ALTAMONTE SPRINGS - Appeal to the 'adult' book shop recently opened east of the city's limits on SR 436 was made by freshman Councilman Donald Myers last night.

Expressing in firm tones his "shock" at the content of the material sold in the new shop which he saw in a personal visit the night before, Myers said it was almost unbelievable. "If they want to read that kind of material, let them go to Orlando," the new councilman declared. "It leaves nothing to the

imagination. As a kid I read my share of spicy Westerns, but never anything like this." In an interview following the meeting, Myers, visibly upset, said the shop is selling the worst type of pornography depicting various types of sexual deviation.

The councilman said he hopes the shop's county occupational license is rescinded and the business encouraged to move some place else. He added that the location of the shop appears to be a violation of the zoning of the area, according to information included in maps prepared by city planners, Harlan Hanson, Al Lewis and George Hoffman.

Mayor Lawrence Swofford added that a group of women visited his office this week seeking approval to march on the shop and form a picket line. He said they were discouraged from taking that action.

Press Freedom To Inform Threatened

State laws offer only limited protection - a

Defining the exact boundaries of the First Amendment guarantee that Congress shall make no laws "abridging the freedom of speech of the press" never has been easy. Nor can we expect it ever will be. The right of the press to operate within boundaries of responsible freedom is essential under the Constitution of the United States of America.

By the same token, the Sixth Amendment assures the citizen a right to a "speedy and public trial." In the broadcast sense the citizen also is entitled to a government that exists by his own consent.

We are witnessing a conflict of these three rights as the nation debates the exact power of the media to gather news as well as their rights to publish what they gather.

Last June the Supreme Court ruled in a 5 to 4 decision that Earl Caldwell, a reporter for the New York Times, must testify before a grand jury about information he had gathered while covering Black Panther activities. Mr. Caldwell insisted his rights as a reporter permitted him to reject the grand jury subpoena, even though the government was concerned about possible threats to the President and violent attempts to overthrow the government.

In forcing Mr. Caldwell to appear, however, the court left unsettled the question of whether the government should be required to show there

United Against A Common Foe

In the troubled world of the 1970s, there are few areas probably in which 79 nations could be in full agreement.

Environmental protection is one of them. Delegates to a two-week conference in London have just given preliminary approval to a treaty instituting strict controls over wastes dumped into the oceans.

When formally ratified, the pact will pledge governments to monitor and regulate the polluting actions of their own ships and of foreign ships operating from their ports. The treaty bans completely disposal at sea of nerve gas, DDT, high-level radioactive wastes and other substances which resist decomposition.

The agreement was called "a historic step toward the control of global pollution" by Russell E. Train, chairman of the President's Council on Environmental Quality and leader of the U.S. delegation.

And it emphasized the universal understanding that pollution regognizes no territorial waters, no ideological differences, no "balance of power."

The fact of the matter is that new laws probably are not needed. The problem of media rights under the First Amendment has been magnified out of proportion. The government has withheld legitimate public information. The courts have been overzealous in protecting their own interests. The press far too often has acted as if its rights were paramount and absolute.

In all this, the real target has been lost — the right of the citizen to be fully informed, legally protected and to have a responsive government.

To restore the bounds will require more moderate behavior and a lowering of voices on the part of all parties concerned - not a welter of new laws that will serve only to confuse and delay the solution to the problem.

Unusual Murder

Japan Shocked By Mercy Killings

Kyodo - Copley News Service

A string of spectacular mercy killings, including the murder of a paralyzed man by his aging father, has set off a stormy debate here.

Japan, which has adopted Western styles of dress and business practices, seems also to have gotten itself involved in the question of euthanasia which has plagued Western society for centuries. It has touched off a moral and legal debate that is argued

in Japanese courts and probed in the daily newspaper. The debate began in October, when an old woman in Tokyo strangled her bedridden husband, then tried to kill

Rescued by relatives, the old woman was not arrested by

year-old man strangled his son, who was bedridden with

The old man said it was "time to end my son's life" because the paralytic would not be able to care for himself it the father died. Sawako Ariyoshi, author of the Japanese best-seller

"The Ecstatic Ones," angrily called the killings a crime. She argued that old people should not be killed, but that the state's system of caring for the old and disabled should be

A noted law professor, on the other hand, strongly defended mercy killings. Tadashi Uematsu, a professor at Hitotsubashi Univer-

sity, said the decision to kill must be made by a doctor but anyone could be the executioner. Uematsu advocated four standards for mercy killings: the patient must be facing certain death and suffering from

intolerable pains, he must want to be killed and the killing must not be painful. Interestingly enough, Japanese courts have said that murders performed under these standards should not be

treated as ordinary murder cases. While the current controversy was raging, Japanese were shocked to hear an Australian doctor admit she had deliberately killed 300 cancer patients, and add that British doctors commonly allow deformed babies to die.

effort to make a cost-effective weapon out of the "absolutely incredible" laser, two other federal agencies have found a new and A team of experimenters from the National Aeronautics and Space Administration's Langley (Va.)

Research Center, in cooperation with the Environmental Protection Agency, has developed a laser which will detect air pollution gases discharged from industrial smokestacks.

NASA calls the effort "a major advance in air pollution monitoring The experiment by the Langley experts employs a telescope-

Pollutants, such as sulfur dioxide one of the worst to befoul the air and one often present in industrial exhaust, reflect light having a specific frequency which is detected through special optical filters attached to the laser.

Laser is an acronym for "Light Amplification by Stimulated Emission of Radiation." Thus lasers are sharply focused powerful, pencil-thin beams of concentrated light that move at the speed of light, or 186,000 miles per second.

EPA's National Environmental Research Center, located near Durham, N. C., is interested in using the laser device for remote sensing of many kinds of industrial plants. The laser is believed to be accurate up to one kilometer (3,300 feet) from Heretofore, EPA investigators

inserting probes into the base of a plant stack, a complicated process. As NASA put it: "Remote observations with a portable instrument, such as the Langley laser, have an advantage in that measurements can be made

specifically without inconveniencing

the plant operator." The laser detector is accurate only at night. During daylight, background scattering of light impedes the accuracy. But night observations are highly desirable anyway since many industrial plants emit a large amount of their pollutants after dark.

Affluence: We Are At a Loss With It By BRUCE BIOSSAT

WASHINGTON (NEA) It is not to diminish the problems of the still disadvantaged to contend, as some astute young men in this town are doing, that the deeper problems of this and perhaps all western society are the dilemmas which come with

For a long, long time, we in this country especially, assumed that the development of our obvious natural riches and the spreading of this wealth over more and more people would bring us into some sort of trouble-free

The brutally painful lesson of this age is that it has not worked out this way at all. We have gained affluence as has no other society, only to learn that it offers its own grave problems and we don't have any very good solutions for them so far.

One of my bright young friends is, it seems to me, right on the track when he says no politician or other public figure in this nation is really addressing himself to this Too many such figures are still telling us that the big

thing to do is feel guilty about the lingering problems of the poor. Again, to say that they are wrong is not to demean the difficulties of the poor nor to suggest their "benign neglect." It is simply to argue that we need to come awake to the more profound things troubling this

The plainest truth is that we don't know what to do with affluence. At least in American society we have discovered that it produces an incredible sense of emptiness and boredom. It robs us of challenge, and we are finding that continuing challenge is essential to vibrant life. These are not new themes. They have been expressed before. But it is entirely true that our public figures don't

know how to approach them. If they speak of challenge, they talk of finding it in older problems of lesser force. The boredom and emptiness show themselves, of course, endless ways. They are visible on the surface, in meaningless motion for motion's sake (youngsters driving about with nowhere to go), with "we will enjoy" vacationers busy not enjoying themselves, with countless folk merely lounging about as if the object of living were just

to get through the day. The young loungers are a sad sight. They may not think so. As they drape themselves in postures of languor in public places, they may tell you soberly they are "turned

off and tuned out. At root, that is a confession of emptiness. Think what their days must be like, how bare must be their store of memories. "Let's see, what did we do Wednesday? Oh,

ves, that was the afternoon we sat on the steps of the

Those who don't lounge but do in fact work may tell you their lives are boring, whether they sit at desks or abor on factory lines. Who can doubt it? Work in this society, from the assembly line to the professor's narrowgauge study, is overspecialized.

What we need is a fuller, richer view and a broader quest in living. We have indeed made the seeking of material things our goal. When the search succeeds, as it has for many millions, what follows then? As in the necessary routine of simply existing, so with some tasks in an industrial society: They are inherently



One Man's Opinion Nader's Foes His **Best Supporters**

Tackling possibly his most immovable object to date. sometimes irresistible force Ralph Nader last year undertook a senator-by-senator, representative-by-representative study of Congress. Turning his raiders loose, he compiled a composite report, in sometimes revealing detail, on who is who in both houses, and how they function. The intent was to make Congress more comprehensible and therefore theoretically more responsive to ordinary

citizens, countering the pressures of special interests. But guess who has been making the report-available as a series of individual profiles at \$1 per congressman-a Capitol Hill best seller? None other than lobbyists for A survey by one newspaper, the New York Post, identi-

fied 25 purchasers of the reports, ranging from the American Medical Association and the National Association of Machinists to the Republican party. Not all feel they got their money's worth, however,

There really isn't much new in the profiles for International Telephone and Telegraph, a spokesman noted. "We know as much about Congress as Nader." Which is probably true, considering the hard way I.T.T. has gone about acquiring its knowledge. There is, of course, nothing surprising in this. Knowing

his congressmen is the very essence of the lobbyist's trade. And whether lobbying in general is good or bad depends much on point of view, on whose interests are being pushed-or shoved. One of the special interests finding the report "must"

reading is the National Association of Railroad Passengers, generally viewed, except in certain corporate headquarters, as a "good" lobby.

The Nader staff itself is taking a generous view of the situation, seeing, in fact, the interest in the report as a "compliment" since when it comes to understanding how Congress operates, the lobbyists are there first as experts. But it does raise a question. With enemies such as General Motors making his name a household word and now the special interests making the Congress report a best seller, does Nader need friends any more?

County Board Actions

An ordinance to implement the water pollution control contract was presented to the Board of County Commissioners for consideration by Pollution Control Officer, Langley Adair and County Attorney, Howard Marsee. Since Adairis the enforcing arm of the State Pollution Board in Seminole County, the enactment of this ordinance

would mean that state laws would also be city law. The ordinance relates to the prevention, regulation and control of air and water pollution within Seminole County. It provides for coooperation between the County and the State department of Poliution Control, creating a Seminole section within the State department of Control to assist in the operation of the department.

The ordinance is enacted under the Home Rule Power of the County for the purposes of preventing, regulating and controlling air and water pollution from all sources with the county. Pollution situations identified in the ordinance include those which constitute a menance to the health and welfare of the citizens, creates a public nuisance; is harmful to plant and animal life; and impairs domestic agricultural, industrial, recreational and other beneficial uses of air and

The Board approved the ordinance which now must be approved by the State Department of Pollution Control. Following the approval by the state, the County will set a public hearing on the ordinance.

Work Sessions With Cities

Work sessions will be scheduled for Monday with the cities of Altamonte Springs, and Casselberry to discuss their road participation projects as presented to the County for consideration. Winter Springs asked to have their meeting with the county delayed until after the first of the year, and the City of Longwood said that they would have no programs to discuss until next year. The City of Sanford has already presented the necessary paper work so no meeting is necessary, according to Chairman Greg Drummond.

Last Thursday, several of the commissioners met with the county engineer and the road superintendent to work on Phase two of the county road program, including the participation projects with the cities.

J.C. Lavender, road superintendent asked authority to begin work on projects not requiring engineering in order to maintain an orderly work schedule for the road department crews and machinery. Those projects approved for immediate work by the road department include resurfacing Hiawatha Avenue from 17-92 to the city limits; widening resurfacing of old S.R. 46 (from New S.R. 46 to S-431), at an section 24 feet wide on Orange Blvd. (between old S.R. 46 to new S.R. 46), cost, \$5,000; resurface Oxford Road from English Estates, northward to the northern school boundary, at a cost of \$4,000; widen and resurface Airport Blvd. (from SR 46 to Railroad tracks), cost, \$8600; resurface Narcissus Avenue east and west of Riverview Avenue, at a cost of \$1500.

Commissioner John Kimbrough, who was absent from the work session on Thursday, asked that SR 15-A through Lake Mary, ending at SR 427, be included in the overall road program. He said that he had had many complaints about the shoulders of the road and the very bad condition of the road itself. Engineering for curbs and gutters will be necessary before the work can be done, but it was placed on the projected road program.

The work sessions will be held in the new commission chambers on Monday morning. "We are doing this this way in order to involve all cities in the county," Drummond ex-

Landfill For Wastes

Effective December 15, the City of Sanford will no longer accept waste from septic tank clean-out trucks, according to Pollution Control Officer, Langley Adair.

"There is no other sewage treatment plant in Seminole County which will accept this waste. To prevent the illegal disposal of the waste in orange groves, vacant land and streams, I recommend that the Osceola Sanitary Landfill be utilized for the disposal." He suggested that fees could be set accordingly and the

The City of Oviedo has requested that requests for permits be handled through their city hall in order to avoid long trips into Sanford by their residents for this

Chairman Greg Drummond said that if the City of Oviedo is allowed this privilege, then so should all six cities within the county. He further stated that he did not recommend that the cities follow this policy, but he did recognize the convenience to the cities this would allow.

The problems of co-ordinating the pickup of these papers was solved by a recommendation that the cities return them either to the South Branch Courthouse or to the Sanford of-

Adair was given the responsibility for the supervision of this program of participation. He said that Winter Springs has no septic tanks and there are only a few in the City of Sanford. He said that he anticipates no particular problems with the remaining cities of Oviedo, Altamonte Springs, Longwood and Casselberry.

Parents and some politicians had demanded at least \$46 million. The latest offer, which would work out to about \$80,835 per child, got a mixed reception. But there was no rush to accept it.
