But Dr. Carlo Savini of New York reports to the Medical Record that in many cases very minute sharp foreign bodies are found in that organ and, in some cases at least, were probably the cause of the initial lesion. Doctor Bavini has recovered from appendices microscopic particles which prove on chemical analysis to be slivers of coal containing a small quantity of iron, sometimes with very sharp cutting edges.
