Ranks Of Unemployed Swelling During Crisis

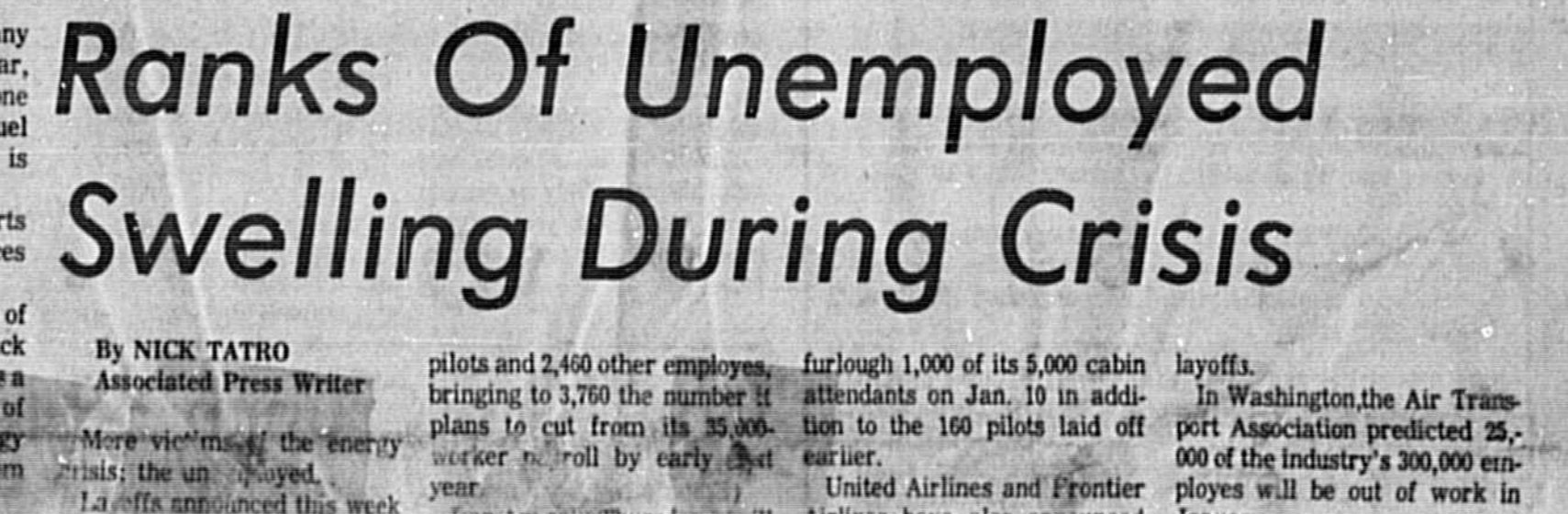

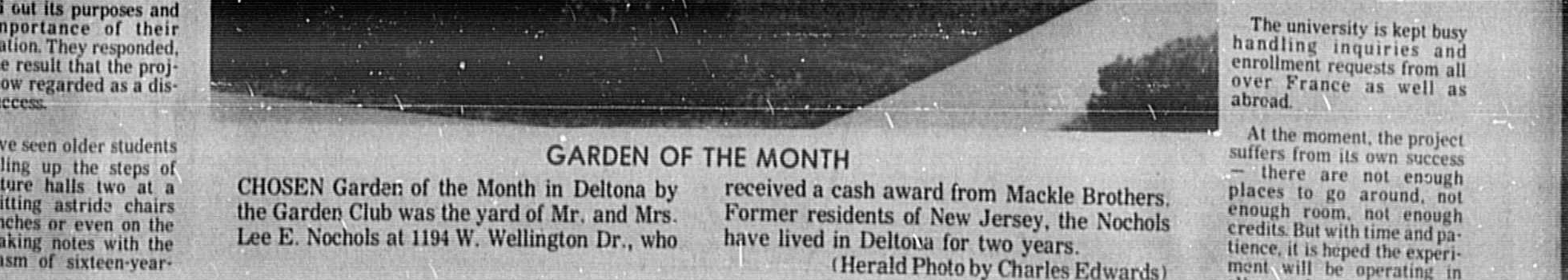
Retirement Is Rewarding Experience At First 'White-Haired' University

TOULOUSE, France — Retirement does not have to be the traumatic end of a life's road that it is, unfortunately, so often permitted to be.

It is to this end that a prominent French educator, Professor Vellas, dean of the University of Toulouse, opened his Faculty of Social Sciences to retirees and thus launched the first "white-haired" university, a program that is attracting much attention not only in France but throughout Europe and beyond.

Professor Vellas' experiment was the outgrowth of his experience as consultant on social problems to various international organizations.

"I decided to approach the problems of the older generation from the public health angle," he explains, "using the available resources of the university to strengthen a sense of community among elderly citizens."

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# The Presidents of the U.S.A.

THEODORE ROOSEVELT was born on October 27, 1858 in New York City. He graduated from Harvard in 1880 and after attending Columbia Law School, served for 2 years in the New York Assembly. In 1894, tragedy struck when both his wife and mother died at nearly the same time. Roosevelt went west to become a rancher and recover from his tragic loss. Several years later, he returned to New York and entered politics. In 1897, he was appointed assistant secretary of the navy and urged building a strong navy. When the Spanish-American War began, Roosevelt resigned his government post and raised a group of volunteers to form the Rough Riders. He became a national hero after leading the charge up San Juan Hill. After the war, Roosevelt was elected governor of New York.

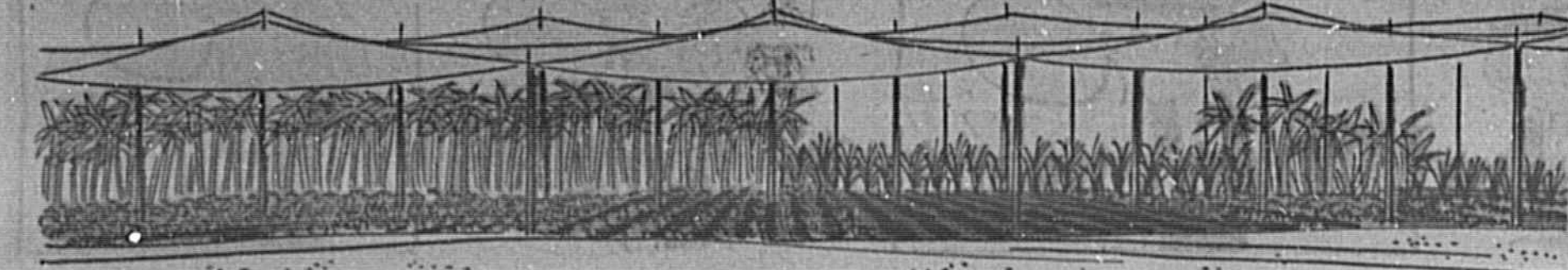

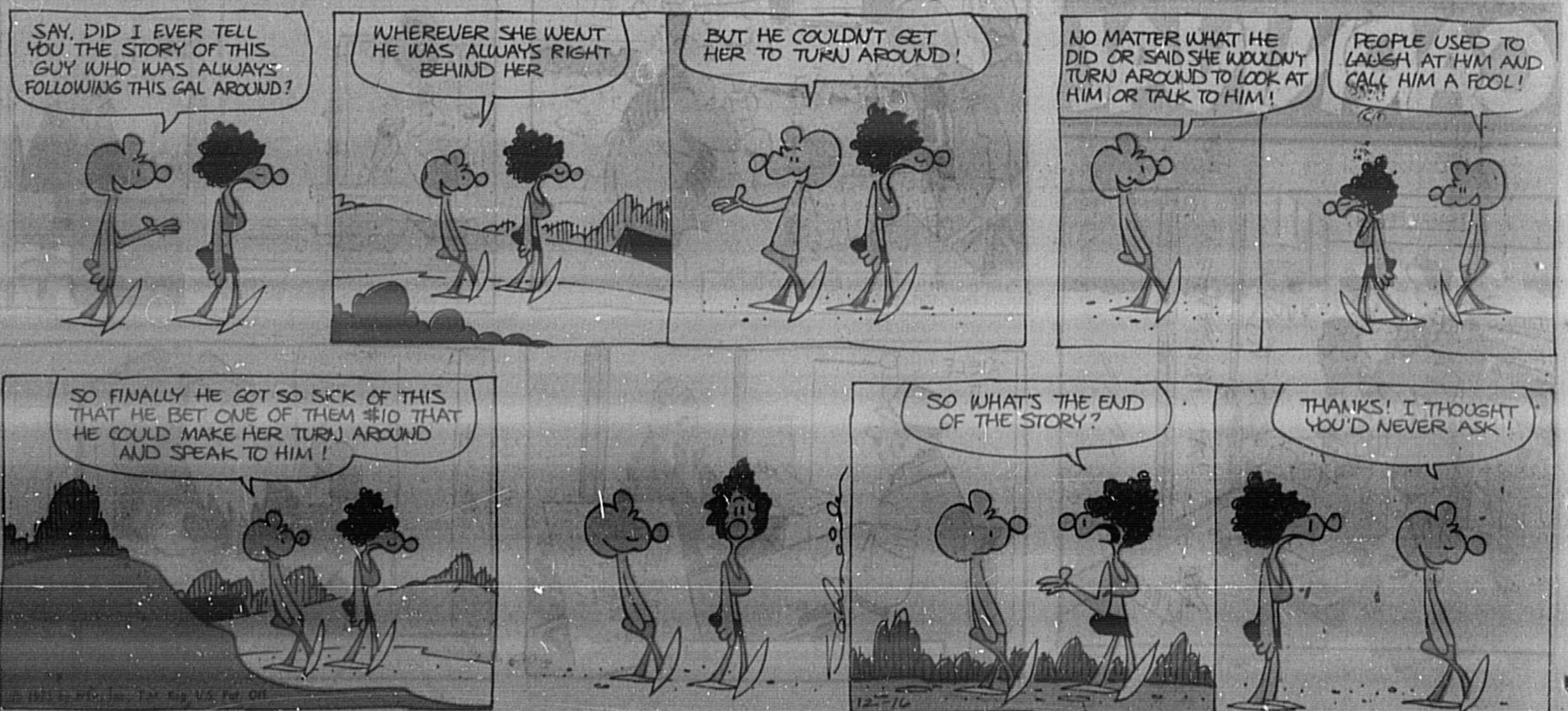

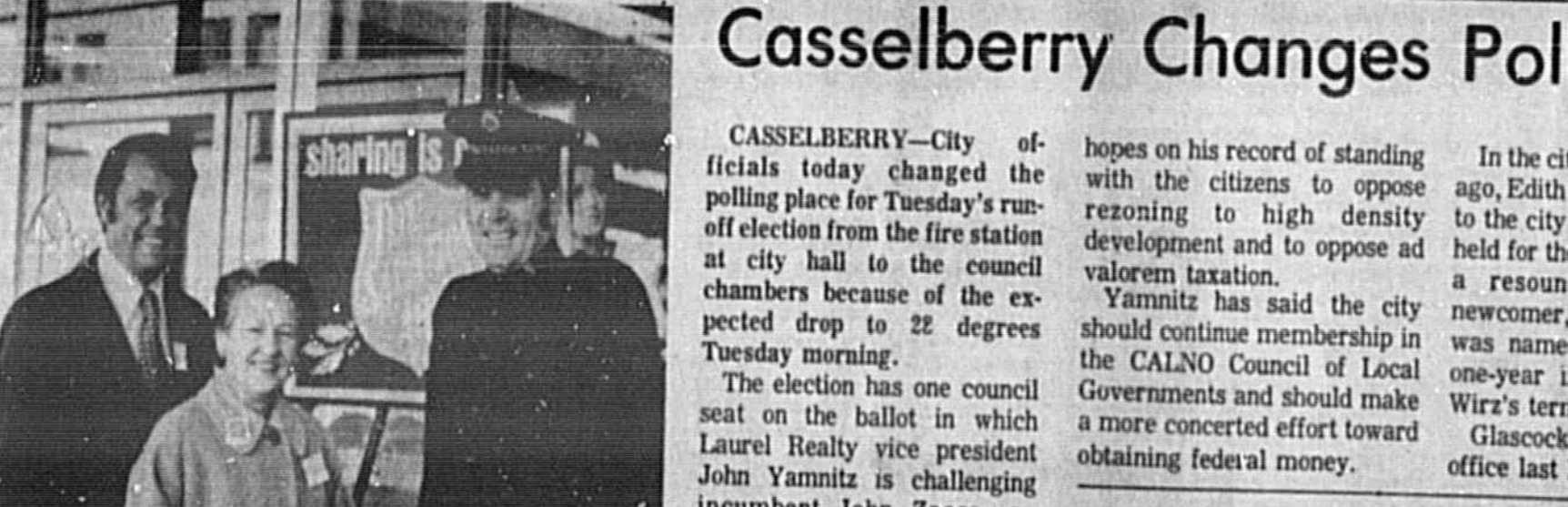
