DEAR GOV. KIRK — Hey, why don't you forget about trying to save the Naval Air Station for us. . . . Claude, we've resigned to the fact we're gonna lose the base and you keep on playing politics. . . . Why not just buy out and have a good time on your trip to Europe and Israel? (I'll write to Nassar who's comin' and peddle our orange juice.

DEAR SEN. SMATHERS — George — Maybe you know we're applying for this Model City grant. . . . Now listen George. . . . We've been supporting you for many years. . . . Now you gotta help us. 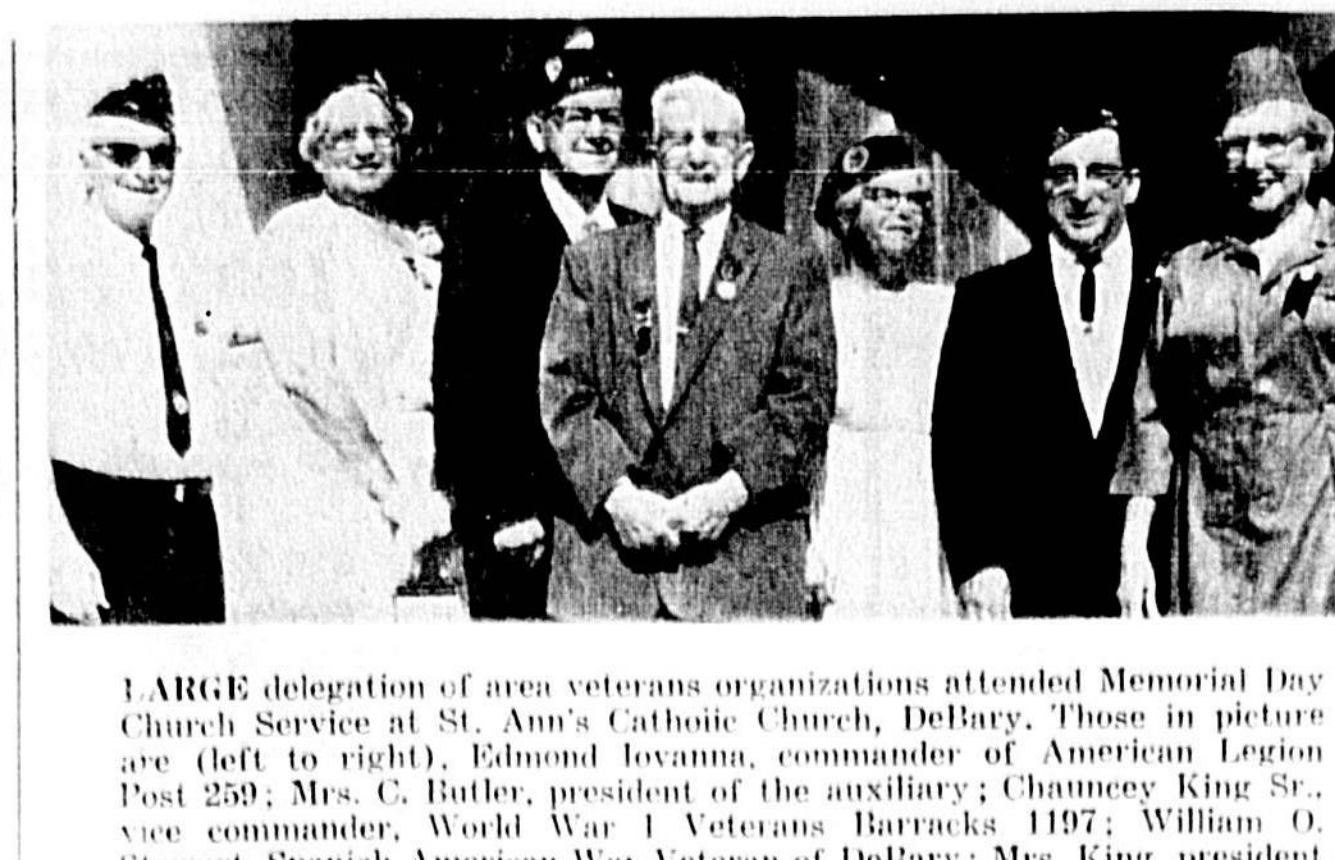
