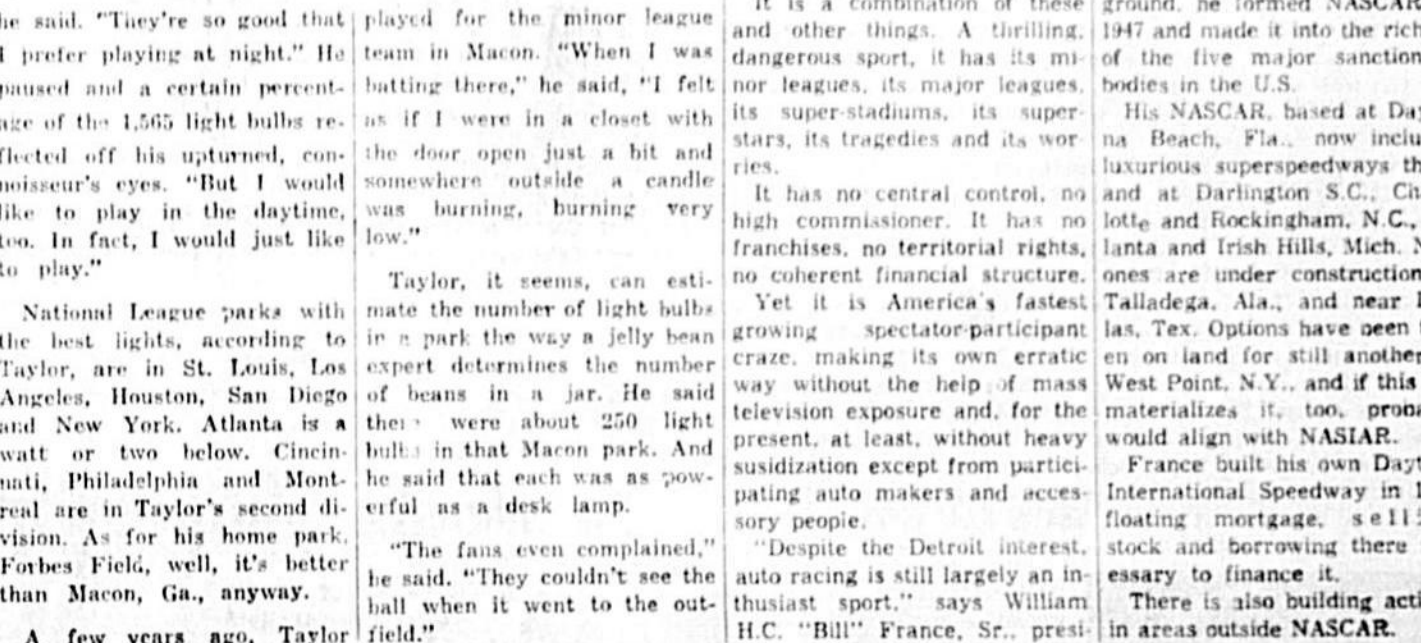

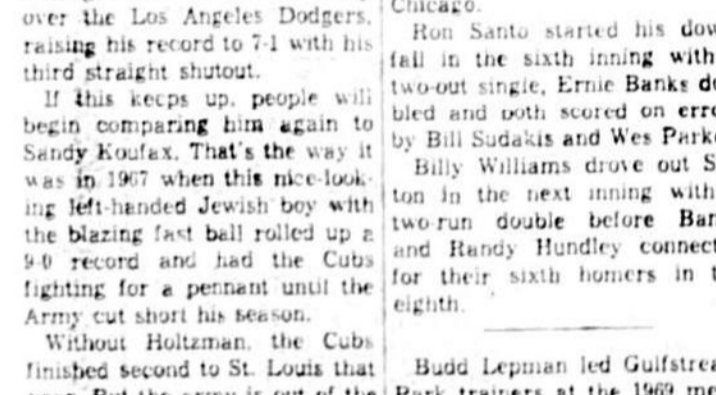

Bee Cake Delightful Confection

Once upon a time there was a chain of bakery shops in New York where you could buy a delightful confection called Bee Cake. This consisted of two layers of yeast-risen coffeecake with a creamy filling and a honey-nut glaze. Because the bakery shops are no longer in existence, we decided to make our own Bee Cake.

If you are nostalgic about Bee Cake—it's an adaptation of the German Benedictine-bread's recipe you may enjoy trying.

BEH CAKE
1 1/2 to 1 3/4 cups unsifted flour
2 tablespoons sugar
1 teaspoon salt
1 teaspoon grated lemon rind
1 package active dry yeast
1-2 cup milk
1/2 cup water
2 tablespoons butter or margarine
1 egg, at room temperature
Coconut Topping, see recipe below

Vanilla Cream Filling, see recipe below.

In large bowl of electric mixer, thoroughly stir together 1/2 cup flour, sugar, salt, lemon rind and unsifted yeast.

In a small saucepan over low heat, heat the milk, water and butter until liquids are warm—

butler does not need to melt. Gradually add to flour mixture and scraping bowl occasionally, beat two minutes at medium speed of electric mixer. Add egg and half cup flour or enough flour to make a thick batter. Scrapeing bowl occasionally, beat at high speed two minutes. Stir in enough additional flour to make a stiff batter. Cover; let rise in warm draft-free place until doubled in bulk—about 30 minutes.

Start at once to prepare Coconut Topping so it will have time to cool.

Stir batter down. Spread in a greased square cake pan (8 by 8 by 2 inches); it will be hard to spread, but you can do it. Cover; let rise in warm draft-free place until doubled in bulk—about 30 minutes.

Carefully spread coconut topping over cake. Bake in pre-heated (350-degree) oven about 30 minutes. Remove from pan and place on wire rack to cool.

Split cold cake in half horizontally. Spread Vanilla Cream Filling over bottom half; replace top half. Serve at once or refrigerate until serving time.

Makes nine average servings.

Fancy Up Your Tomatoes

Broiled tomatoes fancied up a bit is a simple dish but it has a way of contributing a festive air to a dinner plate.

Serve the tomatoes on a vegetable plate. Serve them with broiled meat and fish. With broiled chicken, too.

Serve them with eggs. Scrambled eggs and broiled tomatoes have always been popular in the South. The combination deserves to be used in other parts of the country. Delicious for brunch!

One of the most popular ways to broil tomatoes is with a crumb and cheese topping. Here's the recipe along with another topping suggestion.

FARMER'S TOMATOES
4 medium tomatoes
Salt
1/4 cup finely dry bread crumbs
1-3/4 cup freshly grated Parmesan cheese
2 tablespoons butter, melted
Wash and dry tomatoes. Cut a thin slice from the top and bottom of each. Cut out the stem ends. Slice in half crosswise. Sprinkle lightly with salt.

In a small skillet, melt the butter. Remove from heat. Add crumbs and cheese, mixing well. Sprinkle over tomatoes.

Broil in preheated broiler, four to eight inches from high heat, until hot through and lightly browned—usually six to eight minutes. Serve at once.

Make four servings—two halves per portion.

Note: For another popular topping, prepare tomatoes and dot with butter; broil until almost done; sprinkle with coarsely grated Swiss cheese and arrange two half strips of bacon (cooked not to crisp) crisscross fashion over the cheese. Place under broiler again just long enough to melt cheese and crisp bacon.

Thousands of times during the average hunting season, a bullet meant for an animal strikes a human being instead. Besides the personal tragedy, there may be important legal consequences as well. When is one hunter legally liable for shooting another?

The law's attitude is shaped by one basic truth: that firearms are inherently dangerous. What might be forgiven as a minor or careless mistake, under ordinary circumstances, becomes grounds for liability because of the special caution called for in the use of guns.

For example: Two duck hunters were sitting in a boat. One laid aside his gun, loaded and with the safety catch off. When the boat bobbed and jarred the gun, it fired a charge of bird shot into the other man's leg.

The victim later filed suit for damages, and a court upheld his claim. The judge said: "The care required of a person increases with any increase in the likelihood of harmful consequences to others if adequate care is not taken."

Besides having to pay damages, a hunter may even be punished on a criminal charge.

THE FAMILY LAWYER

Thus, a hunter was sent to prison for manslaughter after he shot down a companion crocheting in high grass. His excuse that "I thought it was a deer" was held inadequate, since there was sufficient visibility for him to make a more careful identification before pulling the trigger.

"If he is to drink," said the judge, "he must not shoot."

Of course, the presence of danger also places a heavier responsibility on a potential victim. While he is in a hunting environment, he must keep in mind that his own heedlessness may spell disaster.

2 large eggs
3 packages each 3 ounces cream cheese, at room temperature
1 teaspoon grated lemon rind
1 teaspoon lemon juice
1/4 teaspoon vanilla
Graham Cracker Shell, see recipe below

In a small mixing bowl beat eggs until thick and pale lemon color. Without washing beater, in a medium mixing bowl beat together cream cheese, sugar, lemon rind, lemon juice and vanilla until fluffy and smooth. Add eggs; beat just to blend. Turn into Graham Cracker Shell. Bake in a preheated 325-degree oven for 35 minutes. Cool, then chill about one half hour before cutting for contrast texture; a few hours for firm texture. Makes six servings.

Graham Cracker Shell—Mix 3 tablespoons butter. Remove from heat. Stir in 1/4 cup fine graham cracker crumbs and 1/4 cup chopped (medium-coarse) walnuts. Bake in a preheated 325-degree oven five minutes. Cheese filling may be added while crust is hot or cold.

3 eggs, separated

In a medium saucepan, scald 1 1/2 cups of the milk and dissolve bouillon cube in it. Stir together remaining one cup cold milk, cornmeal, and salt. Slowly stir into scalded milk. Add butter. Cook over moderate heat, stirring often, until thickened—about five minutes.

Remove from heat. Stir in Parmesan, scallion and baking powder. In a small bowl, beat egg yolks until thickened and lemon color. Stir in a small amount of cornmeal mixture. Stirring constantly, return yolk mixture to cornmeal mixture. Beat egg whites until stiff and fold into cornmeal mixture. Turn into round greased 1 1/2 quart casserole (about 7 1/2 by 7 1/2 inches). Bake in a preheated 350-degree oven for 15 minutes; reduce heat to 350 degrees and bake 30 to 35 minutes longer. Serve at once. Makes six servings.

Disease Link Seen

MELBOURNE (AP) — Study by Melbourne University and Melbourne's St. Vincent's Hospital suggests a link between alcoholism, smoking and lung disease.

A study team found that chronic obstructive lung disease was a characteristic illness of the alcoholics, particularly those who smoke.

The report, published in the latest issue of the *Australian Journal of Australia*, also found that alcoholics were twice as likely to be smokers as nonalcoholics.

"The results have shown that chronic obstructive lung disease is the characteristic pulmonary illness of the alcoholic," the Journal report said. "As with the nonalcoholic, it is related to smoking habits and social class."

"The higher frequency of chronic bronchitis in alcoholics than in nonalcoholics can be explained by alcoholics being twice as likely to be smokers as the nonalcoholics. Unfortunately, despite their high risk of chronic bronchitis, alcoholics appear less able than nonalcoholics to stop smoking."

For this reason, the report said, there seemed little chance of reducing disease among these people.

2 cups thinly sliced celery
1 cup thinly sliced pared carrots
1/2 cup boiling water
1/2 teaspoon salt
In a 1 1/2 quart saucepan bring celery, carrots, water and salt to a boil. Cover and boil until tender—8 to 10 minutes. Drain off any liquid. Makes three healthy servings.

SPICY BEANS AND FRANKFURTERS
6 large kosher-style beef frankfurters
1 can (15 1/2 ounces) chili beans
1 cup coarsely grated cheddar cheese
Cut frankfurter lengthwise through the center but not clear through. Tuck crosswise into a glass baking dish (9 by 5 by 1 1/2 inches) opening them so they are fatty fat. Spoon the beans into the frankfurter openings and around the frank. Sprinkle with cheese. Bake in a preheated 375-degree oven until bubbling hot and cheese has melted—about 20 minutes. Makes four servings.

Cool slightly. Meanwhile in the top of a double boiler over boiling water, melt chocolate with peanut butter, stir to blend. Spread over baked layer. Chill. Loosen sides and turn out. Cut into 3 by 1-inch bars. Tightly wrap up any leftover bars and store in refrigerator. Makes about three dozen.

1 medium or large ripe pineapple
1/4 cup sugar
1/4 cup kirsch (clear dry cherry brandy)
Cut rind from pineapple. Slice into fairly thin rounds and with a small sharp knife, notch out "eyes." Cut each slice in half. In a glass or ceramic casserole (1 1/2 quart) arrange pineapple in layers, sprinkling each layer with sugar and kirsch. Cover and refrigerate for at least a few hours before serving. Makes four to six servings. Serve on dessert plates with dessert size forks and spoons. A few tablespoons more sugar and kirsch may be added if you like.
