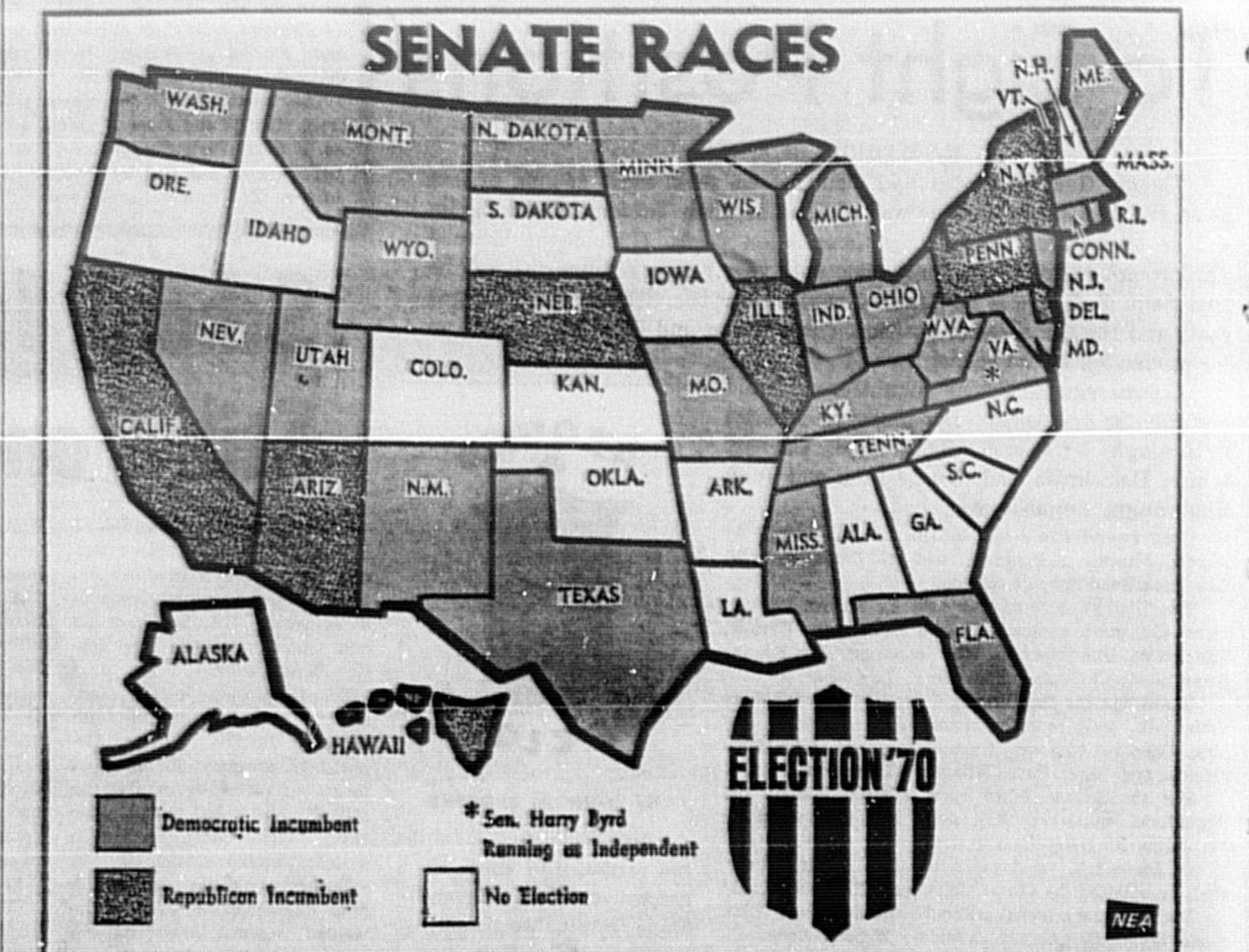


18-Year-Old Voter Turnout Seen As Big Question Mark

WASHINGTON (AP) — The 11 million young people enfranchised by the controversial 18-year-old vote law have the greatest potential impact in the South and West, but the tendency of youth to stay home on election day could dilute their influence significantly.



Of the 34 Senate seats at stake in the 1970 elections, 24 are now held by Democrats, nine by Republicans and one by an independent—Virginia's Sen. Harry Byrd, elected in 1964 as a Democrat. Republicans, now the Senate minority party, need a net gain of seven seats to take control.

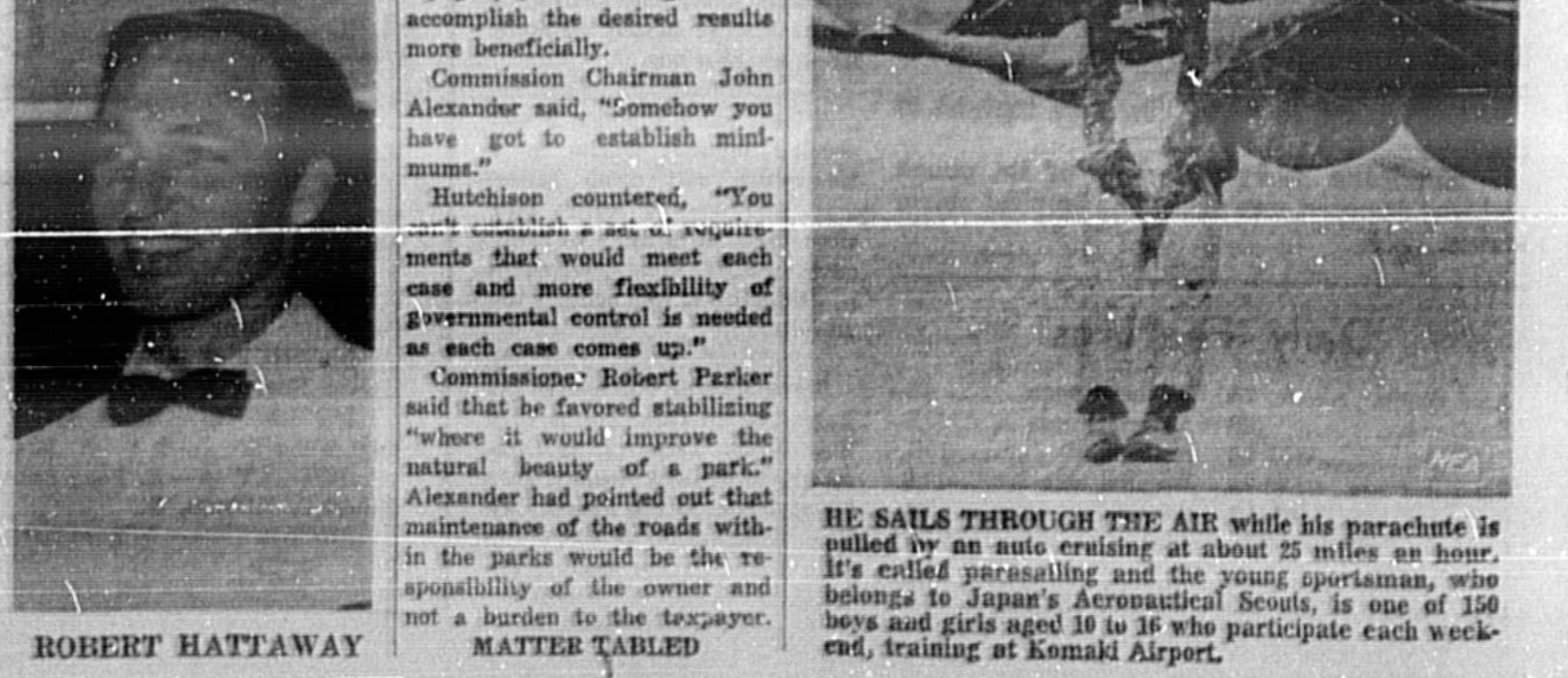
For Trailers, Campsites, Plats Land-Use Hearing Slated Aug. 4

Proposed new ordinances governing trailer parks and campsites and subdivisions were discussed at public hearings Tuesday during the regular meeting of the Seminole County Commission.

Revisions recommended by the planning and zoning board for trailer park and campsite regulations would reduce site requirements to not less than 30 feet wide by 1500 square feet with not more than 14 sites per acre. Original requirements called for 50 feet wide of useable land other than recreation area, but this was deleted, calling only for the site plan to be approved by the county engineer.

Calls For Election By The People Nixon Nixes Viet Coalition Government

WASHINGTON (AP) — President Nixon says the future government of South Vietnam must be selected through elections not imposed on the war-torn nation by negotiators in Paris.

His administration will not stand for an imposed coalition government, the President said. "It must be a government selected by the people of South Vietnam."

In a wide-ranging news conference Monday, the President also said he would veto a bill setting mandatory quotas on any imports except textiles. Such quotas, he said, are not in the national interest and might set off an international trade war.

Our county boasts, quite properly, of its growth. Yet this growth brings with it problems which have already won headlines on the issues of zoning, roads, education and improved municipal governments.

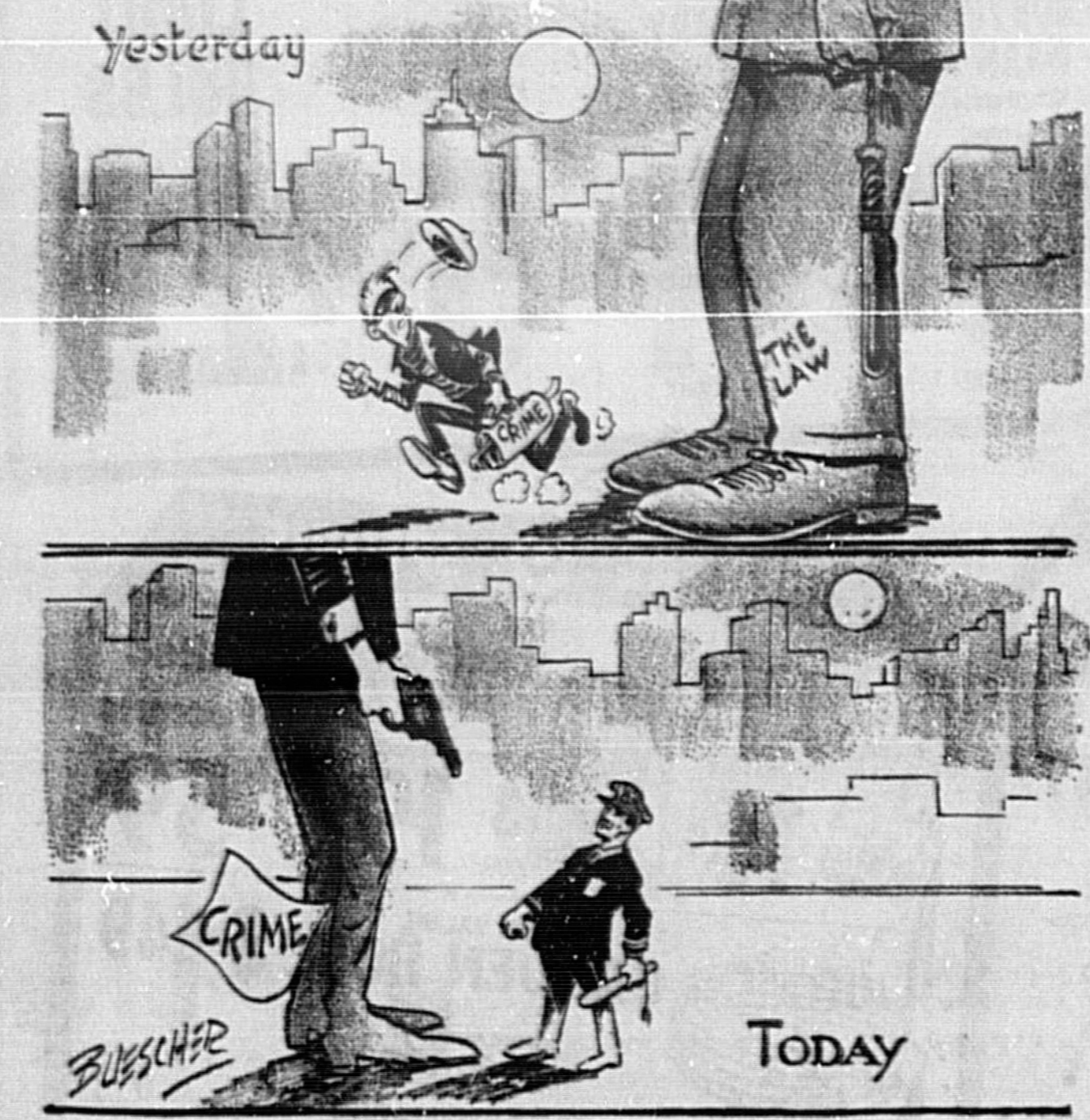
When Sheriff Polk needs more uniformed officers, more investigators and encouragement to start the cadet training program which would be operated with the cooperation of Seminole Junior College.

Delicacies Of The Deep Sea

About 76 years ago, a Pilgrim fisherman was strolling along a lonely strand when his nostrils were assailed by a tantalizing odor of seafood. Around the bend he came upon a tribe of Indians busy cooking clams and fish over hot rocks strewn with seaweed.

The Indians turned out to be friendly, and they initiated the stranger into the mysteries of the clam-bake. Ever since then, Americans have been glorifying the mollusk and its finny cousins with bakes, barbecues, boils and fries that attract thousands of hungry tourists each summer from Maine to California.

New England is the clam-bake, but its fame has spread down the Atlantic Seaboard and across the Pacific Coast where the clam has been replaced by the abalone.

Today's clam-bake is a far cry from the snack the Indians whipped up for our inquisitive "Pigskin" ancestor. It has been expanded into a multicourse banquet running the gamut from steaming bowls of creamy New England chowder to succulent lobsters; tangy sausages and finally fragrant slabs of apple pie.

Heading south into Maryland, home of the famed blue crab, tourists find the clam-bake replaced by a cookout of golden-brown fried crabs, velvety crab casseroles and tangy crab coleslaw.

Virginia marks the opening of the oyster season early in September with festivals featuring such delicacies as oyster stew, barbecued oysters and oysters pickled southern style in cloves and white vinegar.

Tennessee, home of the fish fry, provides a summer long series of cookouts that have become famous throughout the deep South. Tons of fish are served crackling crisp each season with corn meal hushpuppies.

In Florida, fish and crustaceans are so plentiful and inexpensive that the state puts on a "sea-food" series of seafood feasts. Favorite dishes there include scallops, paprika, barbecued eel and fork-tender taroia steaks from the great loggers' heads that swim in the warm waters of Key West.

Louisiana, noted for its French wine sauces and Creole Pompano which Mark Twain said was "as delicious as the less criminal forms of sin," holds a number of seafood festivals each summer.

So does the Mississippi gulf port of Biloxi, the world's best known shrimp and oyster port, where a crew may pull in as much as 30,000 pounds of shrimp in one season.

Every June there is a colorful ceremony in Biloxi known as the blessing of the shrimp fleet. Hundreds of gaily bedecked trawlers sail past a priest who sprinkles the flotilla with holy water and asks the Lord's protection for the fishermen.

The ritual signals a weekend of gaily dined-up by a mammoth shrimp feast. It features such dishes as jambalaya, Gumbo and shrimp stuffed in eggplant, tomatoes, and green peppers. There is shrimp salad galore, shrimp patties, barbecued shrimp, and of course well-chilled shrimp cocktail.

Canellini Goes With Cold Cuts

We've discovered an interesting dish, inspired by Italian cuisine, to serve with cold meats and deviled eggs or both.
The mainstay of this dish are the white kidney beans (cannellini) that come in 15-ounce cans. For this recipe the beans are added to a tomato sauce that boasts capers and pine nuts. Because this Cannellini in Tomato Sauce is offered chilled, you can prepare it well ahead of serving time. A practice that always helps to get a hostess in an un-ruffled mood.

Another way to serve the white kidney beans is to marinate them in a dressing of olive oil, white wine vinegar, salt, pepper and Dijon mustard and, just before serving, sprinkle them with loads of minced parsley. This way they taste delicious with canned tuna and crisp green peas in a tomato salad.

CANNELINI IN TOMATO SAUCE
2 tablespoons olive oil
1 medium onion, cut in thin strips
1 cup diced celery
1 can (15 ounce) whole tomatoes
1 can (8 ounces) tomato paste
1 tablespoon sugar
1/4 cup red wine vinegar
1 jar (1 1/2 oz.) capers, drained
1/2 can (1 1/2 cup) anchovies
1/4 cup pine nuts (pignolis)
2 cans (each 15 oz.) white kidney beans (cannellini), drained and rinsed with cold water

In a large saucepan heat the oil; add onion and cook gently until transparent. Add celery, tomatoes, and tomato paste. Simmer for 15 minutes. Add capers, anchovies, pine nuts and beans; stir gently, taking care not to break the beans. Simmer to blend flavors - about 20 minutes. Cover and chill. Serve about 1 quart.

Serve cold with such accompaniments as Genoa salami, deviled eggs, pickled beets, or tomato and cucumber salad. Cannellini in Tomato Sauce may be served on salad greens.

Note: One 15-ounce can of white kidney beans holds about 1 1/2 cups.
