I have been working continuously all over this property for nearly nine months, and have gone just about as far with my plans as is possible until the City gives nearly nine months. at least the curbs and grades to which I must conform in laying the side walks, planting along the drive ways and shaping up the parks, big and little, which w feature this superb development.
