Cost Of Protection

Came upon some interesting figures this week while gathering information about building permits. The building permits figures were astounding in themselves with Seminole to break the \$100 million mark in new construction by year end, But also intriguing was the costs of law enforcement in

Casselberry, Altamonte and Longwood, The national average for police protection has one police personnel for each 500 citizens in municipalities. Altamonte under its new budget is to have one personnel for

each 470 persons. Cost per capita for law enforcement there, again under the new budget, will be \$14.70. Cost in Casselberry with one personnel for each 500 ciffgens

will be \$15.50 per capita. In Longwood under the proposed police budget already cut to about \$98,000, cost per capita will be \$28 with one personnel for each 350 citizens.


