TALLAHASSEE, July 7. (AP) The Florida Pardon Board refused today to commute the death sentence of Franklin Pierce McCall tob he \$10,000 ransom kidnaping of James Bailey Cash. Jr., at Prometon, Fla., on May 29.

Its decision was announced after a boot eventure session following a plea by McCall's attorney for commutation, and by his prosecutor that the death sentence be carried out. The board's decount was automiced without comment and came after a 15 niquie deliberation

The next step will be for Gov. Fred P. Cone to sign the death warrant unless this is delayed by tome court Action.

McCall pleaded gudty to kidnaping the child, who also was killed. He did not appeal to the supreme court after he was sentenced but his attorney indicated there might be an appeal, McCall's wife and mother, and
