Inflation Rate Worsens

government reported today that inflation in the closing three months of 1973 was even worse than earlier estimates, rising at an annual rate of 8.8 per cent.

This was the worst rate of inflation in 22 years—since the 13 per cent increase in the first quarter of 1951. The government also reported that real growth of the economy in the fourth quarter of 1973 was 1.6 per cent, an increase over the

preliminary estimate of 1.3 per cent The figures were contained in the Commerce Department's revised Product, a measure of the total output of goods and services in the nation last year.

The revised report said that for all of 1973, real economic growth was 5.9 per cent and inflationary growth was 5.4 per cent. Last month's preliminary report had placed real growth at 5.9 per cent but it estimated inflationary growth at 5.3

The preliminary report had estimated the inflation rate in the fourth quarter at 7.9 per cent but this was revised upward in today's

report to the whopping 8.8 per cent The annual rate was seven per cent in the third quarter.

The Nixon administration is projecting a 7 per cent inflation rate for 1974, with a high rate in the first part of the year and a lower rate in the second half.

The Commerce Department said the over-all Gross National Product. including both real and inflationary growth, rose \$33 billion to a seasonally adjusted annual rate of \$1,337.5 billion in the fourth quarter.

Gasoline-Thirsty States Allocated Additional Fuel

Officials of gasoline-thirsty Northeast states who will receive additional fuel under a new federal program said today they were happy with the extra allocation, but warned that the new supplies won't solve the shortage problem.

The long lines at the pumps continued in the Northeast and elsewhere as more states turned to some form of rationing. South Carolina, on Tuesday, became the 12th state to announce a distribution system based on the odd-even plan initiated by Oregon. The governor of Delaware said he will propose such a

The FEO on Tuesday ordered oil companies to send additional gasoline from their own stocks to 20 states suffering shortages for allocated by governors to ease particularly severe shortages. The amounts varied from state to state. Most state officials said

the extra allocation was nice, but not enough. Energy chief William E. Simon said on the NBC "Today" program that the extra gasoline would not put an end to long lines of cars at service stations. He reiterated that the fuel shortage was a long-term problem, measurable in terms of years, not

Gov. Thomas Salmon of Vermont, where the February allocation was increased 5 per cent or 680,000 gallons, said the boost was good news, but added that the state still needs about 3 million more gallons of gasoline.

Lawrence Rogers, the regional administrator of the FEO in New England, said of the increase. "It constitutes quite an injection for such a short period of time. The impact should be considerable in alleviating the shortage."

Authorities in states not among the 20 benefitting from Tuesday's announcement were predictably disappointed. Gov. Dan Evans of Washington said he was surprised the state wasn't on the list and added he would ask the FEO to explain why.



Let's Build The U.S. Alaskan Pipeline

Canadian Energy Minister Donald Mac-Donald made it clear on a recent trip to Washington that his country is taking a "Canada first" attitude toward its oil and gas resources. The United States cannot look for an increase in oil available for export from Canada to ease the fuel shortage here. Nor will the Canadians charge anything less than the "fair market value" for the oil they do sell us-a price now sharply higher due to the worldwide increases triggered by the Arab states.

This is disappointing, but not surprising Canada, Japan and European nations that will be represented at an energy conference called by President Nixon in Washington have tended to put their own interests first and cooperation second in their approach to the energy crisis. This tendency for nationalism to assert itself in times of shortage or fear of shortage of any commodity needs to be borne in mind as the United States approaches another decision involving an "Alaska pipeline."

This time, the question is how best to utilize the huge natural gas deposits discovered along with a treasure of oil around Prudhoe Bay on Alaska's North Slope. Until the importance of becoming self-sufficient in energy was driven home to the United States by the Arab oil embargo, it seemed logical to bring this gas to our homes and industry by a pipeline cutting across Canada and making the gas available to customers in Canada as well as the United States. The plan would call for a \$6 billion investment by a consortium of U.S. and Canadian

Now, with self-sufficiency a guiding principle in our energy policies, an alternate proposal is under consideration calling for construction of a natural gas pipeline parallel with the oil pipeline that will be built from Prudhoe Bay to the Alaskan port of Valdez. The gas would be liquefied for shipment by tanker to ports on the West Coast of the United States.

Cost Controls Are In Last Gasp

For GOP

The Cost of Living Council's the government's power to control most prices and wages expire on April 30 is welcome news. By that date controls will be lifted over all areas of the economy except petroleum and health care.

At present the council is keeping a lid on only 28 per cent of retail prices and 57 per cent of wholesale prices. Less than 40 per cent of wages and salaries are under controls. It is hard to believe that prices and wages in recent months would have behaved much differently if the gradual lifting of controls under Phase 4 had proceeded even more rapidly. The price of anything we buy is going to be controlled in the end by how much it costs to produce it, how much of it there is to go around, and how badly the customer

The question. however, is whether it is workable and fair to apply controls to one industry or commodity, or one group of people and not to another, even for

a short period. Striking turckers rebuffed the President's freeze on diesel fuel fuel as long as they can "pass through" the higher costs to shippers. Making freight rates more flexiable at a time of inpredictable fuel prices is indeed a more productive way of meeting the complaints of truckers.

Mr. Nixon ties the need for controls on medical charges into his hope for speedy enactment of his new health insurance program. He fears an "explosion" of medical costs like that which occurred when the Medicare and Medicaid programs suddenly swamped the resources of our health care system. Rather than resort to controls, wouldn't it make more sense to phase in new health programs gradually at the same time the personnel and facilities are being developed to cope with the increasing demands for treatment. thus relieving the pressure that increases costs?



named "Alpha Four," show new discrepancies and unreported

As far as we can determine, Rebozo turned the money over to the campaign without belaboring President Nixon about it. In previous cases, as we have reported, Rebozo collected \$100,000 from Howard Hughes and \$10,000 from the Davis

brothers, who founded the Winn-Dixie supermarket chain. The new \$1 million discrepancy was turned up by investigators for Common Cause. The citizens' lobby got some of its information, we have discovered, by threatening to serve a subpoena on Rose Mary Woods, the President's secretary. Under this pressure, the White House turned over her list of

secret contributors to Common Cause. The citizens' group also has winnowed data from sealed depositions of Rebozo, Nixon lawyer Herb Kalmbach and others. Finally, they have obtained an alphabetized four-column list

titled "Alpha Four," containing contributors' names and financial work papers of the Nixon re-election committee. Besides this curiously unaccounted for \$1 million, the Common Cause sleuths believe many millions more in donations

remain unreported, but they lack documents to back it up. There is evidence, for instance, that huge sums were pledged to the Nixon campaign and secretly paid into state committees to avoid federal accounting. One committee was set up under the Republican National Committee's umbrella, but money was funneled out of it for White House uses, the sleuths found. Large amounts were also "contributed in kind" in the form of

airline tickets, rent-a-cars, credit card charges and the like. FOOTNOTE: Common Cause lawyers Mitch Rogovin and Ken Guido, who pried loose most of the new data, refused comment except to say new court action is planned soon. Lawyers for the Nixon fund-raisers did not return our calls.

ROLLING OVER THE HANDICAPPED: An American company, which has cornered a dominant share of the world market in wheelchairs, has been accused of rolling up \$16 million a year in sales at the expense of his country's handicapped. In a still confidential draft report, the Center for Concerned

Engineering charges that Everest and Jennings International is selling virtually the same wheelchairs in America for \$495 that it markets in Great Britain for \$135. The group rated the Brisish chair as being better, since it is equipped with peneumatic front

In West Germany, E&J is faced with small innovative competitors. The center's engineers said E&J markets many types of advanced machines in Germany to meet this challenge

Ralf Hotchkiss, director of the engineering center, said he made an international tour checking, the availability of wheelchairs and found that the handicapped in other countries fare better than Americans, both in price and in design.

During his investigative trip to England, Hotchkiss said he visited the largest E&J distributor and placed an order for 10 "We went through all the paper work and then the salesman asked where I wanted the wheelchairs shipped," Hotchkiss said. "I gave him my American address and he told me he was not

allowed to ship the cheaper chairs to the United States."

He said E&J enforced a similar policy in Germany, where the broad range of models is particularly attractive to handicapped

The biggest unfulfilled need in wheelchairs, the center's draft concluded, is to make them narrow enough to carry their passengers through bathroom doors.

Citing a recent study which shows that most U.S. wheelchair willing to pay whatever it costs for are more then two feet wide, the center noted, "The average bathroom door is both private homes and public facilities is less than 241/2 inches" - too narrow for wheelchairs.

The center contended, however, that there is considerable data showing that "60 per cent of adults can fit comfortably into chairs 20 inches wide or less." MIAMI (AP) - A division of the Department of Business Regulation was to meet here today to decide whether to revoke the operating permit of Daytona Beach's jai alai fronton.

J. Patrick McCann, director of the Parimutuel Wagering Division, said the revocation consideration is based on the California felony conviction of its majority stockholder, Emprise Corp.

Emprise holds more than two million shares in Volusia Jai Alai Inc. It was convicted in Los Angeles in 1972 of conspiring to hide ownership of the Frontier Hotel in Las Vegas, Nev. The ruling is under appeal by Emprise and McCann said the division must decide whether a conviction, although under appeal, is grounds for revocation. State law prohibits anyone who has been convicted of a felony to hold a permit for a parimutuel wagering operation.

LONDON- While instances of alleged demon possession are common among primitive peoples, there recently have been hundreds of such cases among people in England. The phenomena associated with demon possession involve mental derangement, the awareness of evil spirits

doing actual physical harm, and a sense of malevolent beings nducing acute terror. While it seems to be agreed that some aspects of dementia are psychological and can be cured by psychiatry or medical or pastoral care, numerous cases fall outside of

these and defy normal curative processes. The bishop of London recently took the step of appointing a diocesan adviser on the exorcism of evil spirits. Prebendary Henry Cooper, 65-year-old rector of St. George's n Bloomsbury. Dr. Cooper has been a student of demon

possession for years. His advice and belp in apparently incurable cases are

sought beyond his parish boundaries. Unlike many of his contemporaries who have been inclined to view denion possession with some skepticism as Dr. Cooper treates the power of evil with great seriousness. While this power more frequently shows itself by localizing in certain houses, it also takes up residence within the human personality, he believes, and in such cases the ordinary reatments of medicine are powerless to dislodge the spirit. This is where exorcism (casting out) comes into the

Not only was exocism one of the earliest gifts promised and practices in the Apostolic era, but orders of service in which the power and love of God are sought for dealing with evil spirits recently have been formulated in the Church of

Prebendary Cooper believes that ordinary parish priests, rather than professional exorcisers, should be helped to understand this phenomenon and deal with it in the name

Daytona Sensations

After four years in Central Florida, I finally got a chance to see something I've wanted to all of this time - the Daytona 500 (450?). Anyway, it's the grandaddy of stock car races, or so the Daytona folks tell me, and I believe them.

I got there early. The sun wasn't shining, but hundreds of campfires, lanterns and spotlights illuminated the enormous camping grounds like a Fourth of July picnic at high noon in

I could feel the repressed anxiety sweeping through the crowd, which officials put at nearly 100,000. Everybody seemed intent on achieving two things-having a good time and watching

In fact, some of the people there told me they come more for the fun attendant to the race than for the race itself. I don't know if you've ever seen thousands of bonfires going at

one time, but if you haven't, I suggest you go to the Daytona 500 next year. Invitatations to "have a hot dog" abounded, and shots of "pass the mustard" pierced the cold but invigorating pre-dawn But the most exciting part of the raceway has to be the pit area.

There, I got to see and meet THE NAMES in American stock car driving. I got to talk with the men who put the drivers on the track, the guys whose knowledge and expertise keep those raging cars screaming around the famous oval. The smells, sounds and sights in the pit area are indescribable. Normally one doesn't get too excited about the

thought of inhaling burning rubber and spilled gasoline, all the while trying to keep your eardrums from jumping out of your But once you're in the pits, sitting with a crew pushing for a certain driver, the thrill builds to a crescendo that climaxes only

when the checkered flag flaps for the winner. The only derisive comment I heard the entire day came from one rabid Donnie Allison fan, whose "Oh no, not again," shriek of agony carried over the yelling of the crowd when Richard Petty won. Had it been in the power of about 5,000 Petty fans, King Richard could easily have been swept into the White House, so great is the adulation his fans heap upon him.

At one point in the race I got to see Petty and Allison in their neck and neck war for first place. It was on the second turn, just where the embankment is steepest. I saw them giving signals to each other which later were translated by them as "Okay, let's

And race they did. Around and around at speeds approaching 200 miles per hour, dodging wrecked cars, litter, oil, slower drivers and caution lights. I saw one car bounce off the cement wall and slide into the grassy infield and at least one car blow an

DEAR STUMPED: Altho there are "common law marriages," there are no common law divorces.



Polly's Problem ___ DEAR POLLY - I have kept house for several years and have a problem that surely others have had. How does one get undershirts and white socks really clean and white without using harsh methods? -

DEAR POLLY - My Pet Peeve is with the manufacturers

of toilet bowl deodorizers that turn blue in water. I do not

like this blue water. When I go into the bathroom I want to

see clean clear water in the toilet bowl, not blue. I have

searched the supermarkets trying to find a product to put in the tank that cleans and deodorizes but does not turn blue. I cannot find one. They all say they do just this. This really irks me. We housewives have no choice. - MRS. W.S. DEAR POLLY - My answer is for Sharon who wants to remove the odor from an acetate dress. She might try washing it in tepid water with a mild detergent and in the second rinse add about three tablespoons of white vinegar before putting the dress in the water. Rinse thoroughly in this and let stand for just a few seconds before squeezing out the water. This should remove the odor. Rinse again in clear tepid water. Use a turkish towel to absorb excess moisture. Hang up to dry. I hope this helps her as it did me but, of course, she must test to be sure her dress fabric can "take it." It took two such treatments to completely remove the odor from my dress but it never came back.
