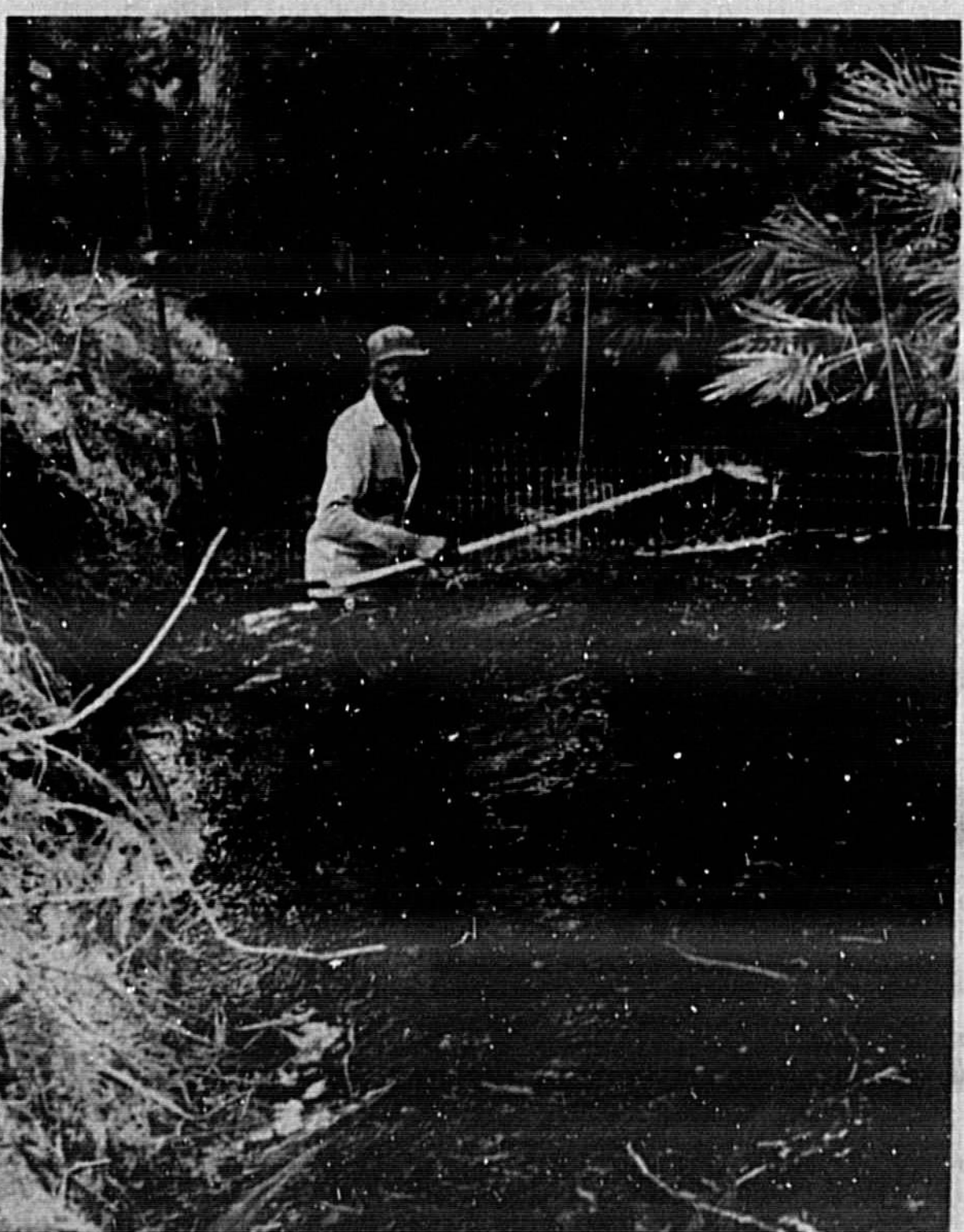

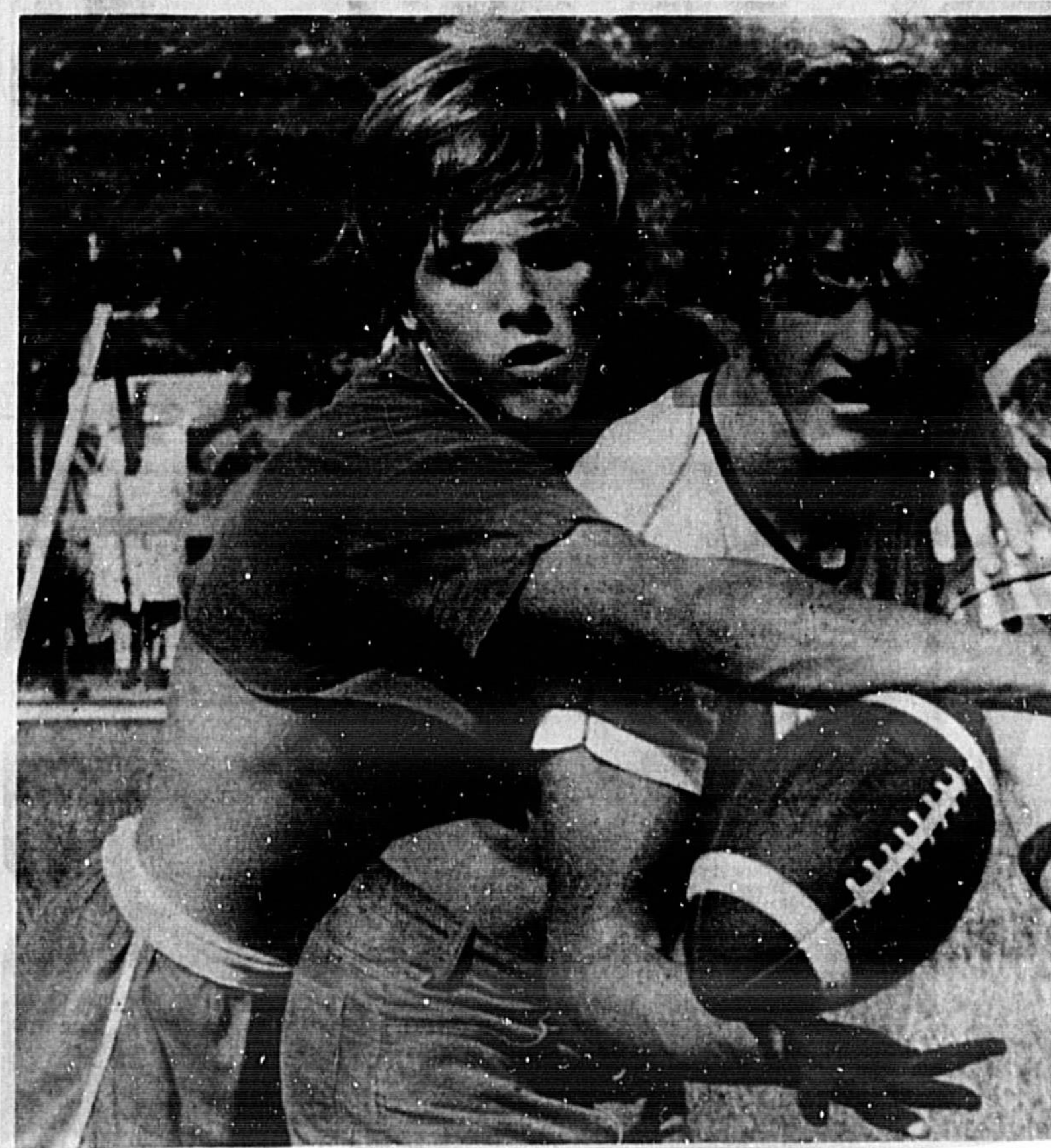

Polly's Pointers

DEAR POLLY — Those who find it difficult to locate an envelope for remailing large pieces of mail such as award certificates can use the envelope the document came in. Open the three closed sides with a letter opener, turn inside-out and tape the sides. This does the job, and no more searching! — B.L.

DEAR POLLY — My Pointer is for those who are safety conscious: Take a three- or four-inch piece of material from anything you are sewing. Try to burn it over the sink, or other safe place to test for flammability. Harris: Schools Need 8 Mills

Additional demands placed on the school system next year, Harris said, include unemployment compensation, new educational programs, an increase in the cost of the retirement program and additional money budgeted for collective bargaining.

The state could have met these demands, Harris noted, by increasing the amount of money paid the county for each student who attends classes.

Instead, the legislature left the funding at last year's level — \$745 per student attending fulltime at a Seminole school. The budget is split into four parts, with the proposed operating budget claiming the lion's share of funds. Harris' proposal for operating is \$39,320,412.50, up \$4 million from last year's budget.

"Those pay increases had a lot to do with that," Harris said. The increases won by the Seminole Education Association (SEA) will cost taxpayers \$1.8 million year, Harris said.

The total 1975-76 budget is smaller than last year's \$52,049,215.64 budget because less funds are requested for capital improvements.

In fact, about \$7-million less will be needed next year because of the fall-off in the need for new school buildings.

The other two parts of the budget proposal — debt service and federal budget — experiences no major changes either up or down. Debt service requests are for \$3,207,817.25 and the federal budget is \$800,692.84.

The federal budget will increase as money comes in during the year for projects backed by federal funds.

Though the state has set 6.2 mills as the required local effort needed for state funding, both Harris and Laver say to maintain existing services the full eight mills will be a necessity.

The local effort is the amount of money produced by local taxes needed to qualify for the state's funding program. The state pays \$175 for each full-time student in the county.

Laver claims, in effect, taxes will be reduced by 33 and one-third per cent because of the board's elimination this year of a special four-mill construction levy.

Last year, citizens paid the full eight-mills required by law, plus the special four-mill levy for construction. But a declining population has erased the need for any new schools.

The first hearing on Harris' budget proposal will be 2 p.m., Aug. 26, at the board's conference room. A second work session will be held the same time the following day.

Pilot Drainage Study May Lead To Total Storm System

A pilot drainage study in the Midway area, east of Sanford, could lead to a total storm drainage system for the "disadvantaged community," according to Bill Bush, Seminole County engineer.

County Commission Tuesday at 7 p.m. will consider an application for \$120,000 of federal money for funding the Midway drainage project. The money is allocated under the Community Development Block Grant provided by the Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD).

If the money is approved, Bush said, an "innovative" storm drainage system will be installed in a two-block area of the one-mile square district for the experiment.

The system will utilize 12-18 inch perforated pipe and specially designed inlets to provide an underground system to hold ground water beneath the drain between rains and also to serve as a storm sewer when it rains.

"This may be the answer to the woes of the saturated community," Bush said. He said the project will also be monitored for water pollution.

Bush pointed out, however, that if the \$120,000 is approved it would only provide funds for the pilot project and not for an entire drainage system.

If the pilot program is a success Bush said it "would give the county a weapon to seek more federal money."

County Planner Bill Kercher said the area has some "poor structures" and a "bad drainage problem." He called the pilot program "relatively inexpensive."

Murder Trial Delayed

Circuit Court Judge J. William Woodson ordered the trial rescheduled for the week of Sept. 16 because the prosecutor, Assistant State Atty. James Figgart, was unable to appear in court. Figgart is wearing a cast after breaking his leg while roller skating.

Last month the Kiley trial was delayed due to the death of a firearms examiner who was to testify in the case.

Pay Hikes, Expanded Force Urged By Lake Mary Police Commissioner

In discussions prior to the detailed examination of Mayor Walter Sorenson's proposed budget, which included various department requests, the council considered reassessing and reevaluating job descriptions.

Councilman Martin Bacon Sr. said he would like to see concerted efforts in street paving and street light installations in addition to beefing up the police department.

Perinchieff, at a budget workshop Saturday, told colleagues a five-member police force would give the city 24-hour per day coverage in law enforcement and the pay raises are necessary to reduce police personnel turnover.

"It is unreasonable to believe Lake Mary is going to keep its police officers when they can find better benefits elsewhere," he said. He recommended present officers' salaries be raised by \$300 annually at the beginning of the new fiscal year (Oct. 1) and be hiked by another \$300 when the individual patrolmen complete their one year probation periods.

"We have no coverage when men go on vacation now," Perinchieff said. "Currently men are contributing overtime."

On the much-discussed possibility of setting up a police dispatch program, Perinchieff received fellow council members' approval to speak with Winter Springs officials about a cooperative dispatch system.

Modular Firm Awaits Word On Jail Cells For County

A modular construction firm, with the capabilities of building six jail cells per day, is sitting in "limbo" while the County Commission decides what to do about the Seminole County Jail, the administrator of the Seminole County Port Authority (SCOPA) said today.

Administrator Jim Ryan will explain to the SCOPA board tonight at eight o'clock "why they (Standard Systems) are not doing anything."

Officials with Standard Systems could not be reached for comment. The port and firm have entered into a lease agreement with the un-determined firm would manufacture concrete modular units.

The units originally were to be used for nursing home rooms, according to Ryan. But, Ryan says the firm is holding off on building the nursing homes, pending action by the County Commission for construction of units to be used as jail cells.

Seminole County Commission Chairman Sid Viben Jr., could not be reached for comment today.

"They're playing a waiting game," Ryan said, "if the county doesn't return the jail cells soon, the company will request to the original plan of nursing home rooms."

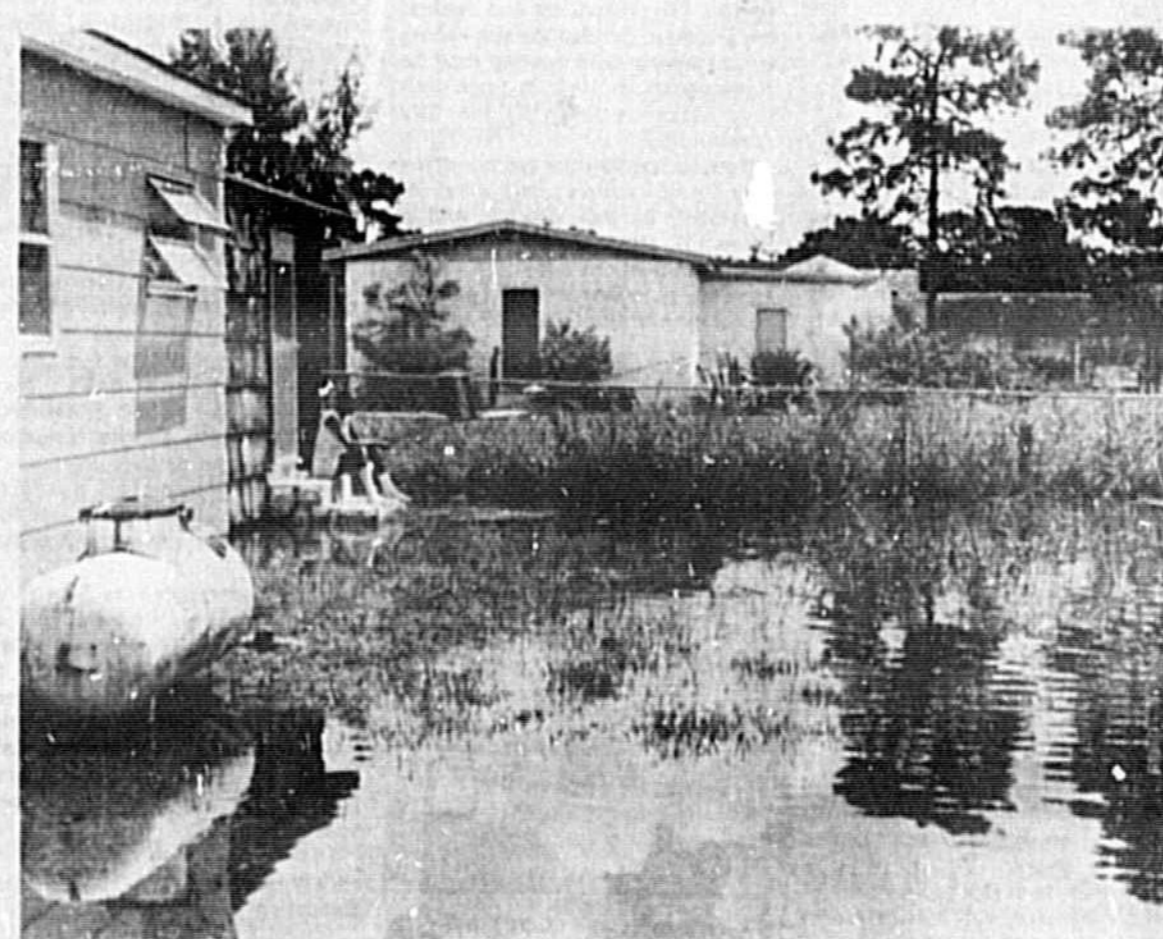
Meanwhile, state officials have approved a minimum safety plan for returning prisoners to the county jail if a new jail is built within two years.

The County Commission reportedly is looking into possible funding of \$600,000 in the 1975-76 budget for providing a jail facility.

"We have the ability to provide a jail cell for no capital outlay to the county," Ryan said. "If the problem is financial we can solve it. If it is time we can solve that, too."

Ryan said the port and Standard Systems would need a lease from the county with the assurance that the cells would be used, once constructed.

"Imagine the units could be used for cells," said George Proudfoot, jail administrator. "But we need an architect to work the cell into the rest of a facility."
