## **Just Another Big Give-Away?**

Washington after January, one of the priority items for presidential review will be the Law of the Sea treaty that is nearing completion. A new administration would be well-advised to reject any such treaty.

Reports from Geneva indicated that a treaty will be ready in the near future. Years of haggling have gone into this treaty. The result, it appears, is that the United States will end up with the short end of the stick.

While the treaty can contain some sensible provisions on navigation issues, its basic feature is that the world's oceans would be designated the "common heritage" of mankind. The oceans are no such thing. There's absolutely no justification for allowing landlocked countries to make decisions regarding oceanic matters or to benefit from the wealth on the seabed.

In recent years, scientists have learned that there are vast deposits of nickel, cobalt, manganese, copper and other minerals on and under the ocean floor. One day, these minerals will be developed by countries with the capability for undersea mining. Why in the world should the United States agree to share this wealth with 156

Currently, the United States is the only country with the capability of conducting undersea mining acronym for the three groups of beneficiaries, on a large scale. U.S. companies have invested huge sums in the technology needed for such mining. They should be allowed to proceed immediately to utilize that technology wherever it can be applied.

blindness caused by diabetes. But an eye operation called vitrectorny is proving successful in restoring sight to many diabetic retinopathy victims and is becoming accepted across the nation and the world, according to the University of Florida Shand's Teaching Hospital.

Marsha Smith, a Jacksonville housewife, endured a gradual loss of sight beginning in 1976 and by April of this year was almost totally blind. But microsurgery at Shands proved successful in restoring sight in her left eye last

With better than 20-50 visual acuity, she was able to return to reading books and self-

A few weeks ago, Ms. Smith, 40, underwent a second vitrectomy in her right eye, with equally good results and return of vision. Vitrectomy is the bit-by-bit removal of clouded membranes and blood inside the vitreous of the eye. The vitreous is normally a clear gelatin-like material inside the eye. When it becomes clouded, light no longer can reach the retina, the "film" in the camera of the eye.

Diabetes frequently causes a proliferation of new blood vessels within the vitreous. Although the disease progresses slowly, the abnormal blood vessels eventually burst and bleed, filling the eye with fluid. Dr. Constance Fitzgerald, professor of op-

thalmology and eye surgeon with the UF College of Medicine, said if the disease is detected early enough, the tiny blood vessels can be burned and destroyed by the intense light of a laser. But she said recent refinements on surgical technique and instrumentation, including a surgical microscope designed especially for vitrectomies, have greatly improved the success rate in restoring sight and reducing com-

plications in more advance cases of diabetic "The use of special fiberoptic light illuminate the interior of the eye, as well as specially made cutting instruments and a diathermy system for coagulating broken blood vessels during surgery make it easier to avoid

damage to normal eye structures," she said.

Vitrectomy was developed by Dr. Robert Machemer at the Bascom Palmer Eye Institute in Miami and was first performed there in 1970.

Fitzgerald said. She joined one of Machemer's first surgical training courses and during the past seven years has performed the operation on more than 400 patients at Shands.

Vitrecomy, also works to save the sight of persons who suffer severe injuries to the eye. "When a hard or sharp object penetrates the eye, there is more than the expected problem of bleeding inside the eye," Fitzgerald said. "In many cases fibrous tissue develops inside the vitreous within 72 hours after the injury. If no corrective measures are taken, retinal detachment may occur within three weeks, leading to permanent blindness.

"The good news is that many of these trauma patients can expect to have their sight saved by vitrectomy if the damage to the vitreous is detected soon after the injury and if surgery is performed right away."

Although success rates vary with the severity of the eye injury, she said some trauma patients who underwent vitrectomy at Shands now have visual acuity between 20-30 and 20-50.

Maravich 'Tired' Of Game, **Quits Celtic Training Camp** 

NEW ORLEANS (UPI) - Pete Maravich, who once ead the National Basketball Association in scoring but now has "simply tired of the game," has quit. With his elusive dream of playing for an NBA nampionship team becoming less likely than ever, the backup guard quietly left the Boston Celtics' training camp Saturday and retired. Maravich did not announce his retirement and was unavailable to repor-

"I've shot too many baskets," Maravich told Celtic Coach Bill Fitch.

Maravich, 32, played a key role in the Celtics' stretch drive last year after joining them as a free agent. He entered the NBA in 1970 - signing with the Atlanta Hawks for a reported \$1.9 million during a bidding war with the American Basketball Association - and joined the New Orleans Jazz for five frequently bitter years after four with the Hawks.

"I guess he just lost his enthusiasm," said his father, Press Maravich, who coached "Pistol Pete" when he was a ster at Louisiana State. "He was a great player," said Fitch. "The door-is . open if he wants to change his mind. But I don't think he will. It wasn't the physical part of the camp that bothered him. He was simply tired of the game."
