Divers Discover Columbus' Ship?

year-old tax report recently found in Spain suggests the sunken Columbus' first expedition to the New World in 1492. The ship, resting in 30 feet of water, was discovered in 1977 by Frick and Gasque while searching off the Caicos Bank for

In documenting the wreck, Frick and Gasque have relied on two experts, Mendel Peterson, former director of underwater archeology for the Smithsonian Institute, and Dr. Eugene Lyon, a Florida historian who specializes in research at Spain's Archives of the Indies in Seville.

Peterson said he has "found nothing which would contradict" the treasure hunters' theory that the sunken ship is the Pinta. He said a heavy iron cannon, a lighter swivel gun and a single lead cannon ball removed from the wreck are consistent with the period. "Nothing is precisely datable, but nothing I saw could no

Rescuers Plow Quake Rubbl

Al-ASNAM, Algeria (UPI) — Rescuers pushed away rubble with bulldozers and bare hands today in a hunt for survivors in the earthquake-flattened city of Al-'Assam, but government officials said the death toll already has passed 20,000.

"We still do not know the scale of this disaster," a

doctor of the Algerian Red Crescent, the equivalent of the Red Cross, said of the killer quake that reduced the town to rubble in about 30 seconds Friday. · About two dozen people, including a 2-month-old baby, were plucked alive from the ruins of the city Sunday, but several hundred other victims dug out with bulldozers and earthmovers were already dead,

City Gains Flood Insurance

reach more than 140,000.

The City of Sanford is one of three cities in the Southeast which has been determined eligible for additional floor nsurance coverage under the National Flood Insurance

Frank Newton, director of the National Flood Insurance Program for the sotheast region said, "The full limits of flood insurance coverage are now available to any property owner within this municipality. Coverage available on a single-family residential structure has now been increased from a maximum of \$35,000 under the emergency program to a maximum of \$185,000 under regular program status."

Similar increases for other types of structures and contents are also available," he added. "Tenants may also obtain additional coverage for their personal property against flood loss.

"Flood insurance may now be written by any licensed property and casualty insurance agent in Florida on property in Sanford," Newton said. The acceptance of Sanford into the regular phase of the National Flood Insurance Program is a result of a recently completed floor insurance study by the Federal Emergency Management Agency and subsequent adoption by the city of Sanford of flood-plane management regulations.



When the smouldering quarrel between Iraq and Iran exploded into all-out war three weeks ago, there was a widespread assumption that Iraq would make quick work of Iran's forces demoralized and decimated by revolution. That the fighting would soon end was a welcomed given among anxious foreign ministries around the

But, as everyone should have known from history, wars are easier to start than to end. The Iraqi-Iranian struggle now seems certain to be protracted. This is the supremely dangerous fact to be fully comprehended now because a lingering war in the Middle East is, literally, like a lingering fire in an oil-storage depot. It can spread any minute into an all-consuming explosion. The longer it lasts, the greater the danger.

Pine Acres Senior Center Denied Increase In Rooms

The Seminole County Commission has unanimously upheld its Board of Adjustment in denying permission to expand the Pine Acres Golden Age Center convalescent home at 5030 Cub Drive in Seminole County. Lloyd Morris, owner of the convalescent center, had applied to increase the number of guest accomodations from 14 to up to 50, said Seminole County Land Development Administrator Herb Harden. The commissioners denied the appeal, he said, to maintain the residential nature of the neighborhood and prevent increased traffic.

Home Appeal Granted

The commission has unanimously overturned the Board of Adjustment and granted the appeal of Thomas Alan Rhodes for special permission to park a mobile home on one lot of the Holiday Ranch development off Osceola Road, one quarter mile east of Mullet Lake Park Road.

The commission has voted 4-1 to overturn the Board of Adjustment and granted special permission to Carrol Stein to park a mobile home on portions of two lots at McNeil's Orange Villa on the south side of McNeil Road, one quarter mile east of Bear Lake Road. Commission Chairman Bill Kirchhoff voted against overturning the Board of Adjustment

Lot Size Variance Denied The commission has unanimously upheld the Board of Adjustment in denying a lot size variance from 11,700 square feet to 10,500 square feet and a lot width variance from 90 feet to 75 feet to create two building sites on three 50-by-140-foot lots owned by Ossielee Joseph Mullis in Sanlando Springs. The lots are on the north side of Citrus Street between Interstate 4 and Raymond Avenue.

'Feeder' Rule Clarified

The commission has clarified its Land Development Code which requires underground power lines in new subtlivisions but provides that "feeder lines are not required to be located beneath the surface of the

Department of County Development Director John Percy said discussions with Florida-Power indicate the classification of "feeder" lines includes a broad range of sizes of power lines. The board stipulated, therefore, that lines along all local roads would need to be below ground, Percy said.

Local roads are defined as those below "collector" Percy said his department is to report to the board every 30 days on how the new policy is working and if it works well it will later become a formal amendment to

the Land Development Code. New County Roads Added

The Seminole County Commission has unanimously agreed to release sidewalk performance bonds for Howell Estates because the Land Development Code no longer requires such bonds. The commission also voted to accept Ferne Drive and Beasley Street into the County Road System. Ferne Drive was accepted for class "C" maintenance, which means it will receive upkeep work on an emergency basis.

An amendment to the Seminole County Land Development Code providing fees be set by resolution has been approved unanimously by the Seminole County Commission. State Levies New Fines For Drivers Over Limits

TALLAHASSEE - Effective this month, drivers exceeding Florida's 55 mph speed limit by more than 10 mph must pay larger fines, said the Florida Highway Patrol. Drivers exceeding the 55 mph speed limit by driving from 66 to 79 mph must pay an additional \$25. Those drivers exceeding the 55 speed limit by driving 80 mph or more must pay an additional \$50 to the basic \$25 normal speeding fine. "In other words," said Col. Eldrige Beach, patrol director, "driving 56 to 65 mph costs speeders \$25, driving 66 to 79 mph costs \$50 and driving over 80 mph costs \$75. Speeders charged with speeding in excess of 25 mph over the speed limit must appear in person before the court." The surcharge must be paid by all drivers cited for exceeding the 55 mph speed limit by more than 10 mph, whether
