Tuesday is the big day for bells begin to ring.

This year an additional 1.200 a. m. or more children will answer the coll call in the 22 Seminole Couny schools, hut only one new achool will open it's doors,

The heavy influx of new students in the south end of the county will necessitate double sessions for grades one through four at Allamonte Springs, and mass instruction groups in the fifth and sixth grades there. Forty-six new Watchels will wake their places in the county's educational system and the Hopper Elementary School for Negro children will add 11 new classrooms to the county total. At Lyman, a new (to this area) plan of teaching as many as 150 students at once is being put into operation for the first time.
