

TALLAHASSEE, Nov. 6.—(AP)
-Although Governor Martin did not definitely say that it was his intention to do so, he indicated that he would include the proposed establishment, of certain industries at the Raiford penitentiary in his announcement of general legiclature for the forthcoming special session of the state legislature.

The placing of plants at the penitentiary for the manufacture of shoes and antomobile tags is particularly advocated by the ex-ecutive. The shoes, Governor Martin said, would be made available for all charges of the state, and the tags would eliminate the necemity of purchasing them each year from the Maryland penitenti-

There are about 5,500 persons dependent in one way or another upon the state, the governor pointed out, and between 300,000 and 400,000 automobile tags are purchased annually from the Maryland penitentiary. If the shoes and toes were made at the Florida penitentiary, he said, the saving to the state would be enor-

A deficit of \$90,000 or more is shown at the Raiford penitentiary the governor said, which, he added was small when one cisidered the limited facilities there.


