



Mechanical Cow Trains Horses

SANTA ROSA, Calif. (AP) — What has three wheels, weighs 800 pounds, can spin on a dime and looks like a golf cart wearing a costume? It's a batterypowered mechanical cow, and Dick Knight says, "We call 'er Elsie."

Knight trains horses that specialize in "cutting" a cow from a herd and blocking its return so it can be weaned, examined, branded or sent to market.

He said Friday that he's delighted with Elsie, although some horses are a bit startled the first time they see it. The reaction seemed understandable as Knight demonstrated the machine, sitting inside with his head protruding from the artificial cow's

As a ranch hand Gayle Gray drove the machine into the corral for a practice run, stallion Doc's Tom Tucker perked up his ears. Elsie approached, then lurched quickly and repeatedly as Elsie twisted and turned, but the horse held his ground as a cattle-

Inside the machine, Gray was using two levers to steer. Four heavy-duty, rechargable sixvolt batteries powered its two 11/2-"With a cow, you go where she wants to go. With Elsie, we can

control where she goes, and repeat the same moves as long as it takes to get the horse trained," Knight explained. Knight, who charges about \$300 for a month's training, said he uses Elsie for 95 per cent of the work.

In Child-Killing Case

FORT LAUDERDALE (AP) - Blood samples taken from a suspect's vehicle match that of an 8-year-old girl murdered last week, say police.

"The blood type of Lisa (Lynn Berry) is the same as that which was found in the windowed van of James F. Rose," Police Chief Leo Callahan said in a Friday release.

The state attorney's office said it would present the case to a county grand jury soon in an effort to obtain a murder indictment.



About Nation's Economy

Report Sparks Worry

WASHINGTON (AP) - A sharp drop in farm prices, increased layoffs of factory workers and other government statistics are raising new doubts about the nation's economic health in the closing days of the presidential campaign.

The Agriculture Department reported Friday that between Sept. 15 and Oct. 15 the price farmers get for grain, soybeans and other crops and livestock dipped 5 per cent. It was the third straight monthly decline reported by the department, and compared with a year ago prices are down 9 per cent.

Arab Peace Plan Future Uncertain

The world can be permitted some skepticism toward the peace plan for Lebanon agreed upon at Riyadh. On paper, the plan looks good. Making it work is another matter.

The overriding question is whether the six Arab leaders who subscribed to the plan at Rivadh are going to be able to get the warring factions in Lebanon to go along with it. This presumes, of course, that the six will continue to agree with one another during the period when President Elias Sarkis tries to implement the plan.

On the surface, it appears that Syria's Hafez Assad and Egypt's Anwar Sadat have composed their differences about the future of the Palestine Liberation Organization and its guerrilla forces in Lebanon. The Riyadh plan to deprive the Palestinians of heavy weapons and confine them to refugee camps under terms of the 1969 Cairo agreement suggests that Assad has succeeded in his effort to clip the wings of the PLO's Yasir

In this respect, the peace plan could be a step in the direction of some kind of negotiations with Israel over the political fate of the Palestinians. There would be less chance that Palestinian guerrillas based in Lebanon could serve as spoilers provoking violence that would undermine any move toward a settlement not to their liking.

It is still not clear what kind of Lebanon is likely to emerge if the Riyadh formula should be carried out. With Egypt, Syria, Saudi Arabia and Kuwait standing behind President Sarkis, it is hard to envision a Lebanon following the old policy of neutralism toward the Arab-Israeli dispute. The Lebanese Christians who were the authors of that policy may no longer be in a position to keep Lebanon from becoming another "confrontation state" on Israel's border.

That lends some credibility to reports that Israel has provided weapons to Lebanese Christian forces trying to gain control of areas along the Israeli border in recent weeks. So far, Israel has avoided any appearance of direct intervention.

Throughout the 18 months of civil war in Lebanon, there have been fears that the fighting would ignite a larger war. Although the response of Israel to this new development remains ambiguous, it appears now there is a willingness to make peace. The willingness is at the top, however, and it remains to be seen whether it can be transmitted down to the level where bitterness and hostility remain.

DEA Efforts

The Federal Drug Enforcement Administration is a 2,200agent national network assigned a perplexing task in coordinating the efforts to stop the flow of narcotics into the United States. There have been some recent indications that its shop should be shaped up.

We can sympathize with a recent comment by DEA Director Peter B. Bensinger that the nation will not be able to turn off drugs like a light. Bensinger said we will be facing drug problems for years to come. His assessment is correct, but more can be done to alleviate the nation's major social problem. Bensinger's agency has an annual budget of more than \$153 million. Substantial sums to combat drug abuse also are being committed by local, state and other federal agencies in programs to reduce availability of drugs or to help in rehabilitation of drug users.

The DEA was set up as recently as in 1973 but it already suffers from significant bureaucratic flu. For example, its management recently planned a national program to coordinate media coverage on a major crackdown of drug dealers. The public relations effort flopped because of poor staff coordination. The mix-up, which included uncertainty within the DEA as to exactly how many drug traffickers were arrested and what quantity of narcotics were confiscated, indicates that the

agency might need housecleaning. DEA can not take the entire blame if efforts against drug trafficking miscue. But since it is the federal coordinator of antidrug programs, it should coordinate. As Bensinger says, we may not be able to turn off drugs like a light, but with better organization it might be possible to dim the glow faster.

WASHINGTON - In the debate between the vice presidential candidates, when Bob Dole needled Walter Mondale saying he had never even met Aleksandr Solzhenitsyn, Mondale denied this, declaring:

"I've repeatedly spoken out in admiration of him. I served on the host committee receiving Mr. Solzhenitsyn to the United States Senate. He's a man that deserves to be honored and it was a shame to me that the President of the United States, because we were fearful of offending the Soviet Union, failed to accord that high honor to Mr. Solzhenitsyn."

Well, now, I couldn't agree more. It was indeed a disgrace that President Ford snubbed Solzhenitsyn, refusing to meet with him on the advice of Henry Kissinger. But the fact of the matter is that when the





"We really feel we have a good chance. We have a real shot at it," contends Don O'Brien, who is running Carter's state campaign. But when asked to predict a victory margin, O'Brien replies, "I'm not

A poll released Sunday by the Detroit News showed Ford leading Carter 45 to 42 per cent with 11 per cent undecided and 2 per cent saying they planned to vote for independent candidate Eugene J. McCarthy. That three-point lead fell within the survey's four-point margin of error and marked a

further slippage for Ford, who had been leading Carter 47 to 42 per cent in an earlier Detroit The latest poll, conducted by Market Opinion Research and consisting of interviews with 700 persons, was conducted just

before the final televised debate

between the two men.

One thing both sides agree on is the race's key issue - unemployment. Michigan still had 8.9 per cent of its workers jobless in the last figures before the election. That was 1.1 per cent above the national average. Still, the figures were a dramatic improvement over 1975 when unemployment averaged 15.5 per cent statewide and often was 50 per cent higher than

the national statistics. "It's the main issue, no doubt about it," McLaughlin says. "But as long as it keeps coming down, it shouldn't hurt us. I haven't seen it being counterproductive so far."

"You can't have unemploy ment as high as we've had for as long without having workers feeling threatened," counters Darrell Tennis, a staff representative for the state AFLCIO. But Tennis also notes his organization cannot guarantee the turnout or voting patterns of the 500,000 families it repre-

"It's a sizable bloc but it's not monolithic. It's not a question of pushing a button and turning out the vote. That may have been true once, but it was before I was born."

Historically, Michigan offers little solace to either party. In 13 presidential elections stretching back to 1924, Michigan has gone for the GOP nominee seven times and the Democratic choice six. Part of the reason for that


volatility may be Michigan's ethnic and racial mixture. Nineteen per cent of the just over nine million residents are foreign born or have at least one parent who was born outside the United States. Michigan also has nearly one million blacks and 120,000 Spanish speaking residents.

Without any registration by political party, crossover voting can be a factor in state Some Democrats in Ford's home town of Grand Rapids admitted voting for him during this year's May GOP primary. "Many Democrats feared Rea-

gan and crossed to vote for Ford," says Robert Kleiner, the 5th District Democratic chair-

Kleiner predicts no such crossovers for Ford in November, declaring the President "will not carry the City of Grand Rapids" and will lose Michigan to Carter. "That's absurd," retorts

Robert Eleveld, Kleiner's GOP counterpart. "After all, this guy 25 years (as a congressman). On the last time he's ever going to run for election, I don't think the people are going to turn their back on him."









The dream is about to become reality. After a year of preliminaries, a group of visionaries who call themselves the Downtown Development Corporation are ready to start

changing Sanford's image. Their plan is to transform the city's somewhat undistinguished downtown into a quaint Victorian shopping village by widening sidewalks, planting trees and emphasizing the turn-of-the century architecture that has won Sanford a listing in the National Register of Historic Places. But the transition will be more than just a

During the first year, the stage was also set for a permanent funding base, which board member Walter Gielow of The Evening Herald feels was an especially important accomplishment. "You have to be able to rely on some good, basic financing to continue," he said.

A special taxing district was approved by the Florida Legislature, but no taxes can be levied until property owners in the district approved the proposed tax in a referendum vote. No date has been set for the referendum.

"We may never have to call the referendum if we can count on support from the downtowners," Miss Jacobson said.

Voluntary contributions from about 50 of the 200 downtown property owners have covered the bills for DDC's first steps.

"I'm particularly pleased that we've been able to do so much on a limited budget," said First Federal's Gib Edmonds, who serves as DDC treasurer. "We've spent very little so far but we're reaching the point where that's no longer feasible." One of the next steps will be an expansion of the base of financial support. "I can understand why some potential supporters have been holding back until they saw results," said Miss Jacobson. "But now that we're snowing them results, we look forward to receiving their contribution if they believe in what we're doing."

One of the things DDC is doing these days is promoting Sanford to the rest of Central Florida. The first year feasibility studies have convinced the DC directors that they must aim beyond Sanford's city limits and even beyond Seminole County's

borders. "The average Sanford citizen earns only a basic salary which does not leave him a lot of spending money," Miss Jacobson said. "So we have studied at great length ways to increase our appeal in order

He calls the fire department, but the tragedy has already begun. The result is likely to be great monetary loss, and in many cases injury or death. Sanford Fire Chief G.M. Harriett says this scenario accounts for 27 per cent of America's fire deaths every

Citing a report issued by the

Harriett says fires caused by smoking materials are the number one cause of fire deaths, followed by those stemming from furnishings being ignited by open flame. Third place in the gruesome ranking is held by a trio of firetypes: vehicle fires, burning clothing, and blazes caused by heating and cooking equipment. Harriett, who is approaching his 35th year as a fireman and his eleventh year as Fire Chief, says prevention remains the key to cutting down fire losses. Award-Winning Seminole County Gov't. Is Streamlined, Efficient

Seminole County government is the proud Hattaway and Republican Commissioners John recipient of a national award for a major reorganization effort which "streamlined" once bulky governmental operations.

Before the reorganization, 23 department chiefs reported directly to five elected county commissioners. Now. county government is run administratively by Roger Neisweneer, Seminole's new \$25,000-a-year executive assistant. Reporting directly to Neiswender and to the board are five departmental cheifs. Though Neiswender is responsible for day-to-day operations, elected

commissioners responsive to the voters are reponsible for the government's policy-making The national award came from the National Association of Counties (NACO) and was presented as an indication of the county's acheivements,

specifically reorganization In addition to Neiswender, the commission has created a new centralized purchasing department. The new department is responsible for all purchases for county officers. Prior to its inception, each department made its own purchases.

The department, in the long run, is geared to save the county thousands of dollars because it will be capable of buying needed items at cheaper prices through bulk purchases.

Neiswender says centralized purchasing will save county officials "money and time." Because of its low tax base, Seminole County remains an ideal location for new industry. During recent budget sessions, Seminole's commissioners held the line on land taxes. After much chopping, citizens will pay \$5.37 for each

\$1,000 worth of assessed property valuation. Last year, commissioners cut about \$21-million in budget requests to about \$18, million, the amount of the fiscal 1976-77 budget. For two years in a row the commission has protected the county's millage rates, and indications are next year the commission will do the same.

Democratic Commissioners Sid Vihlen Jr., Harry Politically, Vihlen and Hattaway won't be throughout the year. Kwiatkowski and Commission Chairman Mike

> In addition, county officials are attempting a switch to an in-house legal department, a move which some officials claim will save taxpayers around \$70,000 per year in legal fees.

All five commissioners have agreed to the need for the new legal department. All that remains is working out the details before two attorneys are hired to staff the new function. Taxpayers supported about \$206,000 in legal services last year. Officials beleive the job can be accomplished inhouse for somewhere in the neighborhood of from

\$115,000 to \$140,000. The new legal department, officials say, will reduce the need for \$90 an hour legal expertise provided by Alley, Alley & Blue of Tampa. Commissioners make decisions daily in a fine multi-million dollar courthouse, just a stone's throw

from scenic Lake Monroe in Sanford. In the not too distant future there will be a need for additional courthouse space. Although spacerequirement studies are under way, no official action has been taken which would determine where additional facilities will be located.

The City of Longwood is a thriving and growing community located east of I-4 and west of U.S. Hwy. 17-92 on either side of S.R. 434 in the northern fringe of the central Florida metropolitan district. It is really mid-way between Orlando in Orange County

and Sanford in Seminole County. City Clerk Onnie Shomate estimates the population in 1976 at 6,500. In June 1975 it was 6,005.

Vital statistics are: 4.8 square miles in Longwood; 59.9 miles of streets and roads; 49 city employees, (13 fulltime patrolmen and four fulltime firemen). There are 12 volunteer firemen to complement the firefighting force. Because there are so many lakes in Longwood, the firemen have a boat rescue unit.

Longwood was founded in 1878 by Edward Henck who came from Massachusetts, naming the community for a fashionable Boston suburb. The first building, the hotel, is still standing and is the historic site in Longwood. It was used as a winter resort for business tycoons and notables from New York and other northern states. Among those who visited was Ulysses S. Grant. Thirty-two governors attended a reception in 1927, one of the most notable events in the hotel's history. In more recent history, the Longwood Hotel was featured in the movie, "Johnny Tiger"

The population now is composed of native Floridians as well as many from other states. All ages are represented and all enjoy the wooded countryside, lakes, shopping centers and business district. Locals people are proud of the quiet community and the security it offers all.


There are many single family homes, apartments and condominiums in treed residential areas. Churches of all faiths are a vital part of the community. Several recreational programs for all ages are important to Longwood residents

The city is governed by a five-member council and mayor and there is adequate police and fire protection. The water system is maintained by the city. There is an excellent school system and Seminole Community College is close-by.

One of the main attractions in Longwood is the bird sanctuary and Big Tree Park near-by has two giant cypress trees estimated to be at least 3,500 years old! Longwood lists 305 businesses. Of these, 165 belong to the


In recognition of the coninuing growth of the College people of Seminole County and Central Florida, on July 1, 1975 the college name officially became Seminole Community

On its Tenth Anniversary the College enters Third Century America with positive plans for the future. Growth of the College is expected to continue with the expansion of Central Florida brought on by the space effort and Disneyworld. In 1980, it is forecast, the national 18 to 24 year old population will peak and then start a decline lasting until 1993. Meanwhile, the 25 to 54 year old age group wil become larger than the under 25 and will continue to grow throughout the rest of the century. 



The Bicentennial year was a time for looking back - but it was also a time for looking ahead. 

Since they operate in the black, with a surplus this year of \$40,000, it is not hard to understand. Celebration of their Centennial is going to be the big affair in Orange City this year. They plan an extensive parade on November 6, followed by a mammoth fish fry at Valentine Park in the afternoon. Festivities will conclude with a street


