'He Didn't Know The Gun Was Loaded'

The 12-year-old Sanford boy who shot and killed a twoand-one-half-year-old Lake Mary boy in a rural Sanford trailer Thursday did not know the .30 caliber rifle he used was loaded, according to his father Jesse J. Lee, 42, Lot 11 Pinecrest Trailer Park, Sanford.

Lee said today his son had taken the loaded rifle from a gun rack in the master bedroom of his home. The master bedroom, where the rifle was kept on a walltype gun rack, is next to the bathroom where Michael Eric Smith, son of Mrs. Steven Bauder, 457 Crystal Lake Ave...

Lake Mary, was shot, said Lee. The 25-year-old father is a refrigeration serviceman at Bauder Associates in Sanford. The mother, Delores, 24, is a bookkeeper at Northgate Tire Center in Orlando. Seminole County Medical Examiner Dr. G. V. Garay ruled today the cause of death was due to external

Garay performed an autopsy on the body this morning at eminole Memorial Hospital.

"He had sat down for the noon meal," Lee said today of Eric. "He hadn't eaten but just a little bit when he had to go to the bathroom."

The shooting occurred in the bathroom, according to Lee, not in the bedroom as had been reported earlier. Lee said he jumped to his feet when he heard the shot and ran to the bathroom. There he found Eric on the floor. Lee remembers checking Eric to see if he could feel a pulse, he said. However, he was too shaken to tell if the

"I was shakin' so bad I don't have no idea if he had a "You just don't expect this sort of thing to happen,"

Lee went to the telephone in his trailer and called the

Seminole County Sheriff's Department, he said. The

sheriff's department summoned an ambulance. Lee

Lee, who used the gun for hunting, said his 12-year-old son had accompanied him on hunting trips and was familiar with the use of guns. However, he ruled out the possibility of his son loading the gun.

"Apparently it had to have been loaded, he would not have had time to load the gun," Lee said of his son. Lee said his son is in a "dazed condition."

"I don't think he can believe it happened," said Lee. The 12-year-old Lee youth was staying home from Liberty Christian School, 2626 Palmetto Ave., Sanford, because of classroom problems, said his father.

"It wasn't that he was being bad or anything, he just wasn't paying attention to his school work," Lee said of his son's dismissal from classes. Lee described Eric, as the Smith boy was known,

"one in a million." "He was just like a member of the family to all of us."



WARSAW, Poland (UPI) — Rescue workers labored under floodlights in near-zero temperatures early today in a search for victims in a bank explosion that killed at least 41 people and injured 110 others, official sources said. Unconfirmed reports in Warsaw said a welder's oxygen tank exploded and touched off the blast, which occurred during lunchtime Thursday while the Polish Savings Bank was jammed with people.





Tokyo: The dollar held firm against the yen today, finishing at 200.45 compared with Thursday's close of 200.30 in quiet trading that saw \$343 million change hands.

Abu Dhabi, United Arab Emirates: Persian Gulf oil producer Abu Dhabi has boosted the price of its crude oil by 7 percent and Qatar and Iraq also are demanding premiums during the Iranian oil shutdown.

Washington: Treasury Secretary Michael Blumenthal says the price of oil in the United States should rise as a means of encouraging conservation.

Detroit: Ford Motor Co. reported record worldwide sales in 1978 sent profits soaring to \$1.589 billion for the second year in a row, but company officials say a nine-week strike at plants in England and spiraling domestic production costs shaved the actual profit margin.

New York: The Federal Reserve Bank says the nation's basic money supply rose to a seasonally adjusted average of \$360.2 billion during the week ending Feb. 7 - a gain of

Washington: The Commerce Department says business inventories increased by a little more than one-half of 1 percent in December, but sales were ahead by 1 percent all of which probably reflects inflationary conditions Washington: The Federal Reserve Board says American industrial output rose by onetenth of 1 percent

Lopez Portillo is not about to allow Mexico's resources to be depleted without something in

A possible bargain may be worked out if the U.S. would cooperate in developing industries along the border to help reduce Mexico's excessive

Lopez Portillo also is reported to be seeking trade concessions from Washington for a variety of products in exchange for petroleum.

Early reports indicate that Mr. Carter's visit has not been the most harmonious or cordial in history. And it's easy to understand why. With the entire world casting a lecherous eve

on its oil. Mexico finds itself in an enviable bargaining position. For too long, many in Mexico including its president — are claiming, Mexico has been all but ignored by the rest of the world.

Now, they figure, it's different — and the Mexico president and his associates are playing this new-found role and respect to the hilt. Who can blame them?

Over the years, this nation has made unfulfilled promises to Mexico. It is important that this doesn't happen again and that Mexico is treated as a respected neighbor.

Now more than ever, we need Mexico's oil. The disruption in Iran threatens to cut off that source of oil for some time to come, perhaps indefinitely.

We enjoy a surplus of domestic natural gas at

present but the oversupply is sure to be temporary. We will soon need Mexico's gas and we should pay for it at the going rate. Passage of the energy bill last year should clear the way for meaningful negotiations with Mexico on the price of gas.

We can only hope that the United States and Mexico, two American neighbors, can work things out and agree on an ongoing mutually constructive and productive relationship.

SCA-School Lease Sought

The re-roofing is being done to correct leaks in the roofs.

Velocipedes, Boneshakers, Bicycles

The velocipede (swift walker) of the early 1800s was the granddaddy of the modern bicycle.

It had a wooden frame with 2 wheels. The rider sat on a seat and pushed it along with his

Velocipedes were also called dandy horses because they were very popular with the dandies, or fancily dressed young men of the times.

In 1839 a Scotsman MacMillan added pedals which turned the rear wheel and in 1862 Ernest Michaux of France made a velocipede with the front wheel larger than the rear.

Later models made in the U.S. were called boneshakers because the iron-rimmed 2 wheelers jarred the riders so.

By 1877 rubber tires and wire-spoked wheels were added and the front wheels grew in diameter to 5 and 6 feet. This gave the bike extra speed, but was risky to ride.

In England they were nicknamed penny farthings because the large front wheel and small rear were proportioned similar to the

large English penny and the smaller farthing.
Henry Lawson of England developed the
safety bicycle that resembled bikes of today with the two wheels of equal size and a chain drive on the rear wheel.

From the late 1800s through the turn of the century the popularity of the bicycle grew rapidly — with adults, not youngsters. It was the height of fashion and was the first step forward from the horse and buggy.



YOUNGSTERS' BICYCLES OF TODAY different from early 1900s

Mrs. Amelia Bloomer thought up the Turkish-styled pants that made it easier for women to ride. The change in women's clothing from bloomers to slacks, culottes, pedal pushers, and shorts has been brought about largely by the bicycle.




