## Keeping Up Your Resistance

According to Dr. Leona Baumgartner, director of the Bureau of Child Hygiene of the New York City Department of Health, respiratory diseases, such as colds, flu, grippe and so forth, are responsible for more lost working days than any other kind of illness. And though it is practically impossible to prevent colds, it is possible to avoid a lot of the trouble and lost time which ordinarily are associated with them.

Dr. Baumgartner says that the "cold virus" is really active for only the first 24 to 48 hours of the disease and that the thing that hangs on requently for a long time afterman ward, the cough, the "sinus drip", or the pneumonia, can be avoided if a few simple precautions are taken such as the following: the following:

1. Keep well nourished, conscientiously eating those foods essential to health;
2. Keep well rested (which means sleep, as well as

recreation that is actually recreation—a recharging of batteries rather than burning them out);

 Keep up exercise but don't overdo it.
 Make sure their bodies have no hidden or neglected defects as, for example, old infected tonsils that may cause a "run cown" condition or act as a source of infection when the cold strikes;

5. Know enough to be sensible when a cold first comes The first day or two of a cold is the best time to stay home. Care taken at the beginning may avoid prolonged illness later when the cold has progressed in seriousness. Rest in bed and plenty of fluids are sound, safe treatment. Fluids may be any liquid the patient likes, from gingerale on. And food should be what the patient wishes. Cathar-tics should be taken only as needed, hot indiscriminately; 6. And above all, learn to stay away from other colds

6. And above all, learn to stay away from other colds and be patriotic enough to keep your own cold from your neighbor. For colds are spread from person to person in the first few hours of the illness. Today, both patriotism and good sense should be reason enough not to spread colds thoughtlessly;

7. Avoid the over-exposure which helps bring on the common cold;

8. Call the doctor if fever and illness continue in spite of sensible care.
