## **British Embassy Stormed**

## Khomeini Levels Warning At U.S.

TEHRAN, Iran (UPI) — Moslem students held dozens of Americans hostage inside the U.S. Embassy today demanding that the United States hand over the shah. Other students stormed the British Embassy in an ap-

parent attempt to take control. Khomeini warned the United States of "another course of action" if the shah was not handed over to Iran for Islamic justice and the ayatollah's son entered the U.S. Embassy today to wild cheering from the occupying

> Students sympathetic to the Tehran invaders also seized U.S. consulates in Shiraz and Tabriz, in northwestern Iran, that were closed after the shah's regime was verthrown last February.

In Tehran hundreds of Moslem students holding at least 59 Americans seized during a takeover of the U.S Embassy Sunday vowed today to occupy the compound until the United States returns the deposed Shah Mohammed Reza Pahlavi, now in a New York hospital where he is being treated for cancer.

Witnesses said about 50 students moved into the British

Khomeini also denounced Britain in his speech to insurance company employees in an audience in the Moslem holy city of Qom. He said Britain must hand over to Iran the shah's last premier, Bakhtiar. But a British Embassy spokesman

said Bakhtiar was not in Britain. "If they do not hand over these traitors or at least expel them from their country," Khomeini said in a reference to the exiled shah and Bakhtiar, "we shall have another course of action." Less than four hours after Khomeini made his demand,

Iranian students moved into the British Embassy in Witnesses said about 40 armed government guardsmen

had entered the British embassy premises and were negotiating with the students.

would cut off crude oil supplies to the United States if ordered to do so by Khomeini, the state radio reported. The fate of a group of American and Iranian hostages held for the second day in the U.S. Embassy, including at least 59 U.S. citizens, was unknown. The students, who

seized the building in a battle with Marine guards, vowed not to surrender until the shah is returned to Iran. Ahmad Khomeini, the 46-year-old son of the ayatollah. swept into the embassy amid wild cheering by the more than 10,000 demonstrators and students, many of them teen-age girls wearing the black anklelength veil.

In Qom, the Islamic Religious School threw its "full support" behind the students, telling them, "You have not occupied this place but, rather, you have recaptured it

Khomeini also gave tacit approval to the embassy takeover, calling the compound "a center of spying and plotting." The demonstrators burned an American flag, the second since Sunday's takeover, as they chanted,



### James Earl Ray Captured In Prison Escape Attempt

PETROS, Tenn. (UPI) - James Earl Ray, convicted assassin of Dr. Martin Luther King Jr., made an unsuccessful attempt today to escape from Brushy Mountain State Prison in East Tennessee. Ray, 51, is serving a 99-year term at the maximum security prison near Knoxville for the King slaying on April 4, 1968 in Memphis. Ray escaped from the Brushy Mountain prison in June, 1977 but was recaptured 54 hours later.

WASHINGTON (UPI) - Alternate forms of energy synfuels - represent at least a partial answer to America's

future energy needs. But a bitter and perhaps prolonged debate is anticipated as the Senate tries to decide how much government money should be spent to develop the new energy forms, and how it should be distributed.

The Senate was to take up the problem today and debate it all week if necessary. The Energy Committee, chaired by Sen. Henry Jackson, D-Wash., supports a bill to provide \$20 billion in purchase guarantees, loan guarantees and loans, and another \$68 billion after three years if the program looks successful. But the Banking Committee, headed by Sen. William Proxmire, D-Wis., prefers a bill that would provide between \$3

billion and \$9 billion for synfuel plants, but more than \$11 billion — far higher than the Energy Committee proposes —

## ... Professor Works On Waste Disposal

ist claims he has discovered a way to overcome the bigge unresolved problem of nuclear energy - the disposal of dangerous radioactive wastes. Dr. Radha R. Roy said Sunday he has discovered a way to render the wastes harmless in a matter of weeks instead of

the thousands of years it takes naturally for them to lose their Roy's theory has yet to be demonstrated. He said all of the necessary theoretical and quantum elec-

trodynamical work on the process has been completed. But, he said, it will take as much as a year to prepare data needed for the engineering design of a pilot radioactive waste The process, Roy said, "very roughly can be described in

part as a reversal of phenomena that occur during a nuclear fission chain reaction. "Theoretical analysis and mathematical calculations con-

harmless state in a short period of time." The method "can cancel radioactivity rapidly enough for it to be of real, practical value in disposing of dangerous wastes in storage and as they are being produced," Roy said.

reduce the radioactivity of even the most dangerous wastes with half-lives of 15,000 to 40,000 years to a level where they would be essentially harmless in about 20 days. A half-life is the time required for a quantity of radioactive material to lose one-half of its radioactive strength.

Roy, 56, a professor of nuclear physics, said he discovered the method after two years of summer, evening and spare-"I've been working in the field 30 years and the question of

nuclear waste always disturbed me," Roy said. "I thought

we had no right to leave waste to future generations.

Roy, a native of India, is the designer and former director of nuclear physics research facilities at the University c Brussels in Belgium and at Pennsylvania State University Roy, who said there are at least 75 million gallons of dangerous nuclear wastes in the United States, estimated it could cost at least \$40 million to build an operational nuclear waste treatment plant.

for generations yet to come."

So far the government has found no permanent solution to atomic waste disposal even though the nuclear age is mor than three decades old.

There have been proposals ranging from shooting wastes into space to dumping it in the ocean depths, but the only ones that have received serious attention involve burying wastes in solid granite or deep in underground salt formations. The government is now seriously examining a number of potential waste disposal sites across the nation and plans to run a test of waste burial in a salt formation in New Mexico.

## The Inflexible Menachem Begin

A series of unsettling developments for Israel's government recently proved once more than the Middle East, although not again at the boiling point, never ceases for long to be a bubbling stewpot of trouble.

Prime Minister Menchem Begin's torturous week started with huge street demonstrations in Tel Aviv protesting the government's policies on the occupied West Bank.

Less than 24 hours later, Foreign Minister Moshe Dayan resigned his post in an open break with the prime minister over the West Bank and the question of Palestinian autonomy.

The next day, in jackhammer fashion, Israel's supreme court struck another blow against the Begin government. It ruled out the controversial Elon Moreh settlement on seized Arab land in the West Bank, which seizure the government had subsequently endorsed for security reasons. The prime minister was instructed to dismantle and abandon the settlement within 30 days, and he has agreed to do so.

opposition Labor Party to demand new elections and the Begin administration found itself battling against five no-confidence motions in the Knesset. Though as always, Mr. Begin rode out the troubles and defiantly advised Israel and the world that he saw no reason to change his policies. He was never intimidated by a hot kitchen. Nevertheless, despite his unflappable response, the prime minister must be sobered by the grim prospects he faces at every turn, and by the certain requirement to chart some new policy directions for his beleaguered little country. Meanwhile, he must marvel at how simple life must be for his Arab adversaries, who are untroubled by messy

The unanimous court decision on Elon Moreh at least relieves the Begin government from any further agonizing over forcible Jewish settlements faction, Oush Emunim, which has agitated for the settlements. Mr. Begin may even secretly count this ruling a blessing in disguise.

But the Dayan resignation is another matter, focusing as it does on the wholly unresolved question of Israel's future relationship with the Arab population in the occupied territories.

Mr. Dayan resigned partly in protest over Elon Moreh but mostly because he had been frozen out of the current negotiations with Egypt and the United States on Palestine autonomy on the West Bank and Gaza. The inflexible Mr. Begin simply regarded Mr. Dayan as being too flexible. But now, the prime minister is discovering that Moshe Dayan's absence is far more troublesome than was

Mr. Dayan grew up with the Arabs, spoke Arabic like one of them, and understood them perhaps tetter than any other high Israeli official. And his understanding was reciprocated by the Arabs with respect. Mr. Dayan's departure has created a vacuum that Mr. Begin will be hard put to fill.

Indeed, the refusal of Daputy Prime Minister Vigael Yadin to be the next foreign minister has brought Mr. Begin's coaltion government under

Half the year's negotiation time has already clapsed with little or no progress having teen made.
