AMA Plans No Action Or **Medicare Plan**

NEW YORK (UPI) - The 206,055-doctor American Med-ical Association (AMA) ap-peared headed today toward an official no-action policy on medicare until that controver-

sial measure becomes law. Impassioned debate on the part of AMA members who advocate boycott of medicare after it is passed by Congress was expected in today's final session of the AMA's 114th annual convention. But the 234-member House of Delegates, which governs policy for the AMA, was expected to follow the recommendation of its reference committee on legislation and public relations. After consid-

ering nine resolutions advocating non-participation by doctors in medicare, it rejected that boycott action. It offered a substitute rece lution saying American physicians pledge themselves to continue activity to secure or restore the freedom, high quality, and availability of medical care that has been an American tradition and re-

solving:
"That when the fate of the pending medicare legislation is determined, this House (of Delegates) will review, in spe-

A small but gallant band o 50 workers fought through the morning hours to restrain the flood's destructive path, but one commented: "We're takng more water than we can

Flood waters seeped into the west and south ends of the community of 2,500 as volunteers fought frantically te stave off the onslaught. "It's not that we weren't ready," a tired worker said. "We've anticipated this for two days, but it's just too much

The diminishing frontal wave of the river, bloated with debris and muck by its week-long journey from Colorado, begged down at a bridge just west of Ellinwood Wednesday night when six large trees became

entangled in the structure.

The bridge buckled. A slap-ping wake of water eracked a dike near the bridge and the rush was on. The water moved swiftly through the main channel, un-dated the surrounding low-lands and then started to back in the south end of the town despite the workers' offerts.

More than 100 of the town's people left the south part of the community Wednesday and the civil defense established flood centers. Slooping quarters for the refugees were set up in the high school,







Health Warnings

In view of the likelihood that health warning labels will eventually be required on cigarette packages, it gives one pause to be told that scaring people is not necessarily the best way to get them to do, or not to do, something for their own good.

This conclusion about human behavior comes from a psychologist with the University of North Carolina School of Public Health and is based primarily on a study of an oral polio vaccination campaign in Florida.

There it was found, reports Dr. C. David Jenkins, that the fear of a disease or the risk of getting a disease doesn't seem to encourage people to seek a way of preventing it or reducing the risk.

Excessive scare campaigns may, in fact, have just the opposite re-

actually driven some women away from screening clinics.

Apparently the need is to create a moderate degree of concern in people—something more than apathy but less than fear. Yet some of the people in Florida took the vaccine because "it was the thing to do. It was socially fashionable. It was a way to become a part

of the community."

The psychologist credits newspapers with doing a better job of conveying health information to the public than any other communications medium. Unfortunately: "Teaching facts doesn't always motivate people's behavior," he says. "There are more emotional factors involved in behav-ior than a string of facts."






