

Perhaps there never was a time in history when un-ployment was as great as it has been during this de-ssion. Perhaps there never was a time before when so many bank failures cost the people their lifetime's savings.
But a broken leg hurts worse when it is beginning to heal.
After it is well, we forget that it eyer hurt at all.

So we suggest that readers consider carefully the following lines from the President's message to Congress:

'The existence of an alarming and extraordinary business situation, involving the welfare and prosperity of all our people, has constrained me in call forether in extra assign the neonle's remained.

to call together in extra session the people's representatives in Congress, to the end that through a wise and patriotic exercise of the legislative duty, with which they solely are charged, present evils may be mitigated and dangers threatening

the future may be averted.

Our unfortunate financial plight is not the result of untoward events nor of conditions related to our natural resources, nor is it traceable to any of the afflictions which frequently check national growth and prosperity. With plenteous crops, with abundant promise of remunerative production and manufacture, with unusual invitation to safe investment, and with satisfactory assurance to business enterprise, suddenly financial distrust and fear have aprung up on every side. Numerous mon-eyed institutions have suspended because abundant assets were not immediately available to meet the demands of frightened depositors. Surviving corporations and individuals are content to keep in hand the money they are usually anxious to loan, and those engaged in legitimate business are surprised to find that the securities they offer for loans, though heretofore satisfactory, are no longer accepted. Values supposed to be fixed are fast becoming conjectural, and loss and failure have invaded every branch of business.

That sounds almost surely as if it might have been taken from President Roosevelt's opening message to Congress.
