Will Use Wirele At Sheffield Work In Melting Metals

announced, "and these are of special use in the manufacture of certain nickel alloys," Further, it was explained that a 200 volt direct current is passed into the valves, which converts it

into the alternating current of extremely high frequency - much higher, in fact, than can be obtained from a mechanical generator of alternating current. This current is passed through the metal, which may be said to melt it-"The melting metal," Dr. Desch



The disease is first evident from the appearance of small brown or " blackish spots on the older leaves, usually near the edges. Under invocable conditions the whole leaf Appeal (499.7) silent. stated. If a seedling is attacked in this way, it is soon killed; and if this rot begins within a head of lettuce, it will result in total loss. Bacteria cause this disease, which to control requires stringent eforts beginning at the seed, says Mr. Weber, Any little plant that shows symptoms of the disease should be destroyed immediately: do not let this plant be transplant-
