### Florida Advances In Registrations For New Babies

JACKSONVILLE, - (Special) Flerida has come a long way in tightening up on birth registra-tions but there still are some babies who go unlisted in vital statistics records despite laws requiring such registrations, says State Health Officer Wilson T.

"We have just been informed by the Mattenal Office of Vitat fitatistics," Dr. Sowder added, "that a national test made by the U. S. Bureau of the Census following the 1950 population survey, showed that during that year, 97.5 per cent of all births in Florida were registered. This figure is about the same as the national average. Following the 1940 census a similar test showed that during that year only 89.9 per cent of

to law," he stated. The Florida State Board of Health is charged with the legal responsibility of maintaining the zinte's vital statistics records.

Dr. Sowder reported that fifteen of the state's 67 counties made a 100 per cent showing on birth registrations during 1950. Those counties were Brevard, Charlotte, Citrus, DeSoto, Flagler, Gulf, Hardee, Hendry, Hernando, Liber-ty, Okeechobee, Osceola, St. Jonhs, Suwannee and Wakulla.

Counties singled out for show ing the most progress in improving registration procedure during the 10-year period were Okeecho-bee and Madison.

Counties where records fell below 90 per cent completeness in-Union, Clay, Collier, Dixle, Gilchrist, Glades, Marion, Taylor and Washington.

Everett Williams, director of the State Board of Health Bureau of Vital Statistics, declared: The sate law requires that all births be registered by the re-aponsible attendant at birth with-in 10 days after the birth occurs. Failure to achieve 100 per cent completeness of registration indicates that a few physicians and midwives have failed to comply with the state law. Parents should be on guard to make sure they receive a notification of birth reof Health within three months af-

The birth registration test, sec ond of its kind in the nation's history, was conducted by the Public Health Service and State health departments is coopera-Commerce Bureau of the Census. A birth certificate was described as a person's "deed to citizenship," containing information which is becoming increasingly more important for purposes of entering school, inheriting property, collecting life insurance and old age benefits, obtaining a passport, pilot's license and for other port, pilot's license and for other purposes, including obtaining emnent in certain industries

and occupations. Only in recent years has a birth restificate become so important, it was stated. Almost half of the 88,000,000 native-born adults of 20 years and over lack this essen-ital document and in many cases they must go to considerable trouble to collect the necessary evidence of proof of birth. Now chances are 98 out of 100 that today's baby will have a birth certificate properly recorded when he reaches an age that he will begin to need it for identifica-


