A Peculiar Twist

In Minersville, Pa. the school board had ruled that children should be required to salute the American flag upon certain occasions. Two children in the school objected on the ground that saluting the flag infringed upon their religious freedom.

"Conscientious scruples have not, in the course of the long struggle for religious toleration, relieved the individual from obedience to a general law not aimed at the promotion or restriction of religious beliefs."

Anyone who believes he has a right to worship God as he chooses, and extends that right to others, should welcome the opportunity to salute the American flag for it is one of the few flags in the world still waving over a people who have that right.

Iceland Grows

Since the German occupation of Denmark the little island of Iceland, on the edge of the Arctic ocean, has attracted more attention in this country than ever before.

"It is Iceland and not England which should be called the Mother of Parliaments, for Iceland had a parliamentary government from A. D. 930—one, incidentally, which is still functioning, now in its 1,011th year!"

"Iceland, a high land in a warm sea, has mountains which towers over valleys to fertile larger plains than any of Europe or of the mainland of Asia."

An upper and a lower house compose the Althing, or parliament, with theoretic executive power resting in the King of Iceland. Although Iceland was acknowledged a sovereign State in 1918, with the King of Denmark acting as the King of Iceland, this tie was severed on April 16, 1940, when the Germans having invaded Denmark, the Iceland Parliament declared that because the King of Denmark was a prisoner of a foreign power, he was unable to function as King of Iceland.

JACKSONVILLE, June 5.—Florida's state department of education believes it has the answer to the nation's problem of trained personnel for air defense.

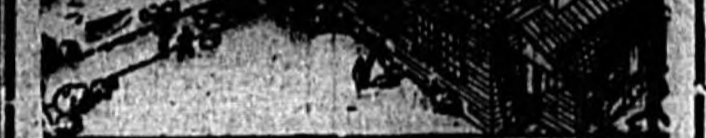
The idea is to tie in vocational and high school facilities with the emergency program now being worked out in Washington.

Starting next week at Daytona Beach, the third annual training school for teachers of vocational education is expected to draw educators from more than 50 states.

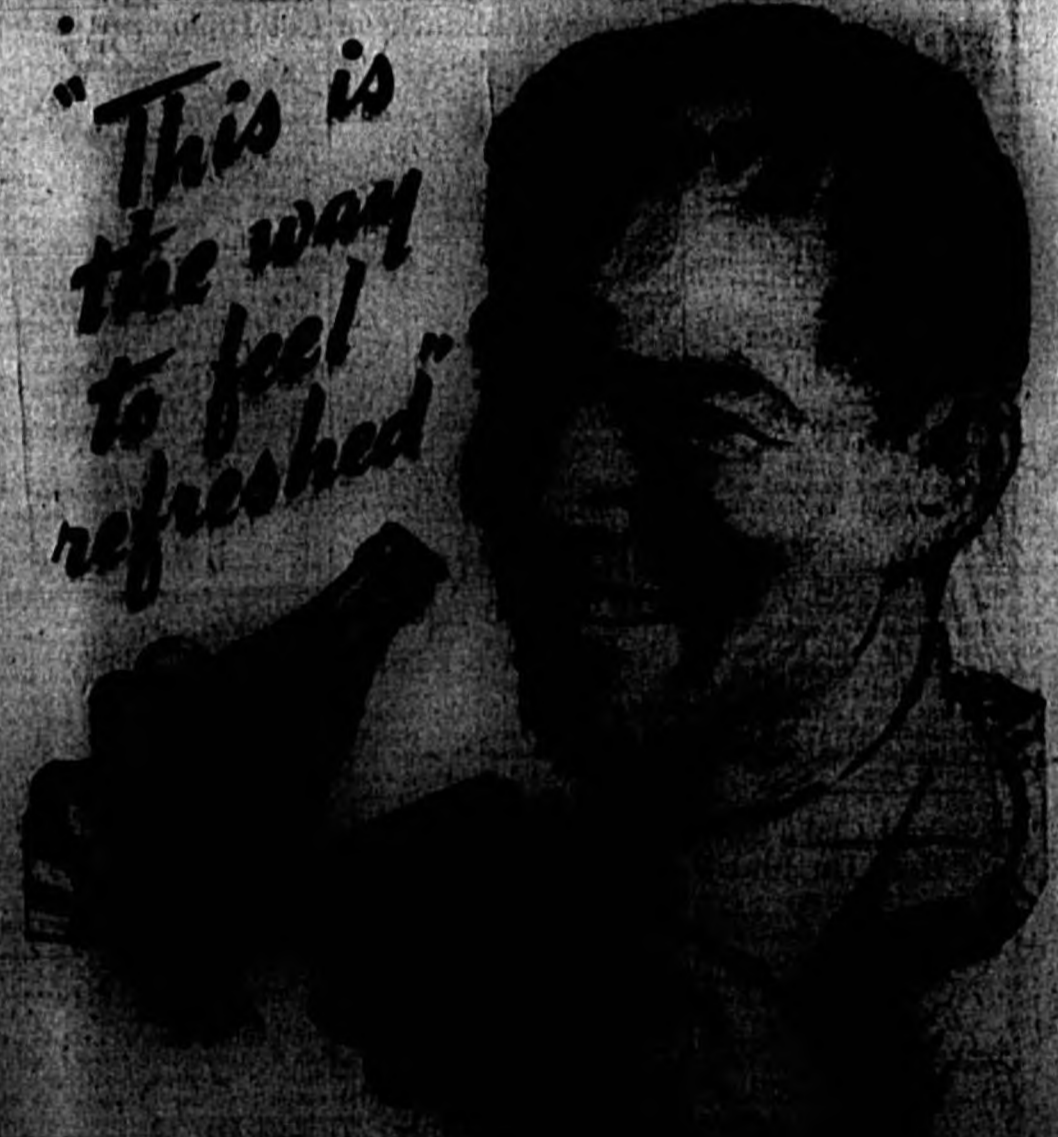

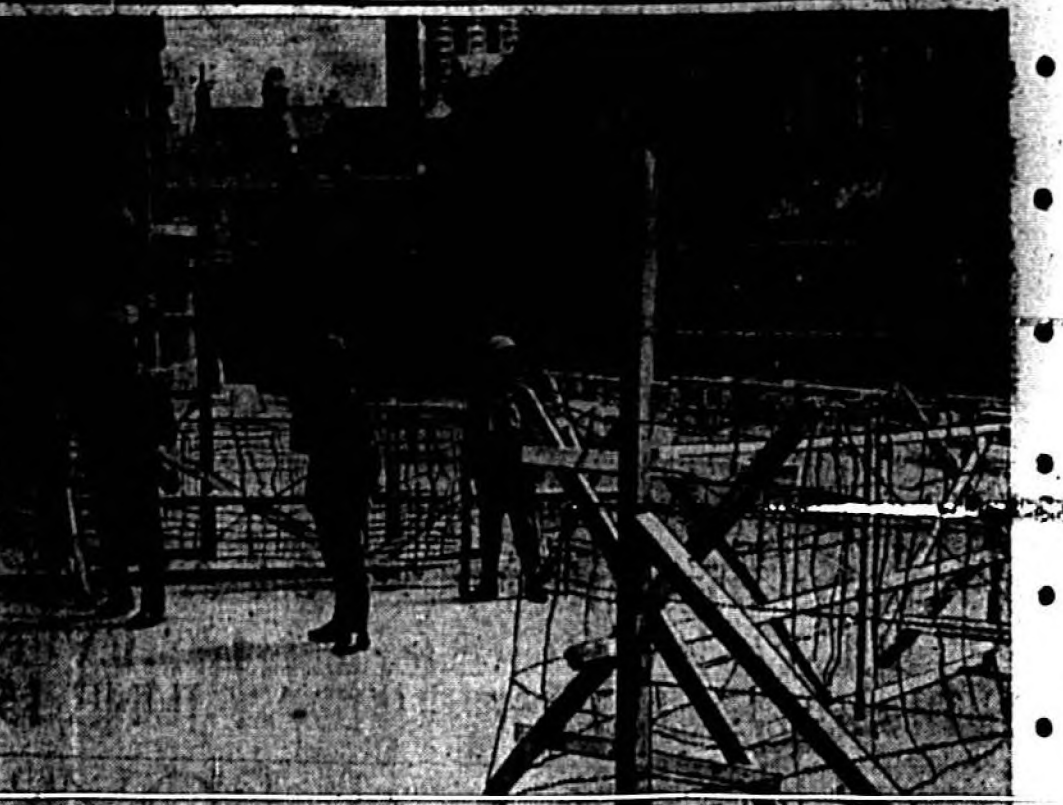
