

Area Bus Hassle: No Service Until Strike Accord Reached

More than 200 Seminole Counties who ride the Orange-Seminole-Osceola Transportation Authority's Altamonte Springs bus daily were without service today. They probably will not receive service again until their bus drivers' strike is resolved, according to an Authority official.

The Seminole County route is in the second group of the company's two-part priority schedule for restoring bus service, according to Robert Lorch, general manager of the Authority.

"We're hoping we can restore service as soon as possible with the drivers who respond to our final offer," Lorch said today. As of this morning none of the drivers on the Altamonte Springs route had responded to the authority's offer to work, according to Lorch. However, there were no pickets along that route.

"They don't have any pickets along the line," commented Lorch. "They are picketing here at the authority offices."

"There have been no reports of violence," and we don't expect any," said Lorch.

Bus service stopped at 12:01 a.m. Sunday, according to Lorch, when bus drivers and mechanics belonging to the Amalgamated Transit Union Local 1333 effectively began their strike.

The union voted to strike Friday after the authority rejected a union move to seek binding arbitration. Under the union plan, a federal mediator would have been brought in to help resolve labor-management differences.

The Authority's final offer to the union called for an additional holiday; increased insurance benefits; cost of living raises and a 10-cent-per-hour pay raise this year with an additional eight-cent-per-hour pay hike next April.

Union officials have been calling for higher pay hikes and more overtime pay.

The Authority will hold its regularly scheduled monthly meeting Wednesday, according to Lorch. However, no change in the authority's thinking is anticipated.

"It will be just a regular monthly meeting," said Lorch. "We'll bring them (Authority board members) up to date on the status of things at that time, but so far as we're concerned we've been instructed to stand pat on our offer and we intend to do just that."

Talks between the Authority and representatives of the union are at a standstill.

"We're ready to meet with them anytime and anywhere," Lorch said. "We're ready to meet with them anytime and anywhere."

Plug Gas Leak

TAMPA (UPI) — An emergency crew stopped an overland gas leak from an overland tank truck early today, ending off a cloud of deadly gas that forced the evacuation of several hundred residents in suburban Clear Lake City.

No one was reported injured by the escaping gas, but the tank truck driver was killed and two other motorists were hurt in the three-way accident.

Emergency workers plugged the leaking tank at 6:30 a.m. and a gas leak ended the emergency leak — caused by the U.S. Grease Chemical Co. — from a tank and placed it on another trailer rig for transport out of the area.

Joseph Travolta II, of Tampa, was killed when a van ran a stop sign and plowed into the tanker truck he was driving at 10:30 p.m. 197 Sunday in Clear Lake City, the Florida Highway Patrol said.

The driver of the van was identified as 29-year-old Albert Bourgeois, a professional wrestler known as "The Mad Mad Man."

Economic Summit Lines Up Carter, World Leaders

WASHINGTON (UPI) — President Carter will attend the economic summit in Bonn July 16-17 with the leaders of Canada, France, West Germany, Italy, Japan and Great Britain, the White House announced today.

Carter accepted the invitation of West German Chancellor Helmut Schmidt to attend the meeting which "will provide an occasion for the participants to review the world economic situation and to give impetus to new cooperation in a broader world economy," officials said.

Somalia Smashes Coup

MOGADISHU, Somalia (UPI) — Somalia said today all the rebellious officers who staged an abortive coup against President Siyad Barre had been arrested and the situation inside the country was back to normal.

News reports said a number of senior officials were killed during the abortive, two-hour rebellion Sunday. But it was not known if they were part of the government or rebel forces.

All the rebels have been arrested and placed in custody. "We believe the coup was an unfortunate mistake," said an Information Ministry spokesman on Sunday. "The situation in the country is completely normal."

Israel Alert Fizzles

TEL AVIV, Israel (UPI) — Police reports of a Palestinian guerrilla raid Sunday and hundreds of troops, police and civil defense volunteers on a massive security alert along the coast of Israel coinciding with the Yom Kippur holiday prompted an immediate investigation of forces almost a month after 11 Palestinian commandos landed on the coast and killed 35 persons in the worst carnage ever inflicted by terrorists in Israel.

A Message From Aldo Moro

ROME (UPI) — The Italian government announced today it had received a letter from Aldo Moro in his prison, expressing appreciation of an amnesty law passed in Italy on Oct. 26.

Investigators refused to discuss the contents of the letter — the first written by Moro in custody — but police sources said Sunday they believed it contained a "very serious ultimatum" concerning the 61-year-old presidential hopeful's life.

Viet Reds Close Markets

BANGKOK, Thailand (UPI) — Vietnam's Communist rulers shut down Saigon's private markets in a two-day military raid in their toughest economic move since seizing South Vietnam, travelers arriving in Bangkok report.

"Everyone without exception" will be forced to work in the fields, the government said in a statement. "The markets will be closed for two days, from Sunday to Monday, to allow the government to take control of the situation."

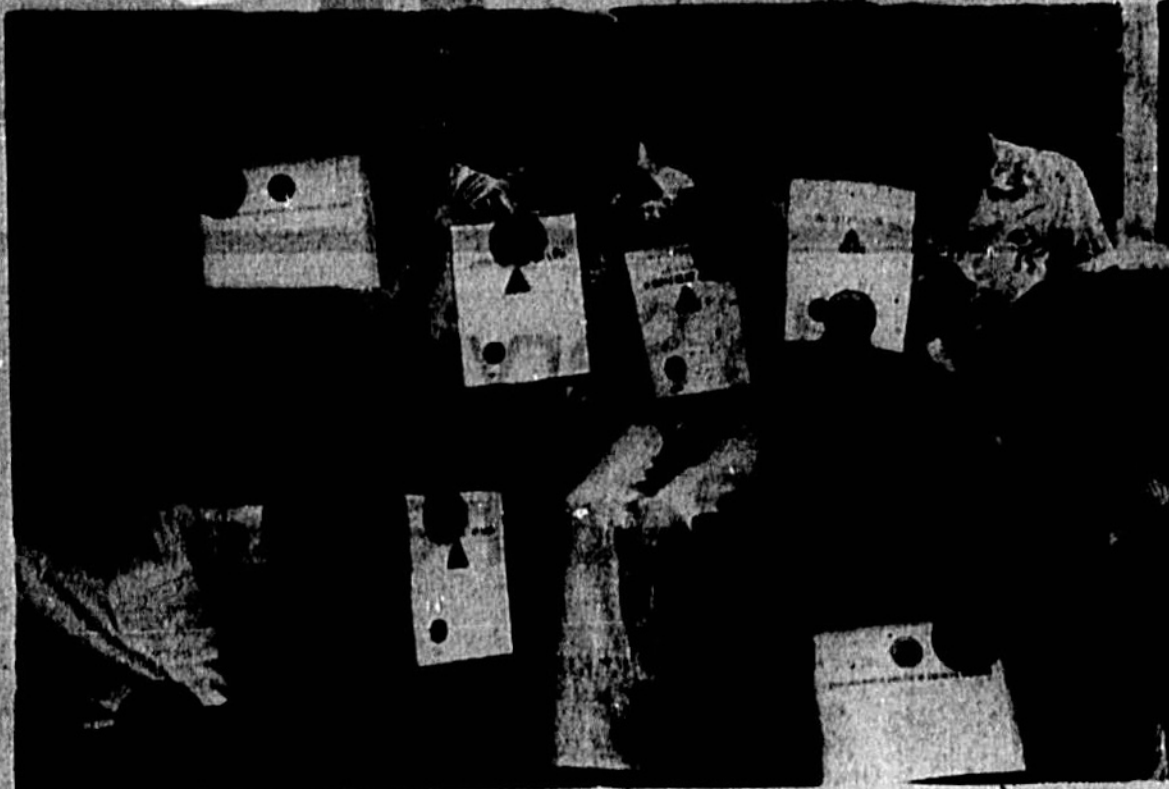

**It's Time
To Dive In**

If the United States had not been able to take advantage of its dependency on imported oil, the energy crisis would have been easier to deal with.

It's not premature to consider our dependency on other imported resources and our potential (though it may seem to be) to be dependent on the acquisition of natural resources, either through extraction of natural deposits, embargoes or attempts to manipulate the world market and price.

Four of these are metals. The United States produces no manganese, an essential ingredient in making steel; most of it comes from Africa and Latin America.

We produce no cobalt, necessary for electromagnetic devices and electronic systems; most of this comes from a single African country. Rare earth elements are also vital to making electronic devices and other products.

We also rely on imports of another important metal, copper.

But there is to reason the United States or any other country should be fearful of shortages of these critical metals.

All four are found in state-owned deposits on the deep ocean floor—deposits believed to exceed the entire known reserves of dry land.

American companies have developed the technology to "mine" the nodules with virtually no impact on marine life, and are poised to make the initial investments—between two million and five million—for commercial production.

That's the background of the most controversial item on the agenda of the Law of the Sea Conference that resumed recently in Geneva. Deciding who shall control the development of ocean-floor resources has bedeviled the delegates for nearly 10 years.

Although the United States and other industrial nations have advanced the case for allowing others to share in the benefits, some nations are bent on the minerals. The Third World countries feel the actual production is to be under international control.

It's no secret that Third World countries are exporting these minerals as virtual slave competition from deep-sea producers.

It may take more continuous and more years to resolve these issues, but we need to mark time in bringing deep-sea mining to reality.

Congress has before it a bill that would clear the way for U.S. companies to pick areas for mining, recognize their exclusive rights in the area, and provide insurance against their rights being superseded under some future treaty.

Only with such legislation on the books will entrepreneurs be willing to invest in the mining operation.

Congress should pass the deep-sea mining bill. It is essential to bringing similar legislation in other countries with sea-mining technology, leading to agreements among these countries to recognize and respect their separate claims to mining rights.

Most important, it will demonstrate to international Third World countries that the era of seabed mining is ready to begin and they have more to lose by rejecting offers for participating in the benefits.

Finally, our national interest demands that we look to the sea for the resources it can provide. We are a landlocked nation in terms of manganese and cobalt, and nearly so in terms of nickel.

We face an "energy" crisis in the surety of these mineral shortages. Profiting from them will mean few other ways that we have left.

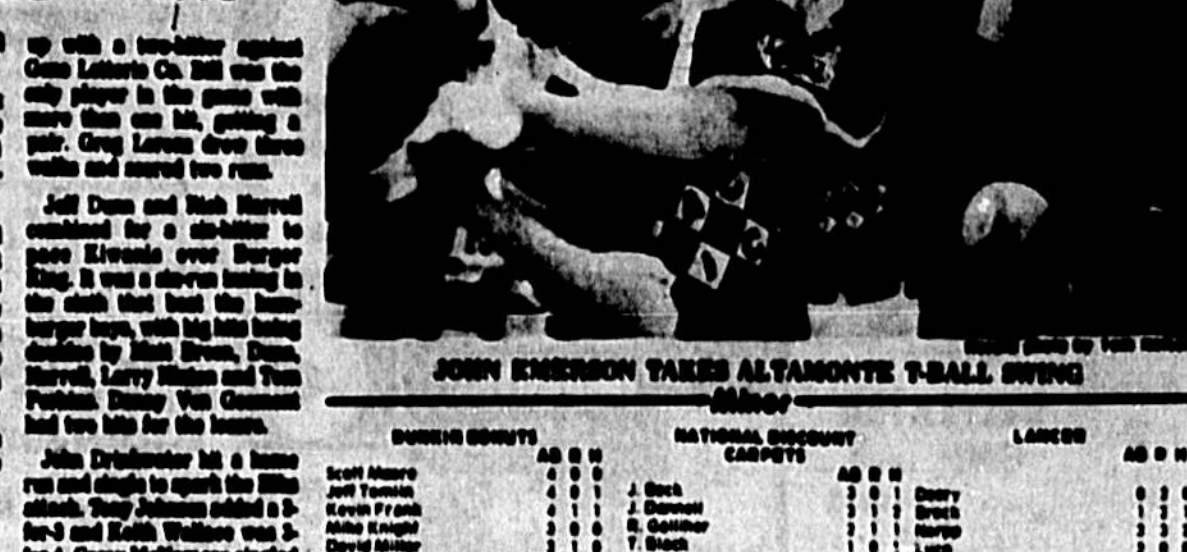

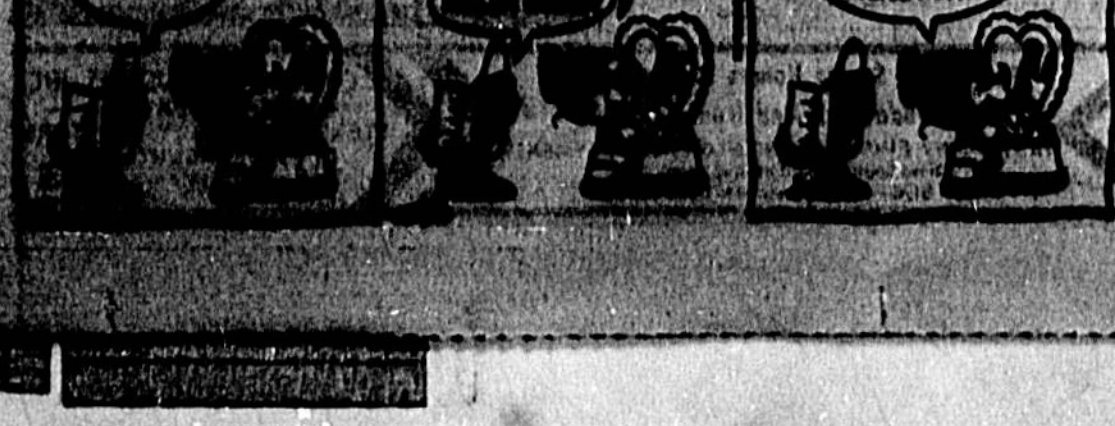

Could you tell me, Dr. Lamb, if nitroglycerin could cause this lack of energy? Just what does nitroglycerin do for angina? Is it a vasodilator? (I believe it is) and if so, how does it work? I am interested in the use of nitroglycerin for the rest of my life? I am in my late 50s. And will the medication cause any other side effects? I have been on it for a long time and I feel it is a help to me. These measures may significantly decrease your need for medication.

If these measures do not help sufficiently and you still have to take nitroglycerin, you may wish to consider a coronary bypass operation. Coronary artery bypass grafting is a surgical procedure in which a blood vessel from another part of the body is grafted onto the blocked coronary artery to bypass the blockage. This procedure may improve the blood flow to the heart muscle and relieve the chest pain. It is a very good procedure when given in the right amount to the right patient.

You, it has side effects as do almost all heart medications, and it can cause fatigue. The problem is that poor circulation, which you are undoubtedly having, also causes fatigue, so that a lack of medical attention and even a lack of heart pain if you are not treated can lead to the same of your fatigue. You could simply be depressed by the fatigue itself, and you would have to continue to take nitroglycerin or some new medicine to control or prevent angina pain.
