

Persian Gulf War **Perils Oil Supplies**

The war between Iraq and Iran is not just another war between undeveloped nations nursing an ancient grudge. Instead it is a conflict that threatens the economic lifeline of the industrialized world - the stream of oil tankers that

plies the Persian Gulf. The elegant shops and imposing financial districts of New York City, London, Paris and Tokyo seem a world removed from the harsh and primitive conditions of life in Southwest Asia. And yet their wealth, their advanced civilization, their basic economics are utterly dependent upon a continuing supply of oil from the Middle East.

It is impossible to overstate the importance of the Strait of Hormuz to the national interest of the United States. Continuing passage of the oil

tankers is vital to us and to our allies. This distinguishes the danger in Southwest Asia from the disastrous U.S. involvement in Southeast Asia. In Vietnam, our vital economic interests were not at stake. In the Persian Gulf, they are. In his State of the Union message in January, President Carter enunciated the Carter doctrine. a statement that any threat from the Soviet Union to the oil supply in the Persian Gulf region would be resisted, by military force if necessary. The move into Afghanistan late last year put the Russian bear in position to move toward the gulf from advanced military bases.


