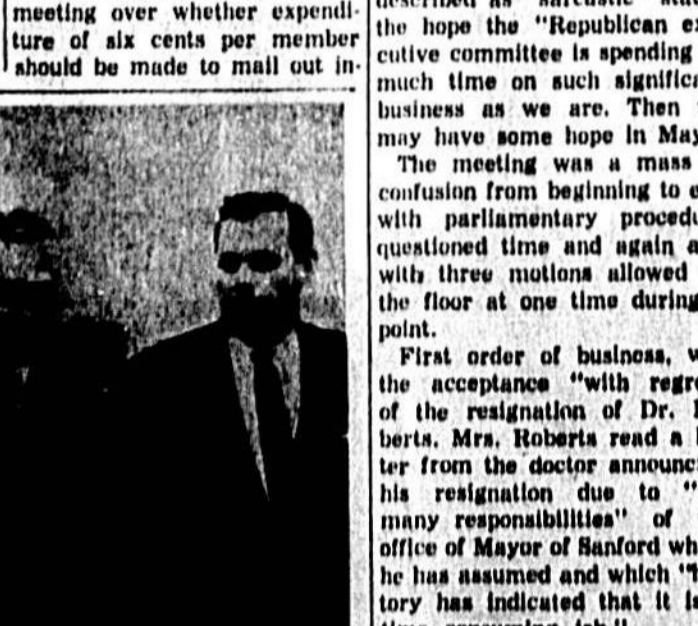

#### New Law May Up Farm Wages

Starting February 1967, farms using 500 or more man-hours of hired help in a peak quarter had to pay workers a minimum of one dollar an hour. Directly, only about 300,000-400,000 workers on farms will be affected. However, the indirect influence of the legislation is much more persuasive.

The new wage law may tend to raise wages rates for many other farmworkers. This coming February, the minimum wage rates go up to \$1.18 an hour. The following year it jumps to \$1.30 an hour. The United States Department of Agriculture reports that about one-third of the farmworkers covered by the rate will be migratory labor. Economists note that higher wages should help attract more dependable, skillful people. With relatively full employment and rising non-farm wage levels, farmers will tend to be affected. Higher wages will tend to increase the importance of farm-to-farm competition in the labor market.

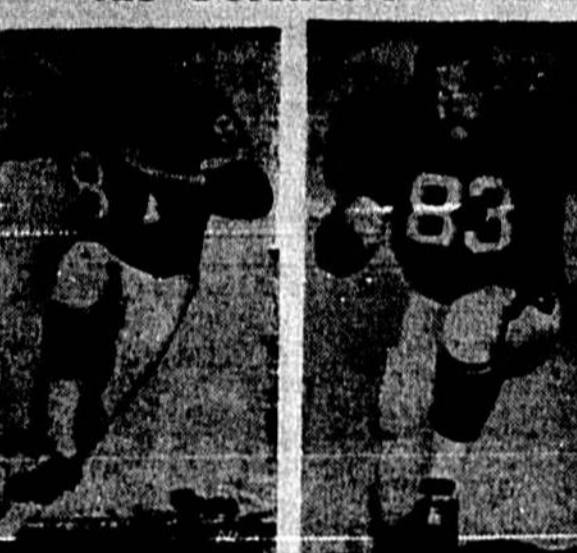

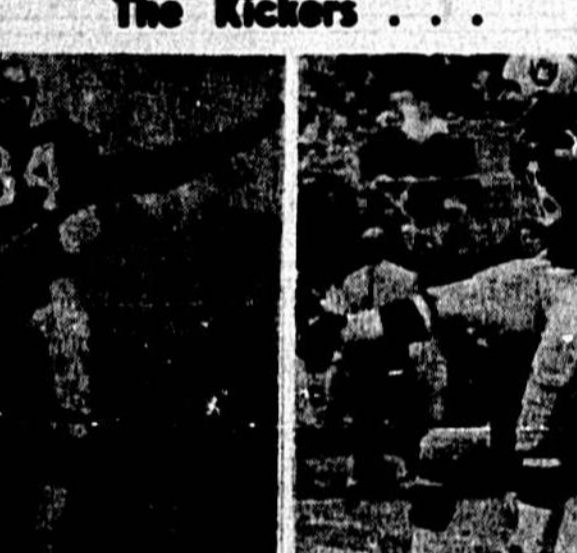

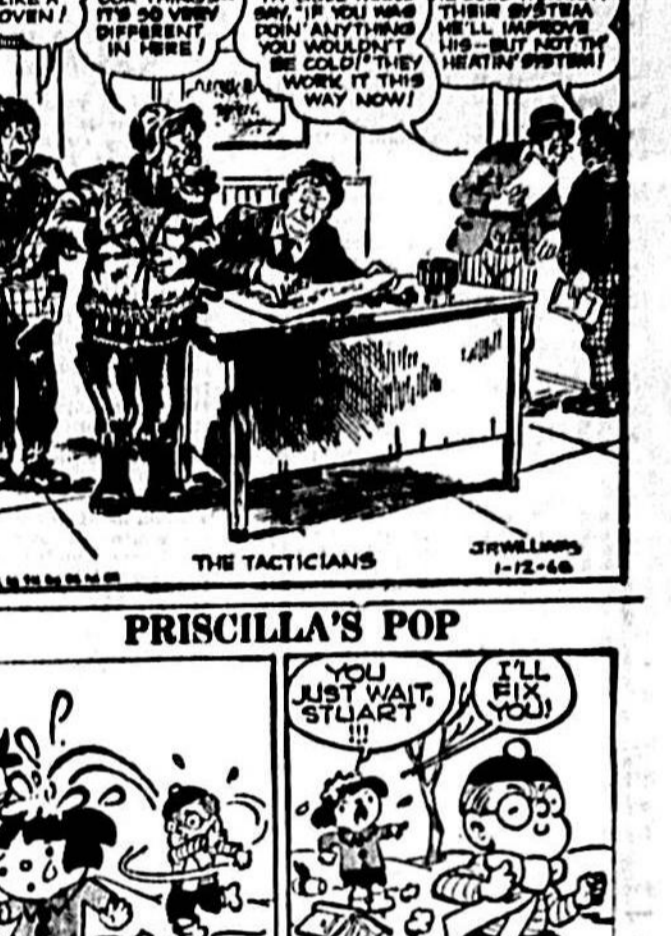
