



At the time he took office the State was head over heels in debt in spite of the fact that it could not legally borrow money, and expenditures were averaging a milhon dollars a year more than all revenues from taxation. Carlton reduced operating costs by a million dollars a year and cut the State millage to 4 and 7-8, the lowest in over 30 years.

He also sponsored the constitutional amendment which resulted in the State inheritance tax. Although Carlton's administration itself got no revenue from this law, the deaths of such prominent millionaires as Alfred I. duPont resulted in the mayment of some \$4,000,000 to the State during the Sholtz administration. So, many competent observers feel that Cariton not only deserves credit for saving the State during the depths of the depression, but for laying the groundwork for the accomplishments of more recent years.
