

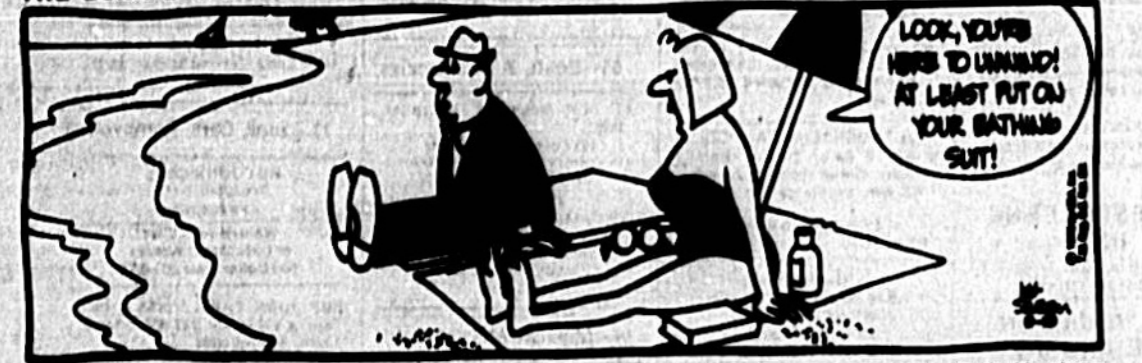

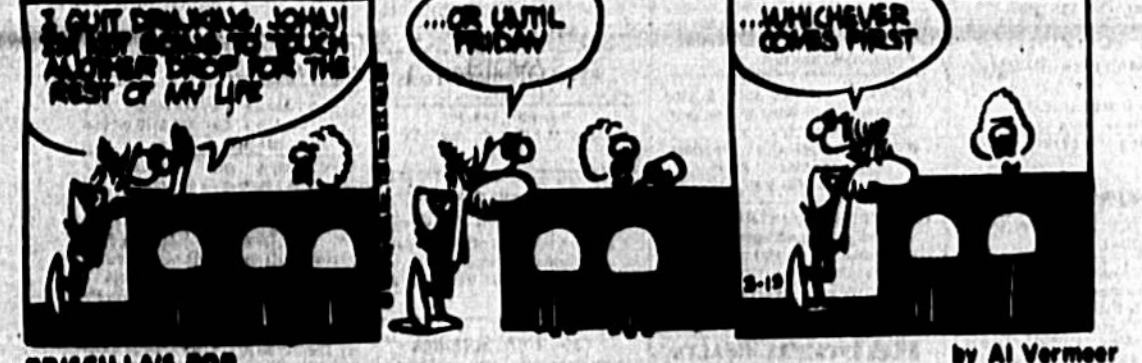

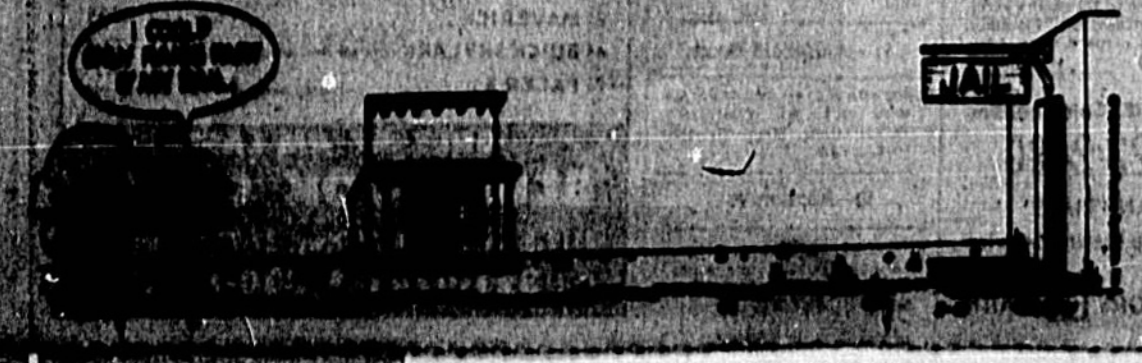

Beginning To Obey The Doctor's Orders

DEAR DR. LAMB — Why is it that most doctors will prescribe Lasix or digitalis and not tell the patient to make sure he takes it every single day? Also that they should drink a couple of glasses of orange juice or eat a banana a day for potassium?

You are absolutely right that people often tend to stop taking medicine as soon as they feel better rather than as long as the doctor told them to take it.

Yes, some fruit juice or a banana helps keep your potassium level up, and this also prevents some undesirable side effects of digitalis medicines that sometimes occur. People with heart problems and high blood pressure usually do better to limit their sodium salt and maintain adequate potassium intake.

DEAR DR. LAMB — My three teenage children have a 1-41 which they play with the volume very high. In fact, it is deafening. I claim that it will damage their hearing if they continue to listen to it with the volume as high.

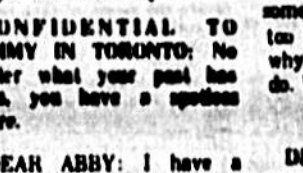
