Telephone Union Leaders Attempt To Scuttle

Collective Bargaining

Collective bargaining between Southern Bell and the CWA-CIO began on Monday, February 6. On Tuesday morning, after a total of only 41/2 hours of discussion, and before the union had made definite proposals-before either side had stated its case—union leaders suddenly produced memeographed statements proposing arbitration.

> **How Arbitration Would Vitally Affect Your Interest**

Arbitration of the telephone wage matter could be a poor bargain indeed for the telephone users and we are opposed to it. Telephons wages are already good. The wages and working conditions of telephone employees compare very favorably with those in other industries.

Employees of Southern Bell get more than good wages, They get six holidays a year with pay. Paid vacations up to three weeks. They get sickness benefits up to a year, they get accident benefits and death benefits up to a year, plus a service pension with a minimum of \$100 a month, including Social Security. For all of this the employee pays nothingthe company pays all.

Telephone, wage rates have more than kept pace with in-

creases in the cost of living. A telephone operator at the top rate in Sanford now gets average pay of \$47.95 a week /\$208.58 a month/ including differentials and over time.

In Florida plant craftsmen, such as central office repairmen, at the top rate for cities like Sanford now average \$82.82 a week, (\$360.27 a month) in total pay.

Any increase in telephone wages would mean increases in cost to telephone customers who pay the bill for wages as well as for all other telephone costs. With Telephone Company earnings under Government regulated rates already at a low point, there is no other way wage increases can be

That is why we think it would be wrong to turn over a dedision that could affect more than three million telephone users in the area served by Southern Bell to someone who does not have long-range responsibilities for either the cost or quality of telephone service or for telephone rates. We believe that the proposed arbitration is dangerous to the public interest.

It would be unfair to give Telephone people-who get good wages now-an increase that would put them out in front of other workers, when the telephone customer would have to pay the bill.

Southern Bell believes that genuine collective bargaining should be given a fair chance. The company has a contract with the union, and, quoting the contract itself, "UNDER NO CIRCUMSTANCES MAY IT BE TERMINATED EARLIER THAN JUNE 5, 1950". In good faith the company will honor that contract. It expects the union to do likewise.
