





Day Care Supporters Seek Override Votes

WASHINGTON (AP) - Congressional backers of a \$125-million child day-care bill are trying to round up the two-thirds majority vote they need to override President Ford's veto in a showdown expected be close.

The House was to vote today on the bill that Ford vetoed April 6. In all, Ford has vetoed 48 bills and has been overriden eight times. "We're still in the head-counting process, but it is too

close to call," a source close to Democratic leaders said Monday. A key Republican, seeking to sustain the veto, agreed - "It will be close." The bill would suspend until July 1 a requirement that

child day-care centers, in order to qualify for federal funds, must meet federal standards for the number of staff persons required to be on hand for children aged six weeks to six years old. A previous suspension enacted last October expired Feb. 1.

States May Lose Funds

WASHINGTON (AP) - Forty-five states face the loss of \$123.4 million in federal matching funds this fall because they have failed to meet a goal for reducing errors in the nation's major family welfare program, the Department of Health, Education and Welfare says. HEW says its four-year campaign to weed out ineligible

and overpaid recipients from welfare rolls has saved tederal and state taxpayers an estimated some million. But HEW officials told Longress on Monday that only five states met the federal goal of reducing errors in the Aid to Families with Dependent Children (AFDC) program by the end of last year. The other 45 states and the District of Columbia failed to reach the goal and are scheduled to lose \$123.4 million in federal matching funds.

WASHINGTON (AP) - The future retirement millions of municipal employes is a "fiscal time bomb" for many American cities that do not know or fail to dislose the amount of money they eventually will have to pay for pensions, a study of city accounting methods says. The study of 43 of the nation's largest cities said "mil-

lions of taxpayers are being kept in the dark because some cities just don't know, or don't disclose, their unfunded pension obligations." A preliminary portion of the study, conducted by Earl Keller of the University of Michigan and Robert Cockrill

Panama Canal Vital To U.S.

It is one of the commonplaces of politics that candidates protest too much. Now that GOP challenger Ronald Reagan has made an issue, vociferously so, of the Ford administration's plan to negotiate away the Panama Canal, the President seriousness of the issue gets lost in a sea.of invective. Reagan, quoth Ford, is "irresponsible."

Reagan has insisted the Canal Zone is every bit as much U.S. sovereign territory "as Alaska." Hardly that. Incontestably Panamanian dictator Omar Torrijos holds more sway over the State Department than does Mike Gravel, the bathetic senator from the 49th State. But that is as it should be if the State Department is to be a respecter of intelligence and adroitness, however pernicious.

Few in the Compaign '76 audience can seriously entertain statehood for the Canal Zone except those wags who see the bestowal of it as a way out of the imbroglio. Some historical recapitulation is in order. Everybody knows, including Gen. Torrijos, that Teddy Roosevelt sent the arsenal of shovels and earthmovers to the Isthmus in the first place, that project arranged by American taxpayers. It is furthermore useful to know that the United States and the Republic of Panama did on Nov. 18, 1903, sign a convention in Washington governing Canal particulars.


Article II of that convention reads, in part: "The Republic of Panama grants to the United States in perpetuity the use, occupation and control of a zone of land and land under water for the construction, maintenance, operation, sanitation and protection of said canal of the width of 10 miles extending to the distance of five miles on each side constructed. ... The Republic of Panama further grants to the United States in perpetuity the use, occupation, and control of any other lands and waters outside of the zone above described which may be necessary and convenient for the construction, maintenance, operation, sanitation and protection of the said canal or of any auxiliary canals or other works necessary. . . The Republic of Panama further grants in like manner to the United States in perpetuity all islands within the limits of the zone above described. . . . "


Note the phrase, "in perpetuity," which means, precisely, extending through eternity. That a political government might have the pomposity to extend anything through eternity, especially a commitment of unborn taxpayers, is not in the least unexpected. It is therefore immaterial. If control means ownership and vice versa - and in the philosophic sense it does - then the United States owns the Panama Canal forever.

The American government has the power to do with the canal whatever it wants - even give it away to a Latin dictator whose tinhornship is, or should be, obvious. What matters, as Ronald Reagan reminds us, is the prudence of the affair. For an administration notoriously deficient in a Latin American policy to predict that a Reagan success in safekeeping the Canal Zone will inflame revolutionary passions cannot be terribly con-

When President Ford says we can expect riots down there if Torrijos doesn't get his way, who but a booby or a network correspondent wouldn't take that as an invitation to the rioters to riot? Who can take seriously his charge that Ronald Reagan is being "irresponsible" about Panama? Latin America is unstable, Torrijos is unpredictable, his idol and patron Castro is saber-rattling, the sea lanes of the globe are jeopardized, and Gerald Ford wants to withdraw the only source of stability from the nexus between two continents, one of which, it is not irresponsible to remember, is ours.
